Purpose/Recommendations

- 1. Provide Council with an update on the 2015-16 Review of the City's Cultural Infrastructure Grant (CIG) Program
- 2. Seek Council's approval for a new grant category to aid with emergency situations and urgent life safety needs.
 - The "Critical Assistance Grant" will be available on a rolling intake, year round basis, for Vancouver-based cultural non-profits, registered charities, community service coops and First Nations Band Councils

Infrastructure Grant Investment 2009 - 2016



251 Applications Submitted



195 Projects Funded 100 Individual Organizations Funded



83 Planning Grants (43%) 112 Capital Grants (57%)



Smallest Grant \$1000 Largest Grant \$150,000



65% of projects funded for improvements to existing spaces



35% of projects funded towards planning and creation of new spaces



\$35.7 million Total Project Activity




\$7 million Total Grant Funds Awarded



NO CHANGE:

- Program Goals
 - Support a robust & diverse ecology of cultural spaces
 - o Enable cultural space planning, renovation, development & acquisition
 - Strengthen communities ability to develop and operate cultural space
- Program Categories
 - o Planning, Minor & Major Capital
- Evaluation Process
 - Blended community/staff assessment juries
- Assessment Criteria
 - Vision, Impact, addresses Key Gaps, Organizational Capacity, Project Mngt, Procurement, Project Budget, Fundraising Capacity, Funding Diversity, Partnerships, Stakeholder Engagement & Support, Environmental, Accessibility, Public Health & Safety
- Ineligible Items
 - Moveable equipment
- Grant Intake Cycle
 - o 1x per year
- Matching Funding Levels
 - o 50% with up to 25% as in-kind



Program Updates - For Council Information & Approval

NEW or CHANGING:

Requires Council Approval

New - Critical Assistance Grant

- For critical 'emergency-like' situations that cannot be anticipated and/or urgently required life safety upgrades
- o Max \$25,000 per grant, total annual budget \$100,000
- Criteria and budget pre-approved by Council, distribution at staff discretion according to specific criteria, subject to approval by the General Manager of Community Services

Increased Funding levels

 Minor Capital from \$35,000 to \$50,000 & Major Capital from \$150,000 to \$250,000

Reduced Quote Requirement

- o Projects up to \$10,000 one quote
- o Projects \$10,001 50,000 two quotes
- o Projects \$50,001 \$250,000 three quotes

Enhanced Payment Schedule

- o Grants up to \$50,000 payments in increments of 80%/20%
- o Grants \$50,001 \$250,000 payments in increments of 50%/30%/20

Critical Assistance Grant Category - Assessment Criteria

Requires Council Approval

ORGANIZATIONAL ELIGIBILITY

- Vancouver-based cultural non-profits, registered charities, community services coops and First Nations Band Councils
- Demonstrated financial stability, sound administration, capacity to undertake project
- Own space or have minimum 10-year lease

PROJECT ELIGIBILITY

- Unforeseen facility repairs, replacement or clean up resulting from
 - 1) loss/failure of existing infrastructure
 - 2) urgent life safety requirements
- Sufficiently urgent that project cannot wait for future funding; failure to remediate could lead to further system/structural failure or threaten life-safety

NOT ELIGIBLE

- Projects/items covered by insurance or other for which funding already provided for by CIG
- Regular or scheduled maintenance
- Programming, operation or admin expenses
- Movable equipment or legal costs
