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





## TOTAL 2011 CAPITAL BUDGET \$337 Million



#### **COMPLETED PROJECTS - Close Outs**

- Completed Projects
  - 128 Projects being closed
- Council to approve:
  - Variances >15% and > \$50,000 (approx. 45 projects)
  - Reallocation of surpluses
    - Cover deficits in other projects
    - Reduce new funds required in 2011



## Open Projects

- Projects approved 2003 2010
- Unspent balance as of 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter (Sep 2010) is \$294 million (on a total budget \$864 million)
  - \$7.3 M from 2003 05
  - \$49.4 M from 2006 08
  - \$237.2 M from 2009 10
- \$123 million forecast to spend Sep Dec
- \$153 million in 2011
- Remainder of spend (\$18M) in 2012/2013 for some multi year projects








#### North Arm Trail Greenway Proposed Improvements






#### 45th Avenue Bikeway Proposed Improvements







### Traffic & Electrical Services 2010 Accomplishments/2011 Highlights



#### **2010 Accomplishments**

- Non-Destruct Pole Testing Inspected over 9000 poles
- Conduit Replacement Installed over 32,000 meters



#### System Enhancements/Quick Hits for 2011

- Develop bikeway maintenance standards
- Install signal countdown timers at new signals
- Install bike monitoring stations Downtown

- Pilot pedestrian monitoring stations Downtown

### Sewer Utility 2010 Accomplishments

- 12.4 km sewers separated
  - 0.84% of system to reduce CSOs
- Canada Infrastructure Projects
  - Trout Lake Sewer Separation to reduce sewage overflows to Burrard Inlet
  - Greening the English Bay Interceptor reduce overflows to English Bay
- Award and construction of Granville
   Island pumping station (\$4.2M) to guard
   against overflows to False Creek
- 900 Sewer/Water Connections:
  - fee supported and development related





### Sewer Utility 2011 Highlights

- CSO Reduction & Water Quality Initiatives:
  - Eliminate CSOs from Crowe St outfall (East False Creek)
  - Separate 13.2 km of sewers (0.90% of system)
  - Water quality improvement in False Creek East
  - Complete Federal Infrastructure Projects
    - Trout Lake Storm water & Greening EBI

### Sewer Utility 2011 Highlights

#### Lifecycle Management

- Complete Granville Island pumping station replacement (\$4M)
- Design and tender Boundary Road pumping station to guard against the risk of overflow to Still Creek

#### **Support Development**

 Permit and install ~1000 connections (fee supported)





## Water Utility 2010 Accomplishments

- Replacement of over 15km of distribution
   City and ISF funding.
- Increased use of trench-less technologies.
- Increased use of native backfill in boulevards resulted in 30% reduction of virgin backfill.
- Improved access to drinking water
  - 2 frost-free water fountains (Downtown & DTES)
  - 6 water bottle filling stations on City facilities
  - Invention of temporary water stations as part of City's extreme heat response



## Water Utility 2011 Highlights

- Design and construction of 8.2 km in distribution water mains - \$6.8M
  - Based on age, leak history, material, coordination with street paving and outside utilities. (Various locations)
- Construction of 2.8km of 600mm transmission mains along 11<sup>th</sup> Avenue - \$5M
  - Significant leak history
  - Lifecycle replacement (LRWP)
- Commissioning of 3 new Pressure Reducing Valve (PRV) stations.
  - Lifecycle replacement
  - Exploring energy recovery/electricity generation
- Green Construction Trial: 600m of ductile iron water main using directional drilling




### Landfill 2010 Accomplishments

#### 9 Phase Fill Plan:

- Phase 1 of 9 was filled to completion in 2008.
- Closure work for phase 1 was completed in 2010.

#### Minimize Environmental impact:

- Maximize landfill gas capture (current capture rate equivalent 80,000 automobiles)
- Minimize leachate generation from closed area

### Landfill 2011 Highlights

#### Land Fill Gas: Collection Efficiency Improvements \$1.1M

- Surface Water Diversion & Leachate Collection
  - Systematic and efficient diversion and collection of water and leachate reduces likelihood of flooded landfill gas collection infrastructure.
- Landfill Gas Collection Infrastructure Expansion
  - Installation of vertical wells in phase 2 of the landfill will assist in increasing system collection efficiency from 55% to 75%. The installation of the wells will be equivalent to eliminating 9,000 automobiles from the road per year
- Exploring Kitchen Waste Composting & Possible Waste to Energy Opportunities
- Conversion of Fleet to Liquid Natural Gas
