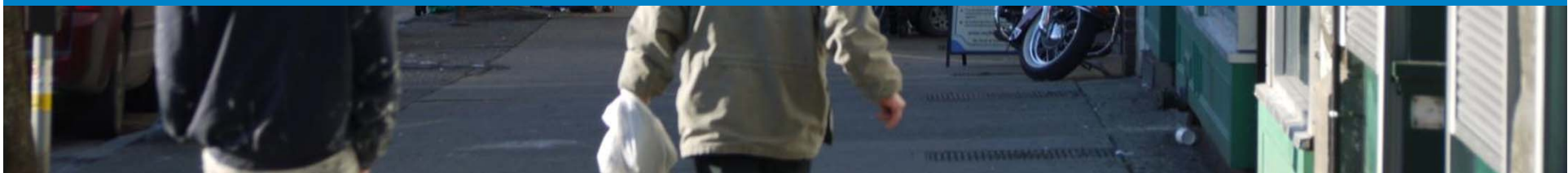

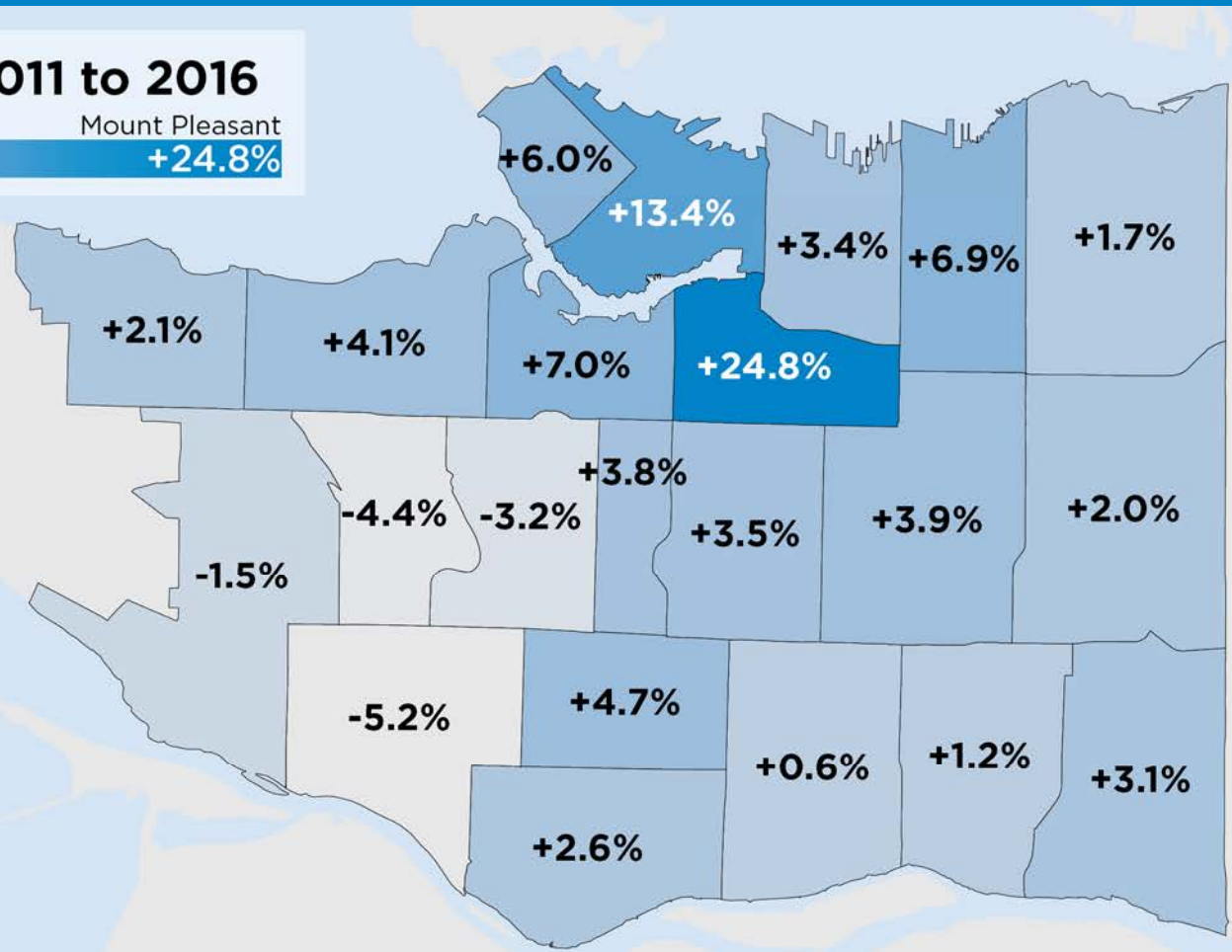

Population Change, 