 Commemoration of the Japanese Canadian experience during the Second World War

WHEREAS Joy Kogawa's novel *Obasan* is one of the most powerful books ever written about the experience of Japanese Canadians during the Second World War;

AND WHEREAS the story of *Obasan* and its message about the consequences of war and prejudice are as relevant today as they were when the book was first released in 1981;

AND WHEREAS the house of *Obasan* still exists in Marpole, with the cherry tree that Joy Kogawa remembers as a child "propped up and bandaged, but still very much alive":

AND WHEREAS cherry blossoms have deep significance in Japanese culture, and are sometimes offered to other nations as a symbol of friendship;

AND WHEREAS, this year marks the 60th anniversary of the end of the Second World War in Asia;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of Vancouver plant a cutting of Joy Kogawa's cherry tree on the City Hall campus in the fall of 2005 as a way to commemorate the experience of Japanese Canadians during the Second World War.
