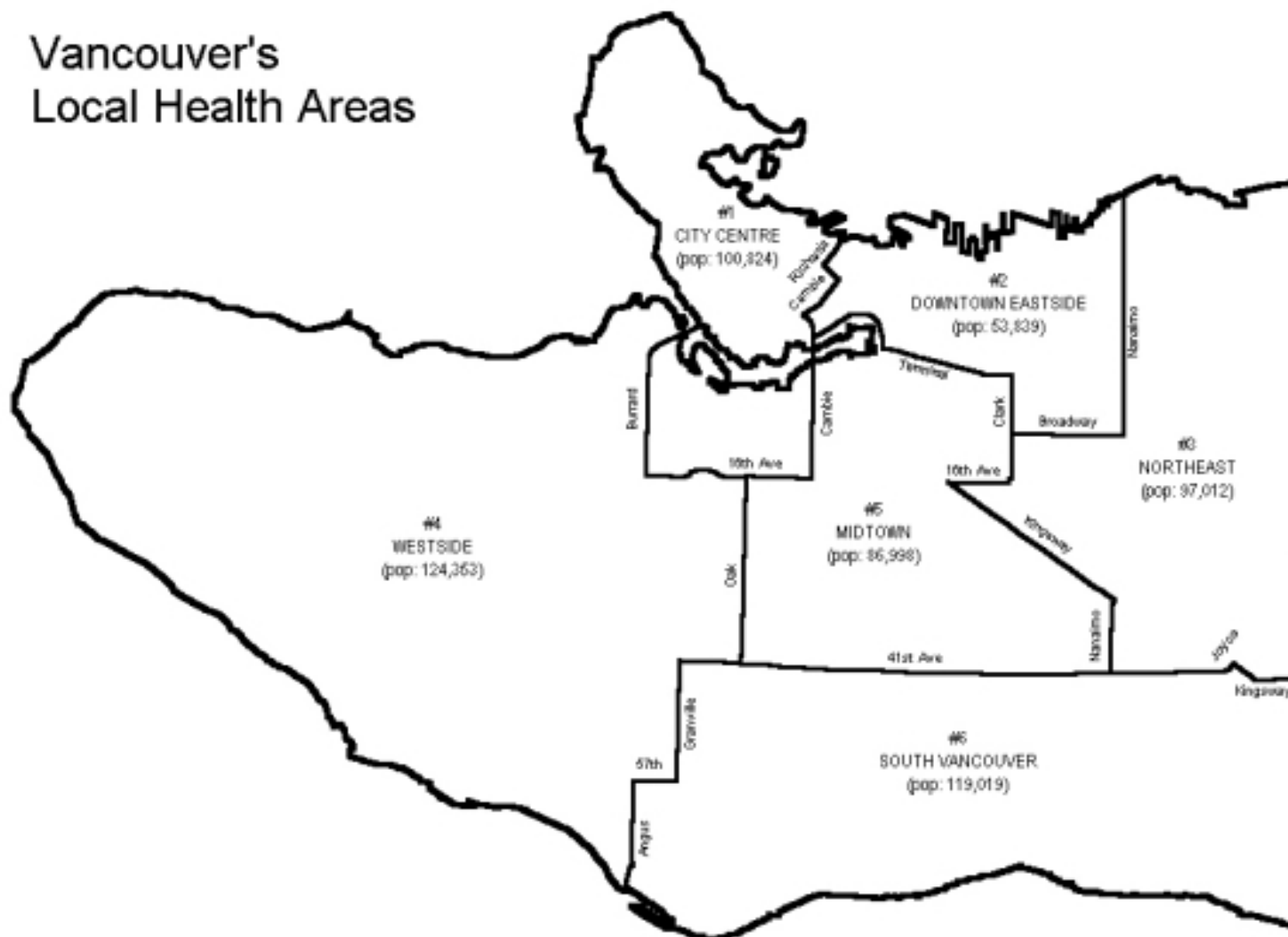

Vancouver's Local Health Areas



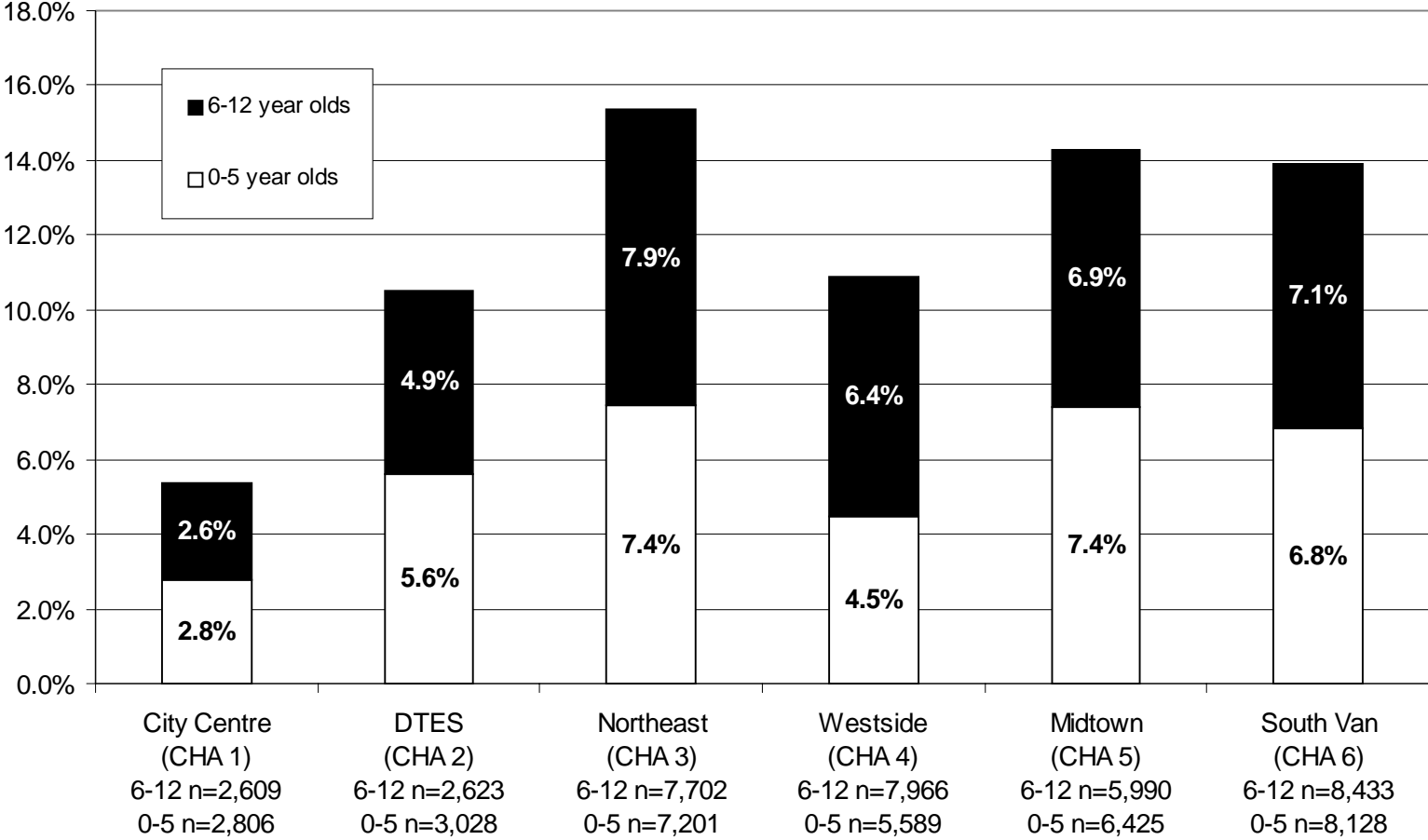
Note: Population numbers are 2001 data projections (source: Vancouver Richmond Health Board)