2011 to 2016

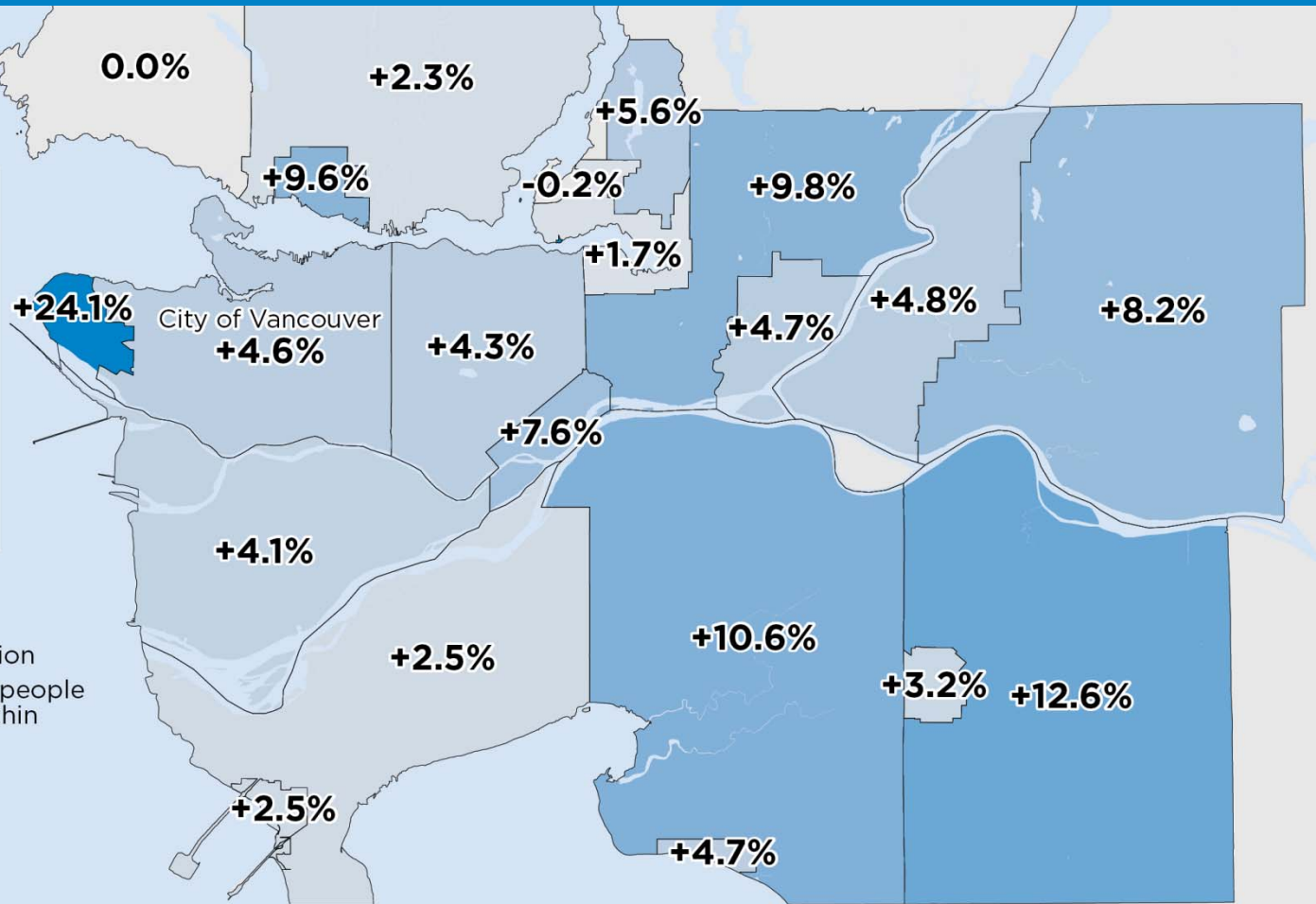
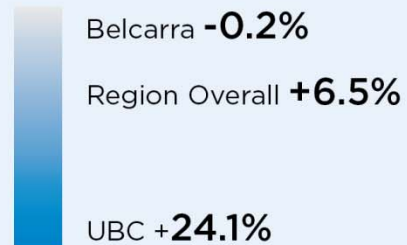

