I am a resident of the Hastings-Sunrise neighbourhood and wish to comment in support of the rezoning application for 2805 East Hastings St.

I understand this application has been submitted under the City's Rental 100 policy. There is a huge need for new rental housing stock in the City, and I'm happy to see that this application would provide approximately 90 new units of market rental housing for the community. The increase in height to 6 storeys is appropriate in the neighbourhood context of East Hastings, and is also a fair trade off in order to provide new rental supply in the area.

The site in its current state – a Burger King drive-thru with a large adjacent parking lot – does not provide any benefit to the community and creates a hole in the retail experience on Hastings. Our area is slowly establishing itself as a major pedestrian oriented street.