Readers should note the following:

1. Data is represented by Vancouver's six local health areas or networks.
2. Because the populations of the six local health areas vary greatly, percentage figures are more accurate indicators than absolute numbers.
3. Information sources vary such that different charts may indicate different data years; comparisons between such charts should be made with caution.
4. Low-income cut-offs (LICOs) are set at income levels where 54.7 % of gross income goes to the essentials of food, clothing and shelter.
5. Work force participants (see chart #9) could be either employed at the time of census taking, or unemployed and actively seeking/available for work, on lay-off with expectations of returning to work, or starting a new job within four weeks of census taking.
6. Students are not exclusively represented in any of the data reported in chart #9.
7. Average incomes are based on reported aggregate income from all sources.

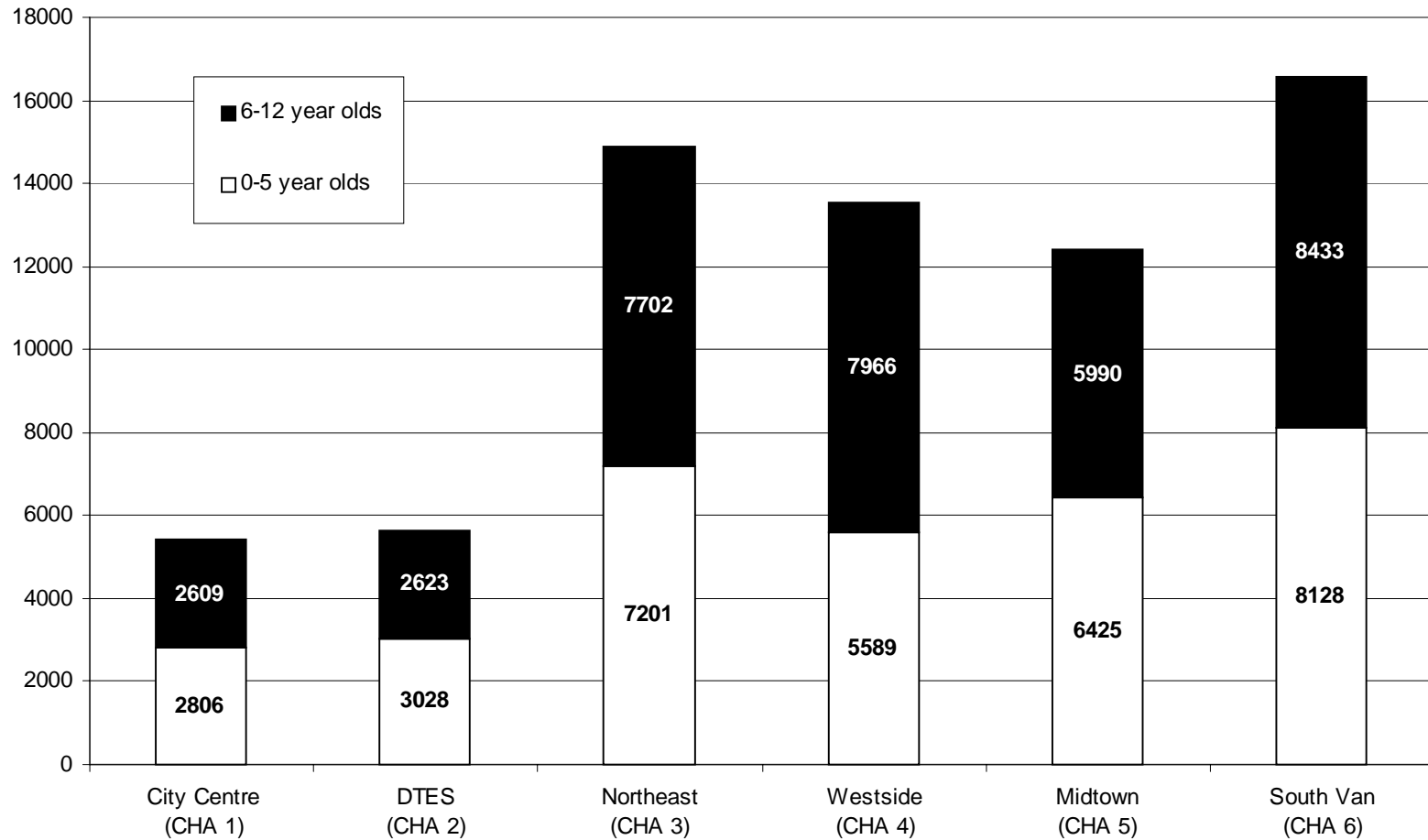
0-5 & 6-12 YR OLDS AS A PERCENTAGE OF NETWORK POPULATION