Population Change, 2011 to 2016

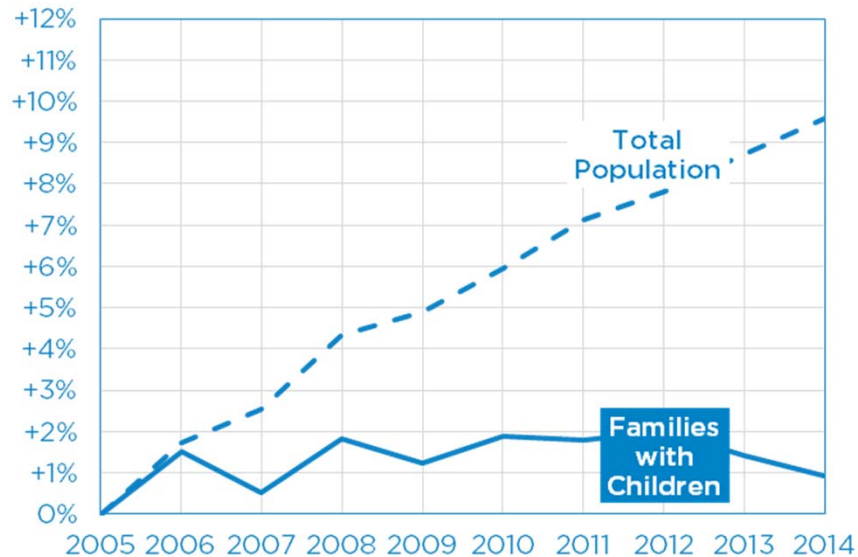

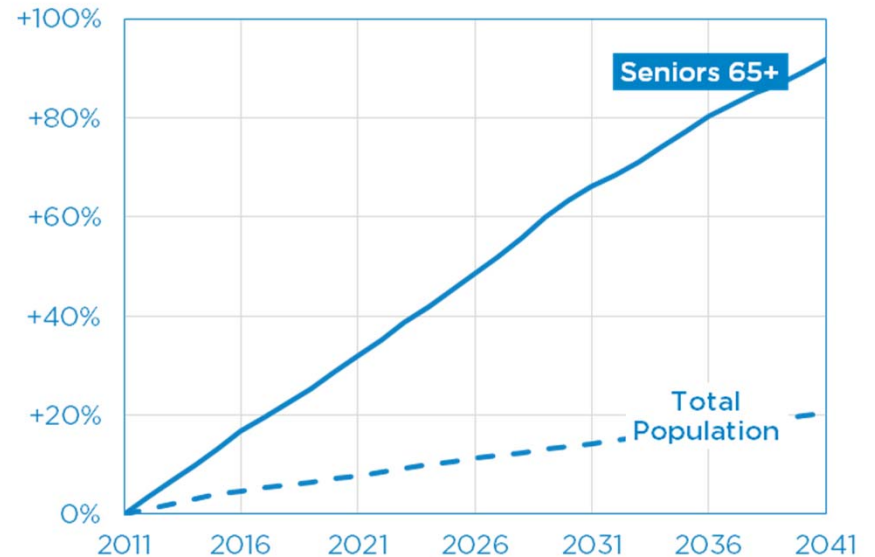
Cumulative Rate of Change, 2005-2014

Cumulative Rate of Change, 2011-2041

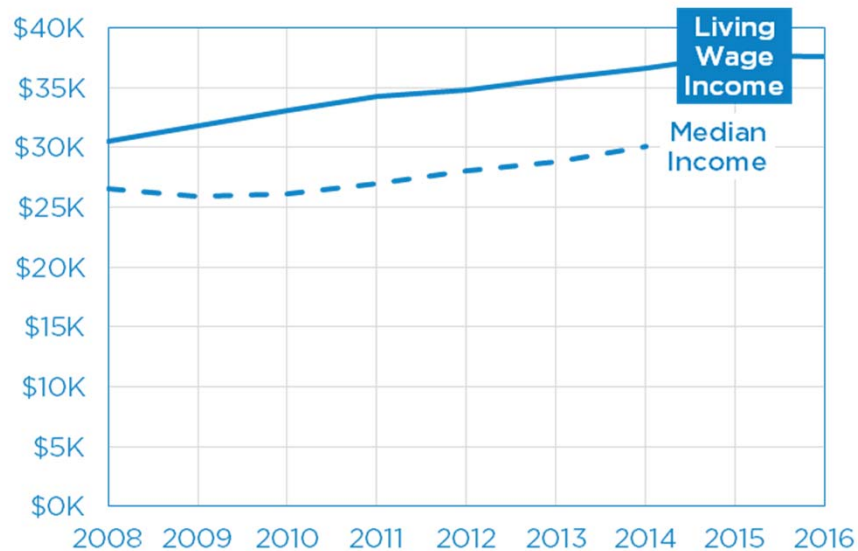

