Hello,

My name is Ashlee Tibbets - resident of River District for 2 years. I love the area and I am very excited by the coming development.

I am concerned, however, about the development of the Riverfront Park greenspace into a childcare facility. I am in no way against childcare facilities; I think it's great that we're taking care of local kids. However, I believe reducing the amount of greenspace in the area is a mistake. Continued residential development has drawn and will continue to draw people to the area, many of whom have children. **The Riverfront Park is a vital part of why I believe these people are drawn to the area. River District is proudly different than other areas of Vancouver, and the Riverfront Park highlights that.**

Last month I participated in the *Run for H2O* 10k that utilized the Riverfront Park as the start and end point of the race. Zumba warm-up classes were held there as well as multiple sponsor booths and water stations. I've participated in club soccer and rugby on the field. I spend many summer weekends in the field enjoying the area, especially after visiting the Farmer's Market. **I believe it would be a shame to lose the Riverfront Park to a development that could easily be positioned in another location in the area.**
