The Education Program

In September, 1996 the Vancouver Police Centennial Museum began offering education programs developed to complement the science curriculum for grades 5 to 12. These educational programs are lead by the teacher with the assistance of a museum education volunteer and parent volunteers.

The Education Programs are as follows:

- 1. Junior Constable is for grades 5 to 7,
- 2. Investigation Police Work is for grades 8 to 10 and
- 3. Forensic Science is for grades 11 and 12.

In addition, these programs can be used for YMCA / YWCA children's program and for first year university criminology students.

The cost for these programs is \$25.00 plus an admission fee for each person attending.