Costs and Income 2008-16

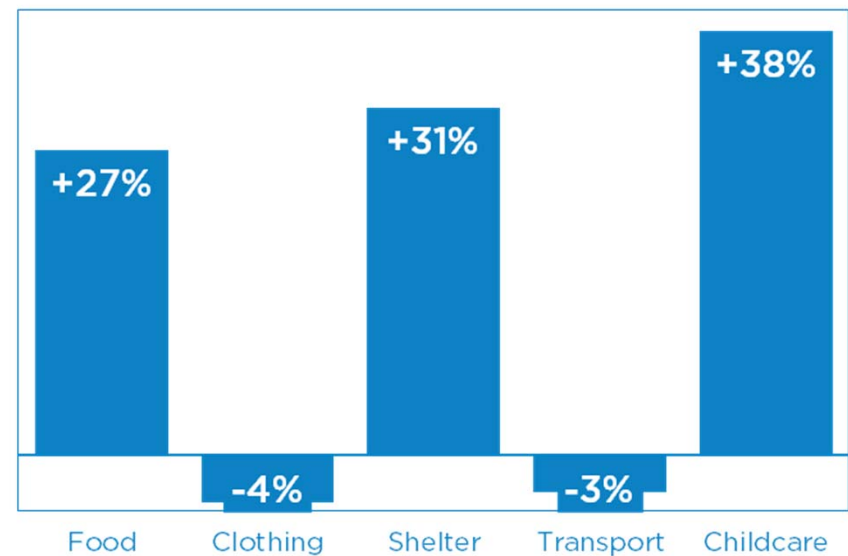
Comparison of Metro Vancouver Living Wage and City of Vancouver Median Personal Income

Rate of Change in Cost of Selected Components of Metro Vancouver Living Wage Calculation