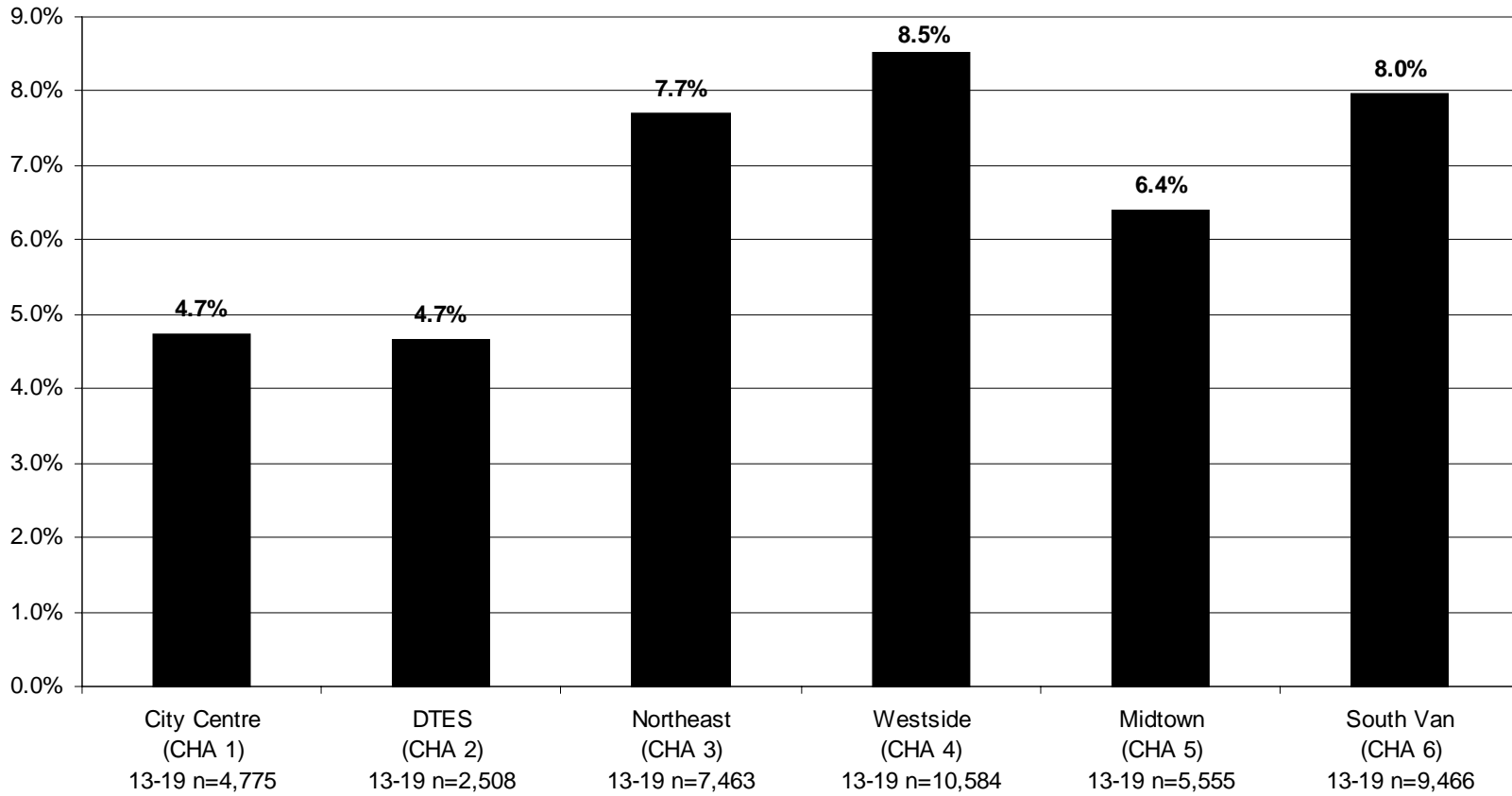
NUMBER OF 0-5 AND 6-12 YEAR OLDS BY NETWORK

