1. Presentation - Sport Hosting Vancouver Progress Update

Michelle Collens, Manager, Vancouver Sport Hosting, provided a progress update on Sport Hosting Vancouver, and invited the following sport hosting community event partners to say a few words:

2. 2017 Property Taxation: Targeted Land Assessment Averaging February 28, 2017

Staff from Financial Planning and Analysis reviewed the report and, along with the City Manager, responded to questions.

MOVED by Councillor Jang
THAT the Committee recommend to Council

- A. THAT Council approve the application of targeted 3-year land assessment averaging for the purpose of calculating property taxes for Residential (Class 1), Light Industrial (Class 5), and Business & Other (Class 6) properties for 2017.
- B. THAT, in addition to the standard exclusions as outlined in the annual Land Assessment Averaging By-laws, Council adopt a "threshold" of 10% above the property class average change for Class 1 and for Classes 5 & 6 to define eligibility for targeted averaging;
 - FURTHER THAT the 2017 property class average change for Class 1 and for Classes 5 & 6 be finalized upon receipt of the 2017 Revised Assessment Roll in April.
- C. THAT Council instruct the Director of Legal Services, in consultation with the Director of Finance, to prepare a by-law authorizing the use of targeted 3-year land assessment averaging that reflects Council's decision on A and B above.
- D. THAT, subject to adoption of the by-law, Council instruct the Director of Finance to make appropriate arrangements with BC Assessment for the production of the 2017 Average Assessment Roll at an estimated cost of \$25,000 plus applicable taxes; source of funding to be the 2017 Operating Budget.

4. Contract Award for Central Library Levels 8 & 9 Construction February 17, 2017

THAT the Committee recommend to Council

- A. THAT Council authorize City staff to enter into a contract with Smith Bros. & Wilson (B.C.) Ltd., for the construction of Levels 8 and 9 of the Central Library, with an estimated contract value of \$12,748,621, plus GST to be funded through the approved multi-year Capital Budget of \$15 million for Central Library Levels 8 and 9 Expansion project, to be funded from:
 - (a) \$8,500,000 in cash Community Amenity Contributions (CAC) received from the following downtown rezonings:
 - (i) \$1,445,515 from the approved allocation from rezoning of 225 Smithe Street;
 - (ii) \$4,520,000 from the unallocated balance of cash CAC from the rezoning of 1151 West Georgia Street;
 - (iii) \$1,910,639 from the unallocated balance of cash CAC from the rezoning of 535 Smithe Street;
 - (iv) \$623,846 from the unallocated balance of cash CAC from the rezoning of 999 Seymour Street;
 - (b) \$6,000,000 contribution from the Vancouver Public Library Foundation, which includes a \$2,000,000 contribution from the Federal government (Canada Cultural Spaces Fund); and
 - (c) \$500,000 contribution from the Federal government (Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program).
- B. THAT the Director of Legal Services, Chief Purchasing Official and General Manager of Real Estate and Facilities Management be authorized to execute on behalf of the City the contract contemplated by A above.
- C. THAT no legal rights or obligations will be created by Council's adoption of A and B above unless and until such contract is executed by the authorized signatories of the City.

5. Approval of Business Improvement Area (BIA) Renewals - 2017 February 7, 2017

Staff from City-Wide and Regional Planning reviewed the report.