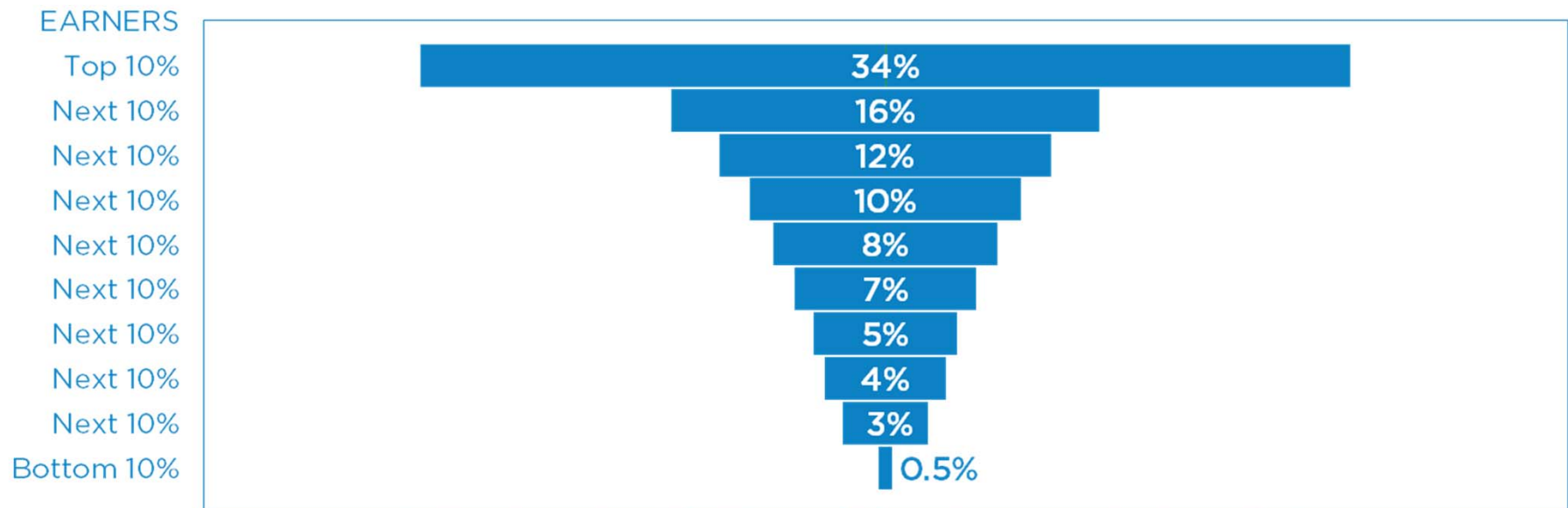

Share of After-Tax Adjusted Family Income

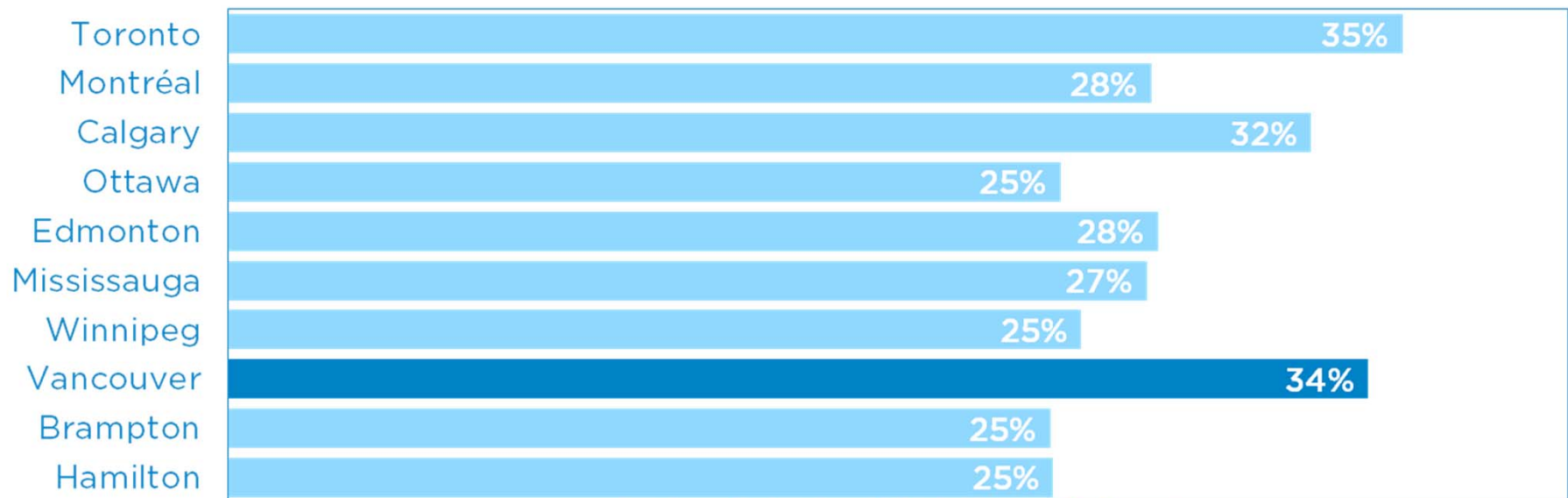

Share of Adjusted After-Tax Income Held by Top 10% of Earners

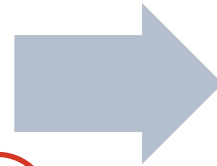

A Persistent Gap Between Rich and Poor Creates...

- Decreased connectivity between people and groups of people
- Erosion of trust in democratic institutions
- Negative economic and environmental impacts
- Poor health outcomes



