Hi there, just want to express strong support for 2109 East Hastings rezoning at tonight's public hearing.

Some quick comments

- it's a shame that such a modest building requires a rezoning at all - these should be legal on every lot, in every neighborhood in the city, from Belmont to Boundary

- it's a shame that our land use policies requires the future residents of this building to endure the noise, pollution and danger from drivers on Hastings St. If it had been legal, I suspect the builder would have happily purchased single family homes a few blocks south and put the project there instead. But it's not legal, so here we are.

- I'm pleased to see that less parking was provided - bundled parking in rental or ownership buildings is a strong subsidy to driving at the expense of housing, and will make it challenging to meet our Transportation 2040 goals

- Given the level of crisis we are in with purpose built rental stock, this building could easily have been a few storey's higher for not much extra construction externalities. If we are to put up with construction noise and dust, better to get 8 or 10 storeys out of the deal than 6

- I saw the original pre-application design of this building and it was much more attractive, much more space and energy efficient, and had 2 more homes. It's my understanding that the changes from that to the current proposal, were driven by staff requests. It's deeply concerning that staff are urging builders to provide fewer homes rather than more.

With those comments in mind, I urge you to approve this rezoning. I look forward to working with this and future councils on comprehensive land reform to address the inequities created by our single family zoning over most of our city.