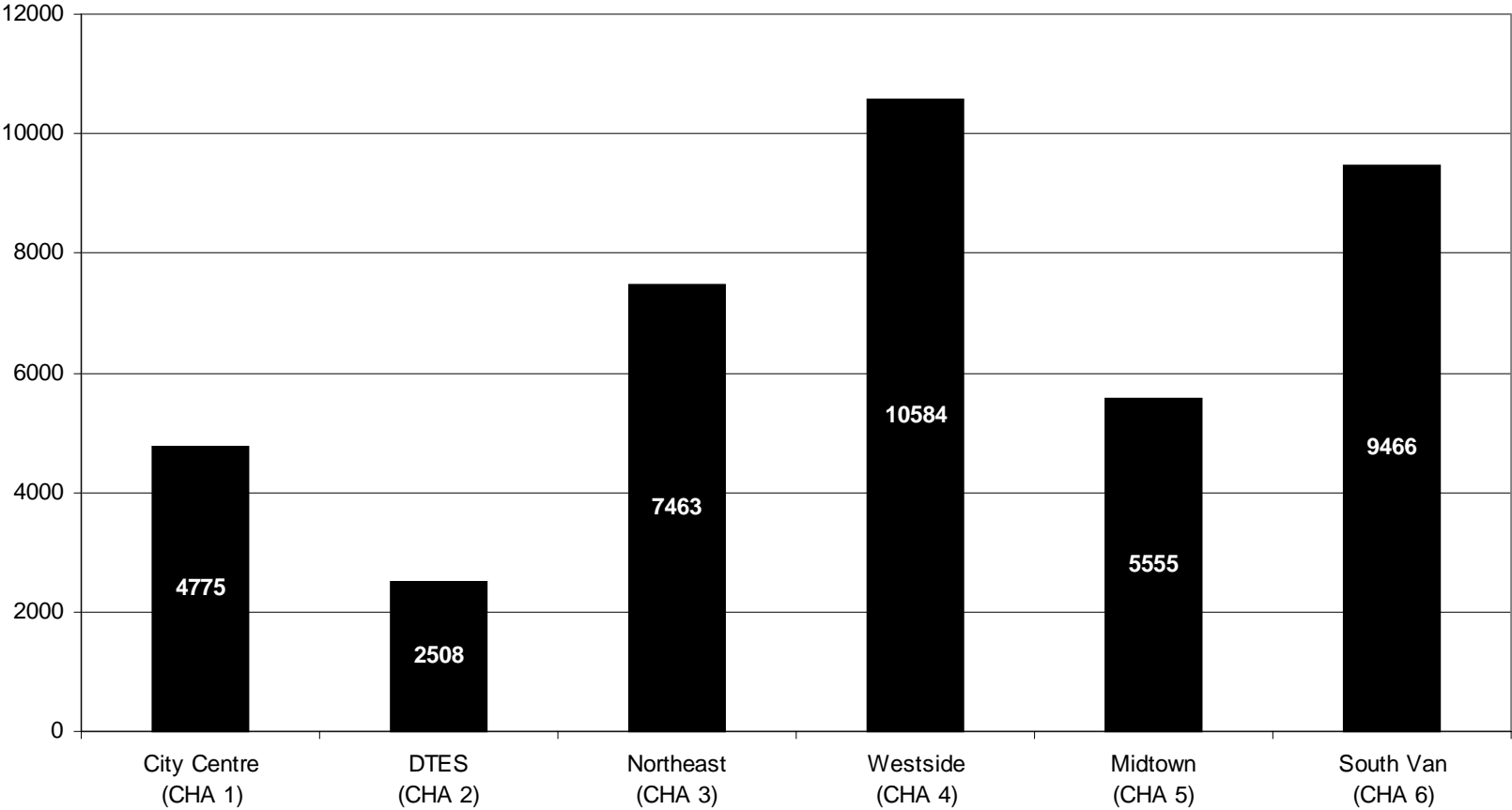
13-19 YEAR OLDS AS PERCENTAGE OF NETWORK POPULATION