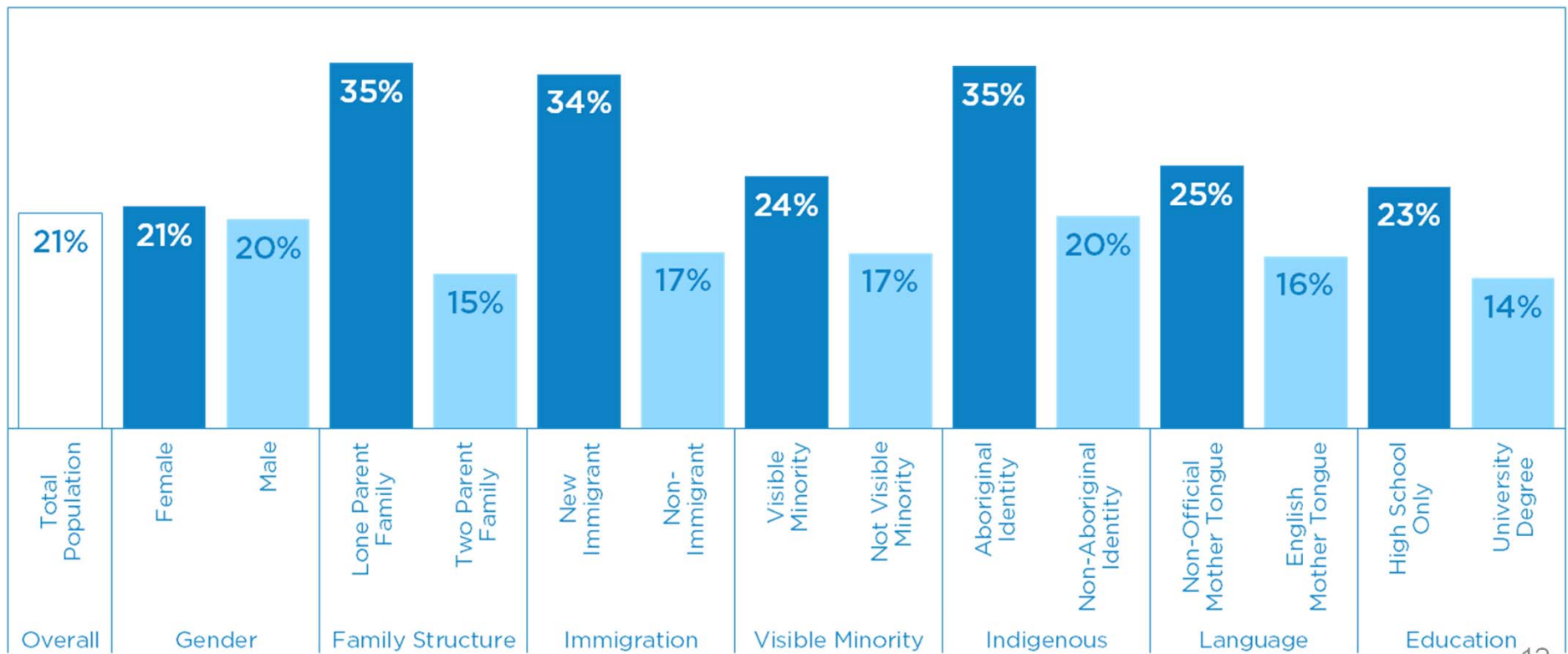
A More Equitable City Fosters...

Low Income Rate by Population Groups, 2011

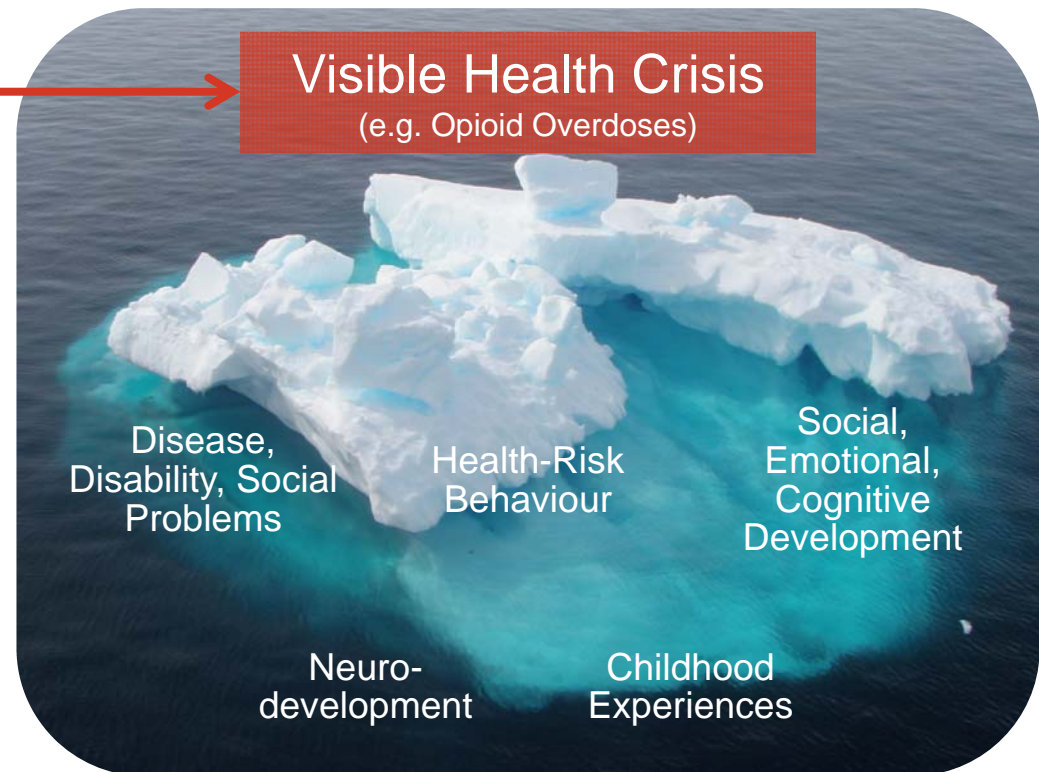
Percentage of Persons Below After-Tax Low Income Measure

