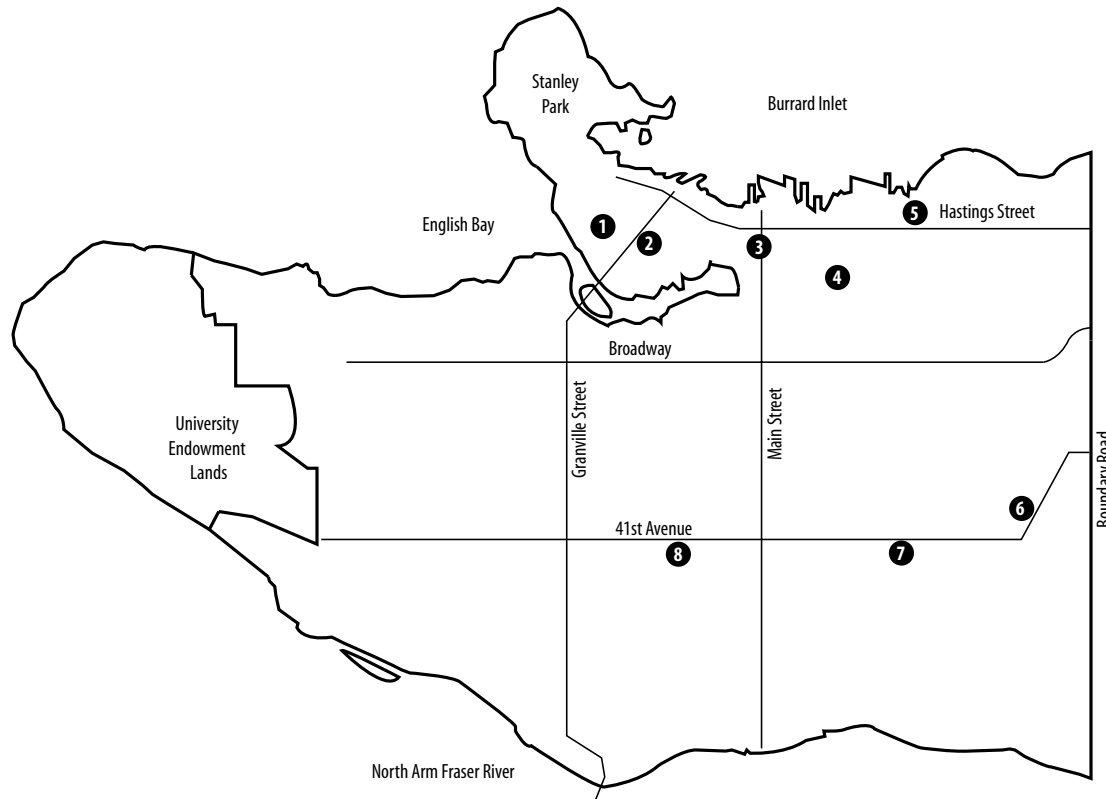

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES OFFERED BY COMMUNITY POLICING CENTRES

Community Policing Centres (CPCs) throughout the city provide some or all of the following programs and services, and more. Check with your local CPC for specific information.

- Reports from citizens:
At CPCs you can file reports on a variety of non emergency, non-violent, no suspect crimes and incidents. Neighbourhood police officers can follow up or CPC volunteers can provide information or referrals to appropriate resources. These reports also provide information to the VPD about crime and safety in your neighbourhood.
- Collecting information on illicit drug activity, including “grow ops”, drug dealing and drug houses
- Foot, bicycle, and pooch patrols
- Community mediation and referrals
- Community safety fairs and meetings
- Bike rodeos for children
- Seniors safety outreach
- Engraving of property
- Anti-graffiti programs
- Business/residential security inspections
- Local crime trends
- Block Watch referrals
- A variety of crime prevention pamphlets
- Safety booklets for children
- Child identification
- Security talks for groups
- Community clean-ups