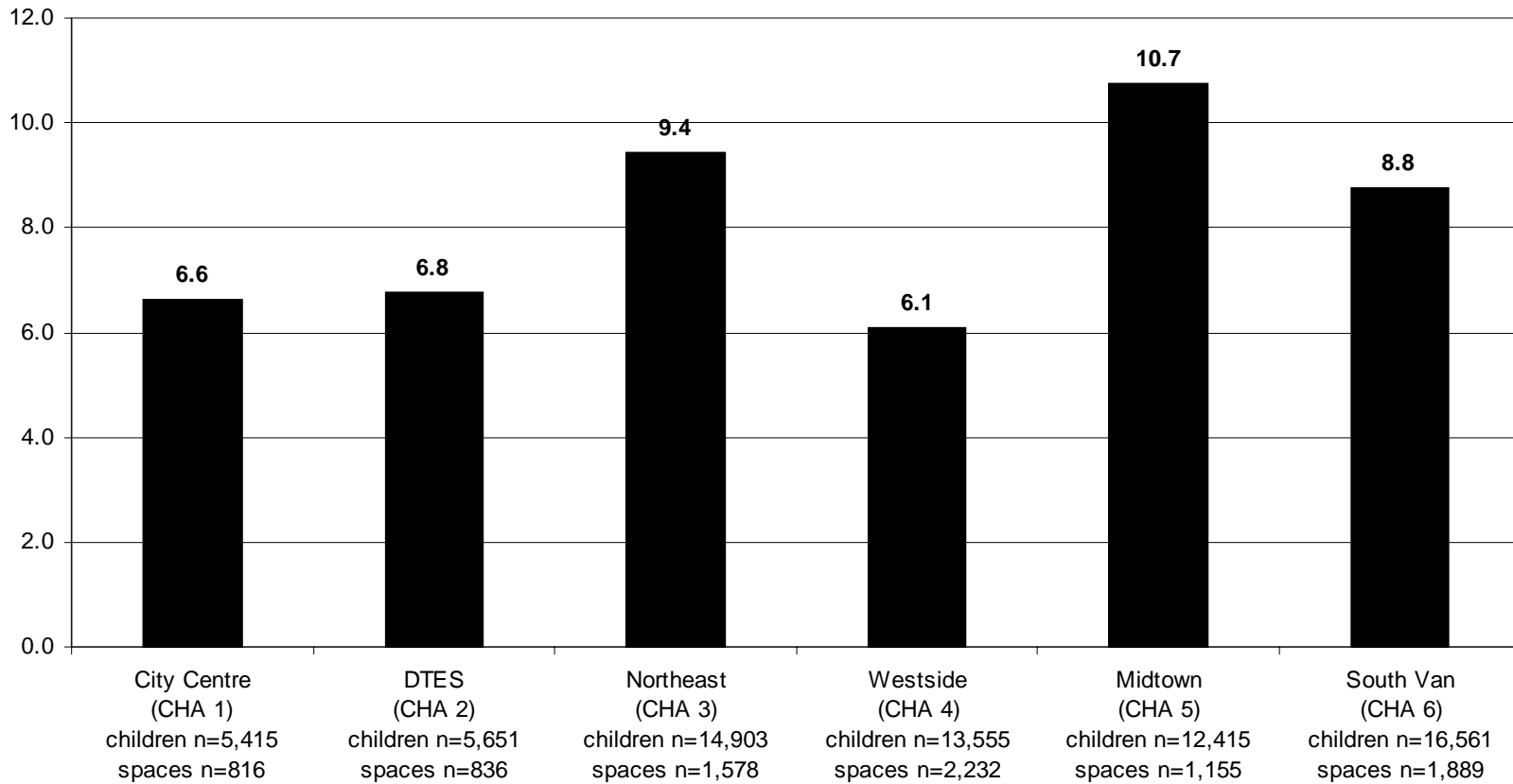
NUMBER OF 13-19 YEAR OLDS BY NETWORK

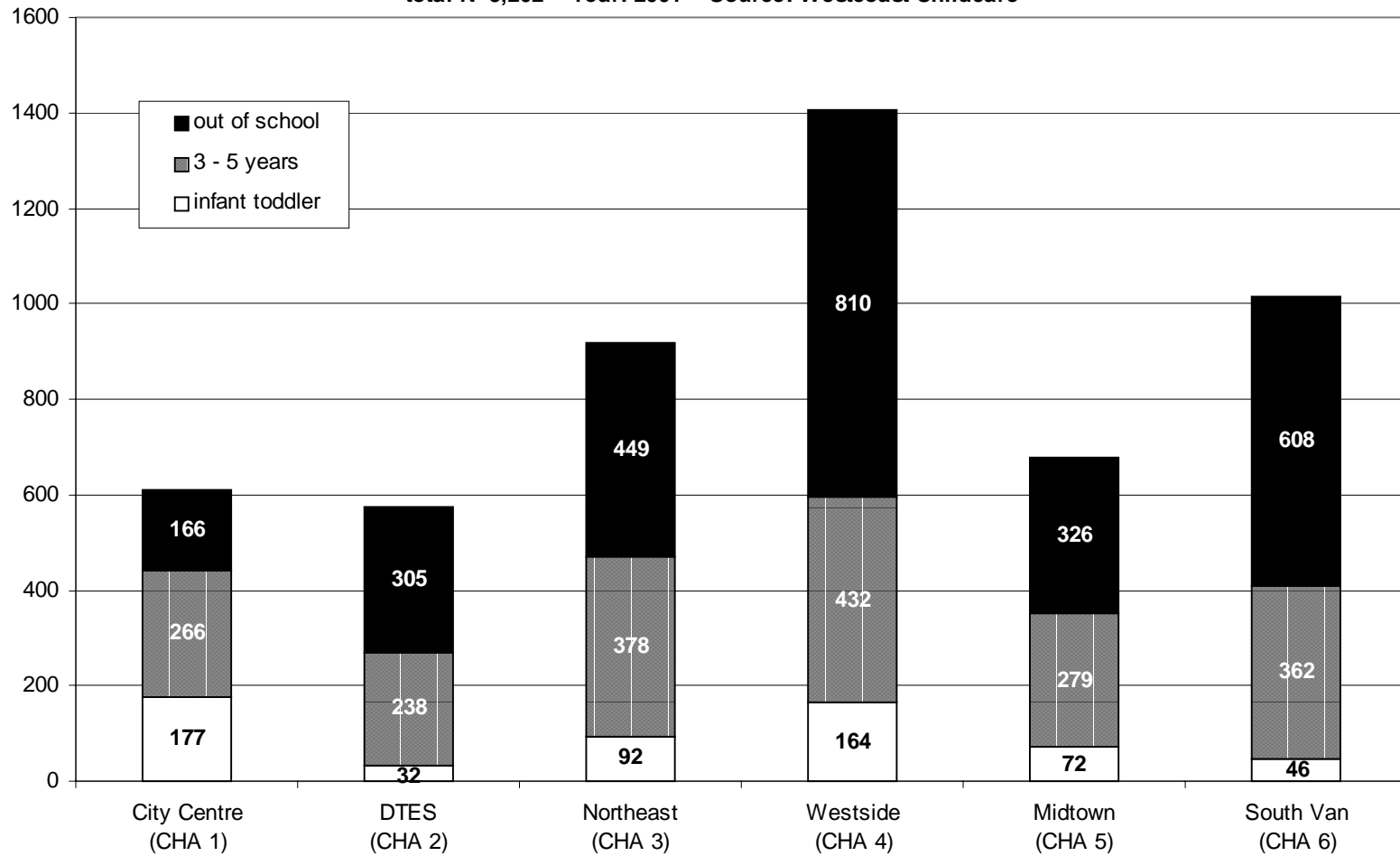
#CHILDREN 0-12 PER CHILDCARE SPACE BY NETWORK

