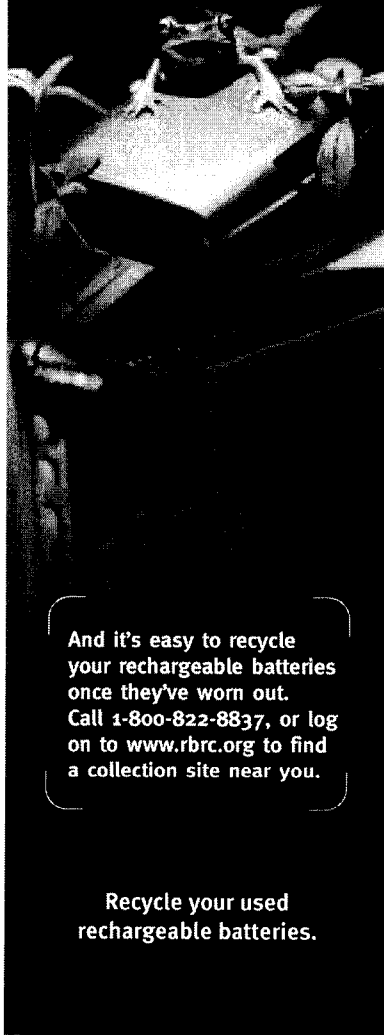

Helpful Tips for Recharging Batteries

Never...

- Return a fully-charged battery to the charger for an “extra boost”
- Leave your products in the charger when not charging (unless approved by the manufacturer)

Always...

- Follow charging instructions provided with your product
- Let your battery cool to room temperature before recharging
- Recharge batteries only when they are near to fully discharged – indicated by a sharp drop in power or speed
