BBC commissions, purchases, and remounts ballets that it performs to a growing audience in the city. In addition, BBC is a presenter of dance in Vancouver through its danceAlive! series. The series is comprised of four or five programs consisting of two or three of its own presentations and one or two others, featuring national and international companies of a high artistic standard. BBC is also engaged in collaborations with several other arts organizations, participates in community and school outreach performances, and provides a unique educational opportunity for pre-professional ballet dancers through its mentor programme which is run in collaboration with Arts Umbrella. Since its founding in 1973, Vancouver New Music (VNM) has been regarded as Western Canada's major producer of contemporary sonic art and is dedicated to the outstanding performance of the music of our time. As Vancouver's senior new music organization, VNM engages in a number of initiatives which develop the profile of new music and its practicing artists, and expand its audience. VNM is committed to pushing the boundaries of new music, expanding both the sound art genres and forms to which the term refers and the audience listening to and exploring them. Annually, VNM produces a concert series (5-7 events) featuring a diversity of local, Canadian and international composers, styles, etc., often exploring multi-disciplinary forms; some concerts broadcast on CBC Radio (national). Artist chats and panel discussions accompany performances as appropriate. The Vancouver New Music Festival is another annual commitment, each year focusing on a different theme or genre relevant to new music practice. Music theatre is offered every two years, as is the BC Emerging Composer / Sound Artist Competition. Free community events, and free artist chats and panel discussions, offer audiences enhanced experiences of new music (through active dialogue) as well as attracting new audiences to sonic art.