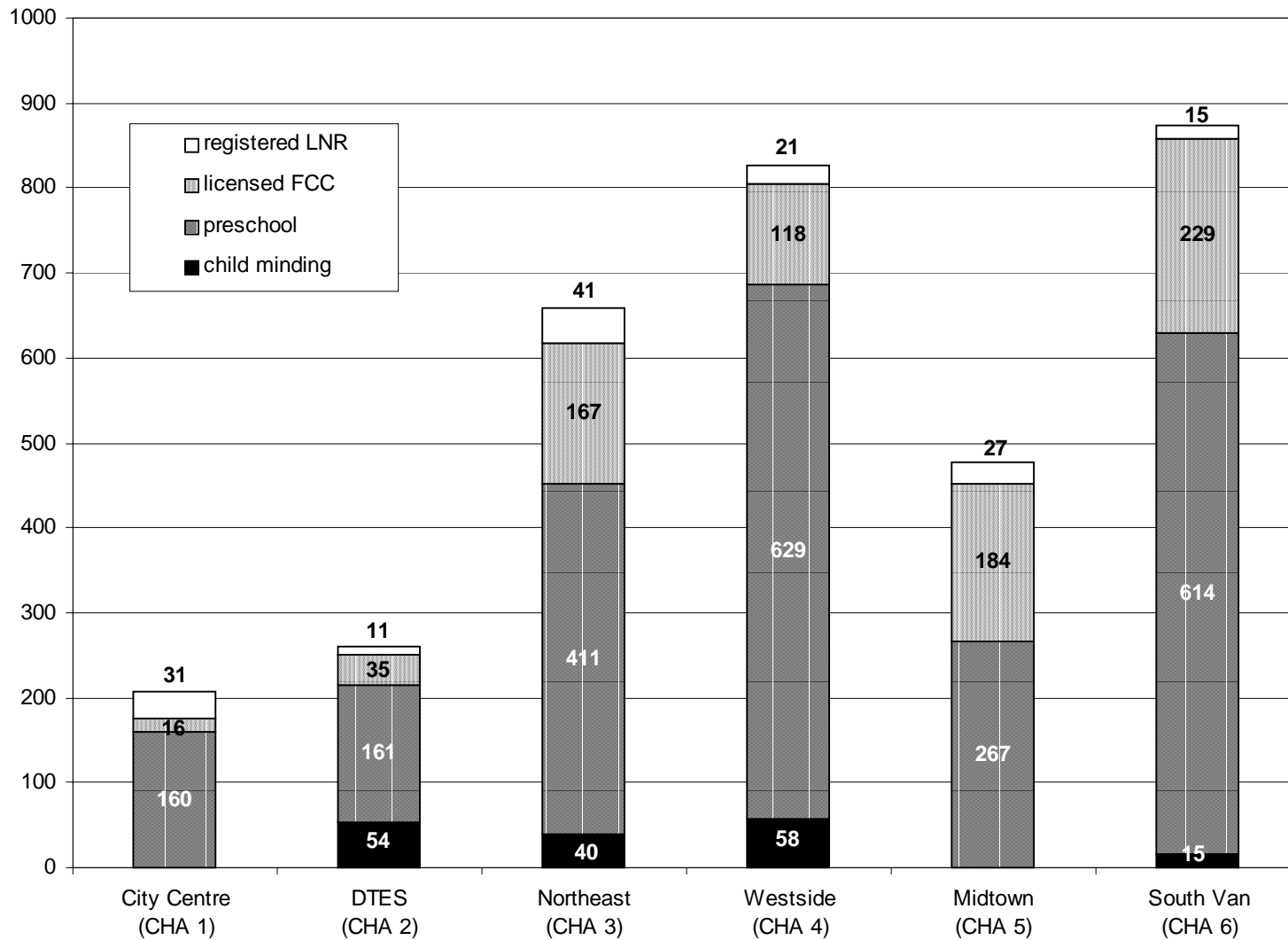
NUMBER OF INFANT TODDLER, 3 TO 5, AND OUT OF SCHOOL CHILDCARE SPACES BY NETWORK AREA