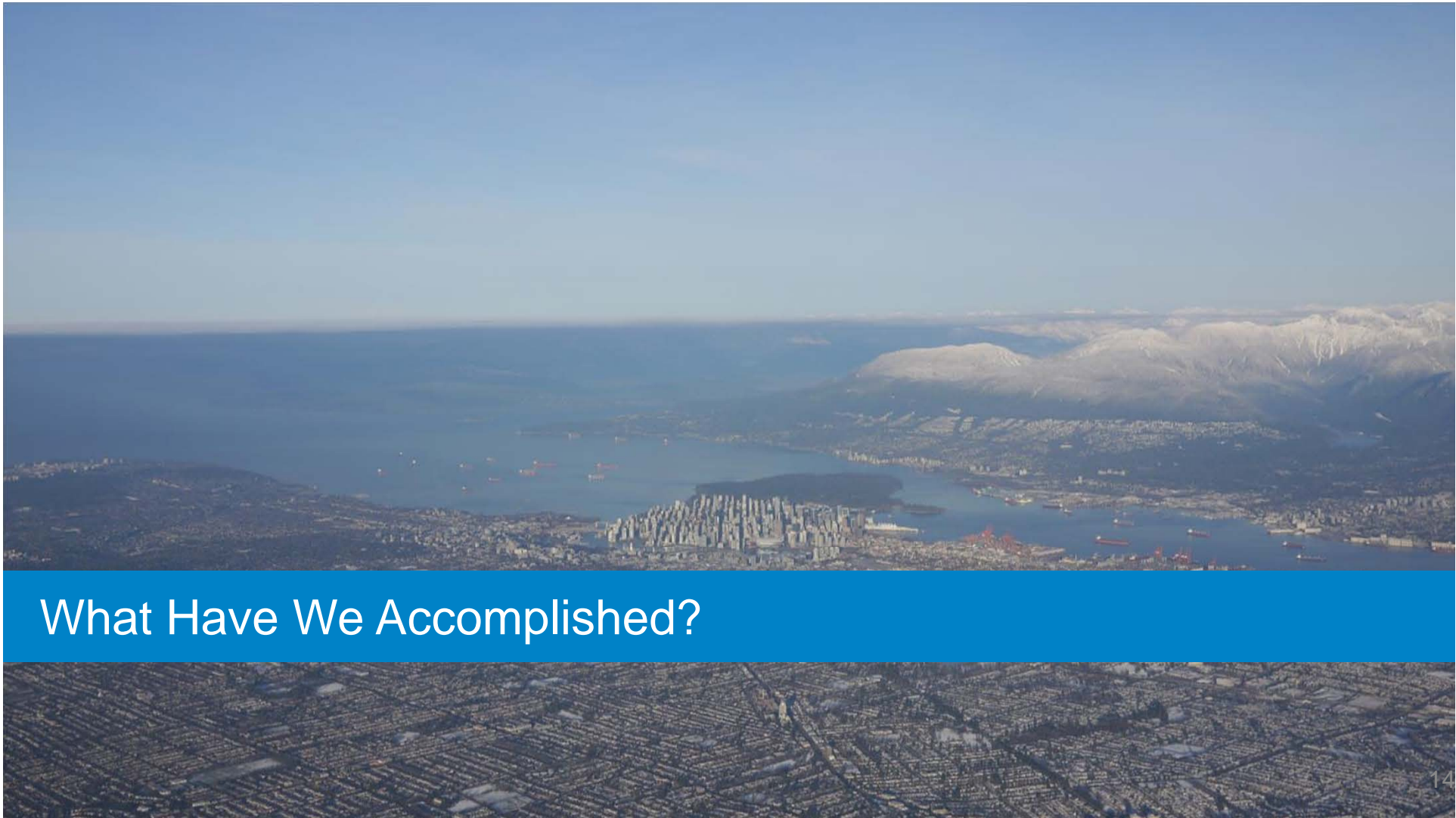