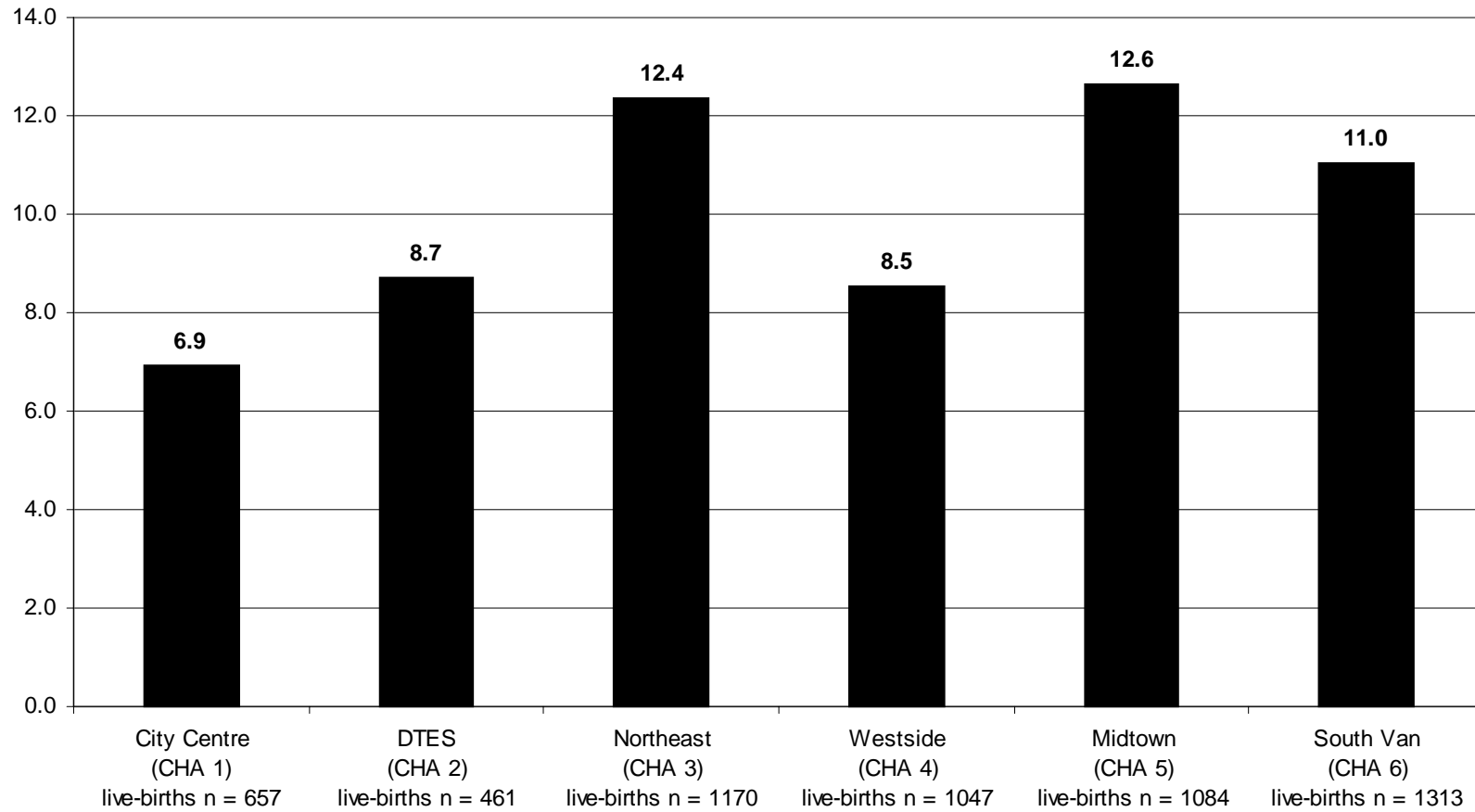

NETWORK BIRTHRATES

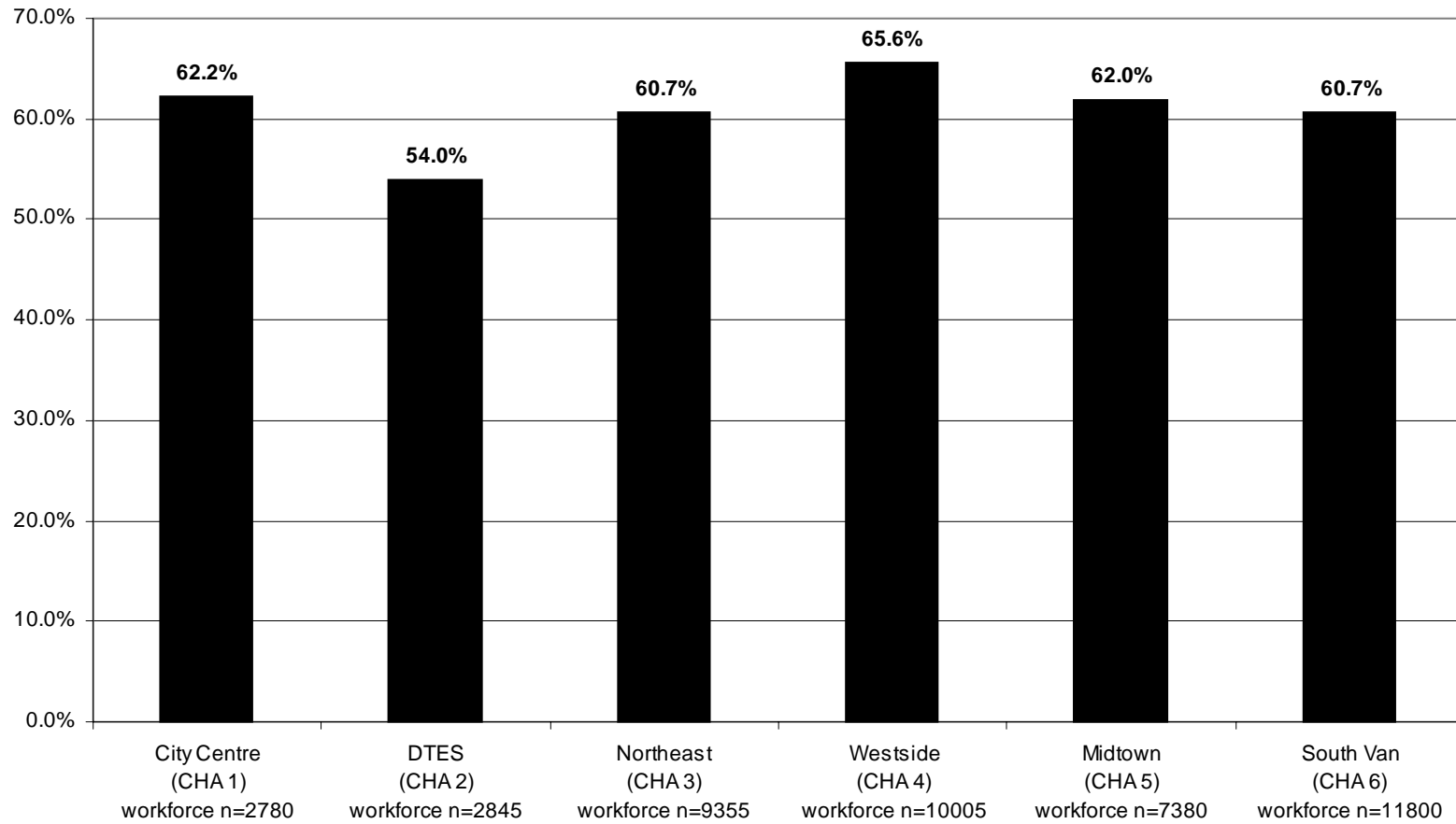