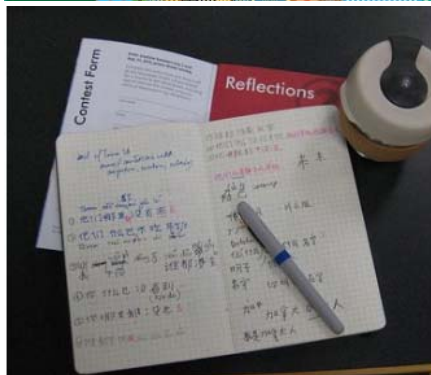

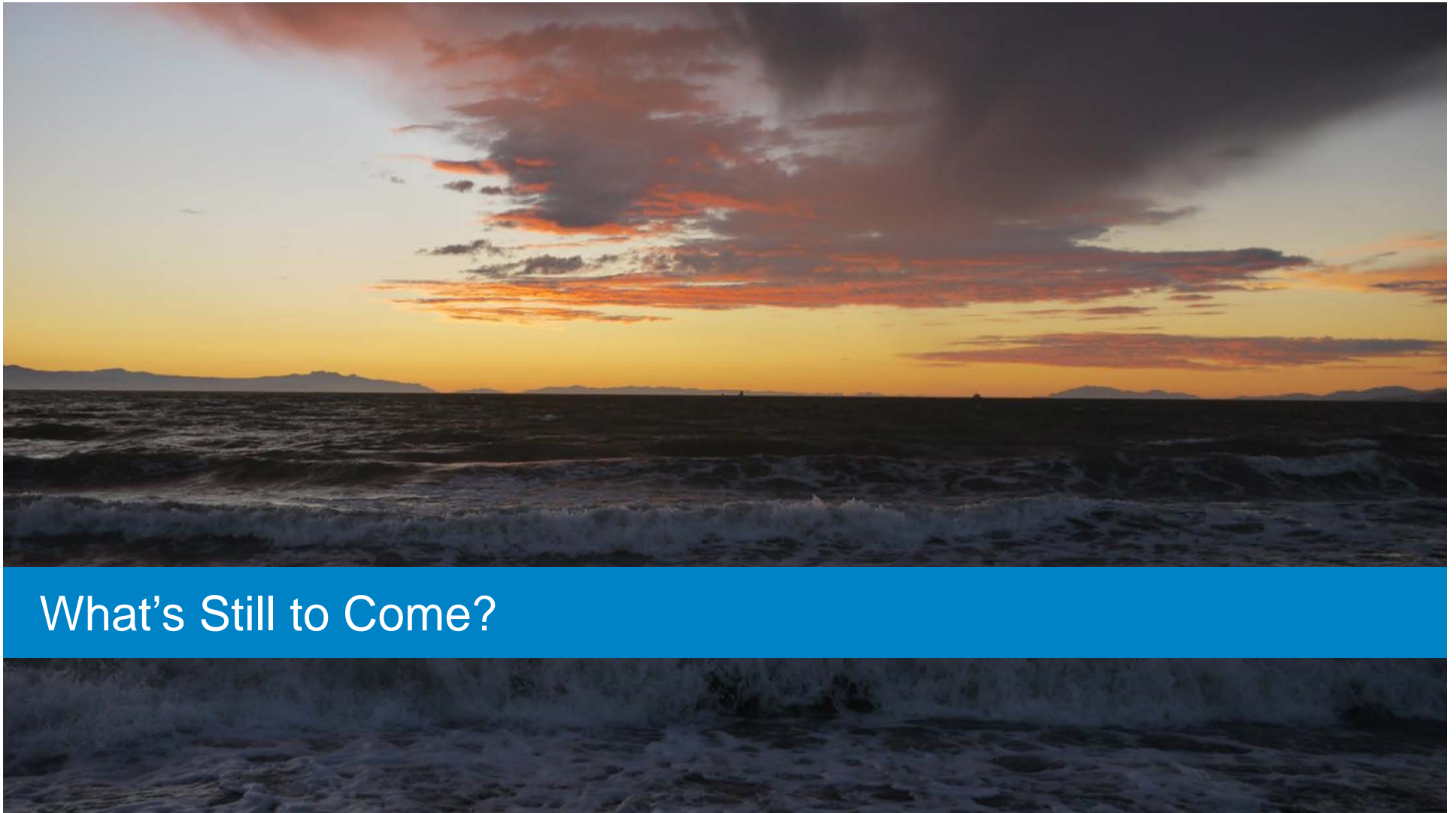