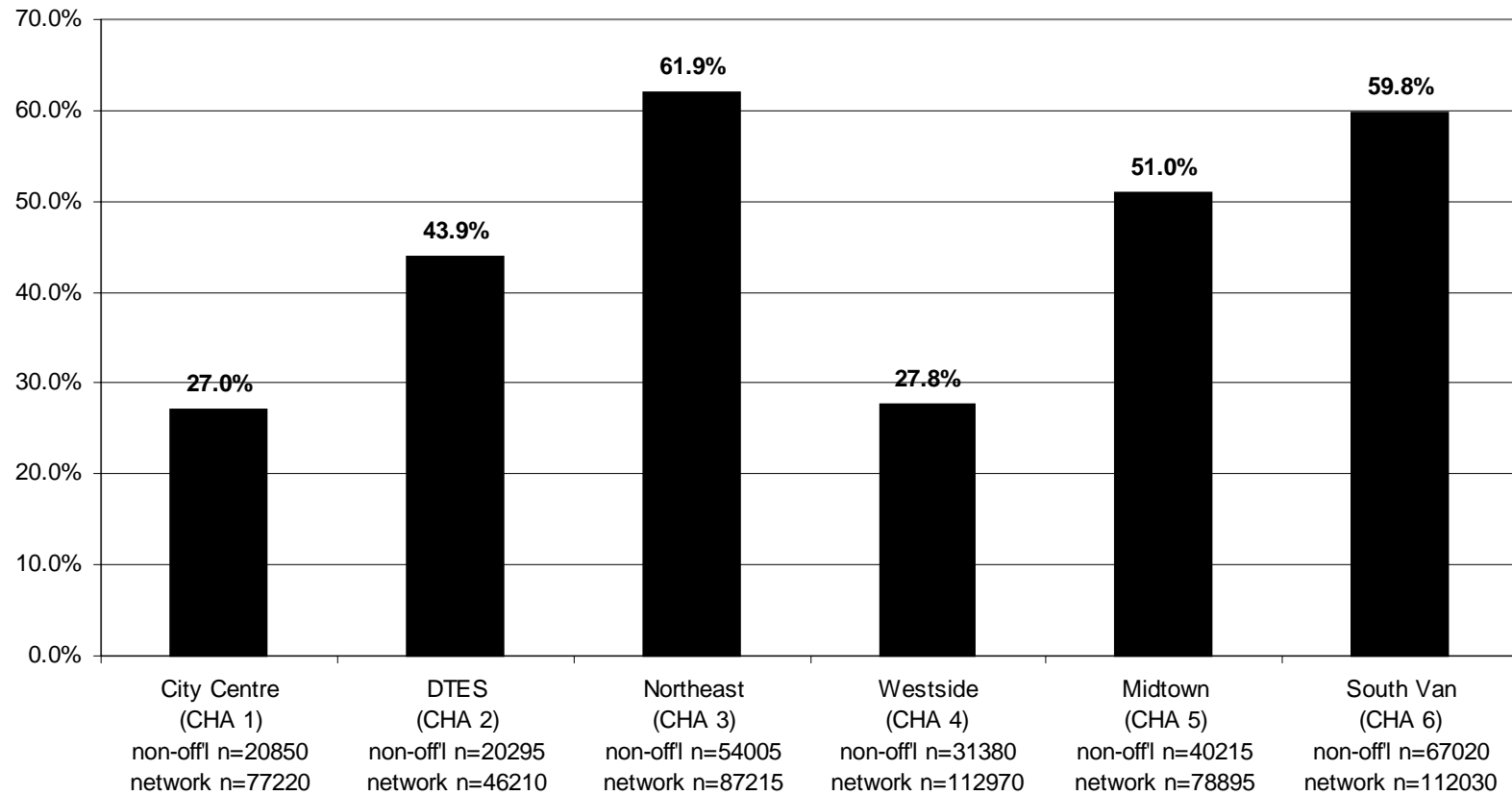

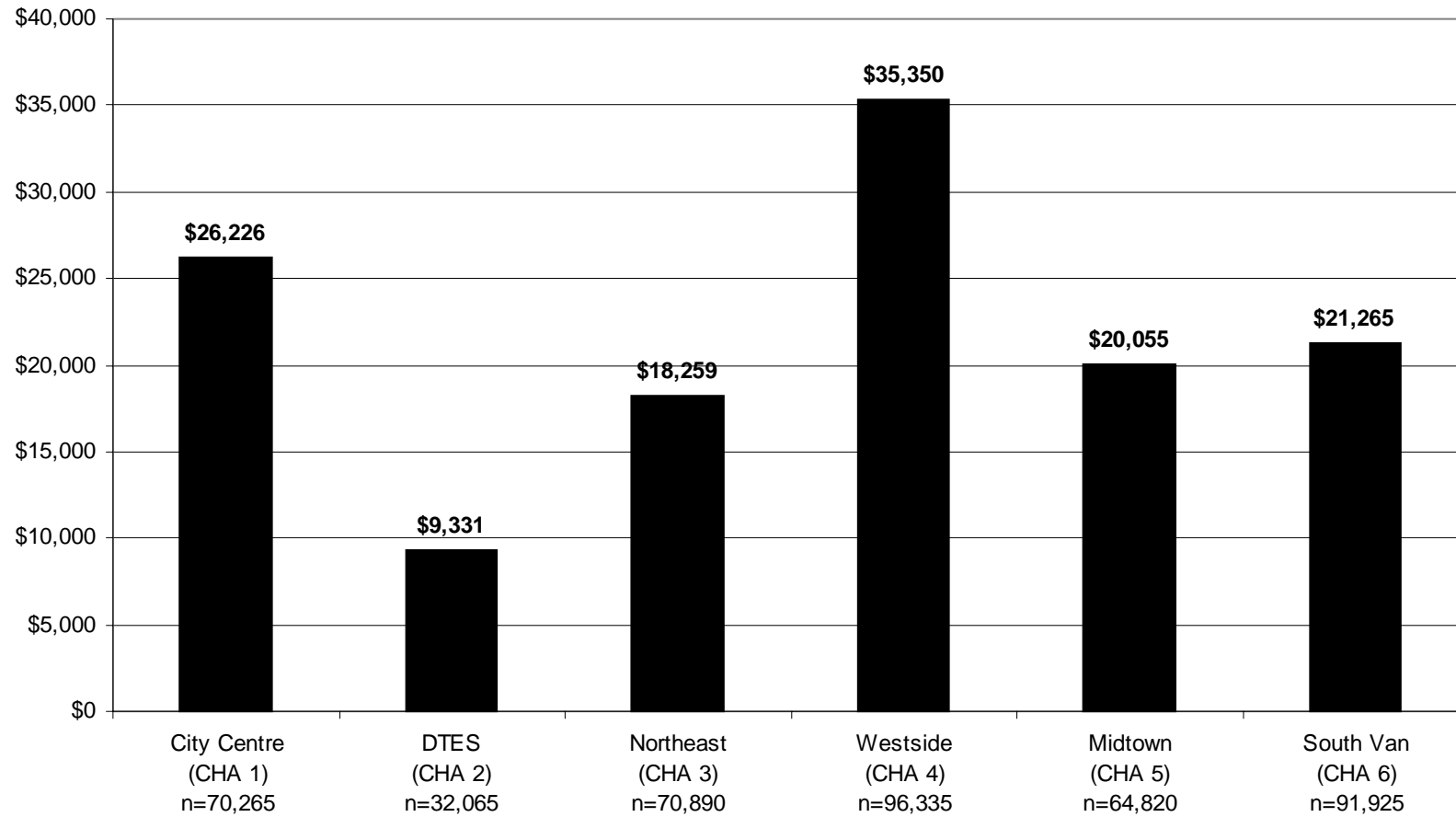
