**A By-law to amend Street Name By-law No. 4054
regarding certain streets in Southeast False Creek**

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VANCOUVER, in public meeting, enacts as follows:

1. Council amends By-law No. 4054 by assigning the name:
 - (a) "Columbia Street" to that portion of street, being an extension of the existing Columbia Street, outlined in black on the plan marginally numbered LF 11845A attached to and forming part of this By-law, and the "Official Street Name Map of the City of Vancouver", which is the plan marginally numbered L325 attached to and forming part of By-law No. 4054, by adding to it "Columbia Street" located as shown on the plan marginally numbered LF 11845A;
 - (b) "Manitoba Street" to that portion of street, being an extension of the existing Manitoba Street, outlined in black on the plan marginally numbered LF 11845A attached to and forming part of this By-law, and the "Official Street Name Map of the City of Vancouver", which is the plan marginally numbered L325 attached to and forming part of By-law No. 4054, by adding to it "Manitoba Street" located as shown on the plan marginally numbered LF 11845A; and
 - (c) "Ontario Street" to that portion of street, being an extension of the existing Ontario Street, outlined in black on the plan marginally numbered LF 11845A attached to and forming part of this By-law, and the "Official Street Name Map of the City of Vancouver", which is the plan marginally numbered L325 attached to and forming part of By-law No. 4054, by adding to it "Ontario Street" located as shown on the plan marginally numbered LF 11845A.
2. This By-law is to come into force and take effect on the date of its enactment.

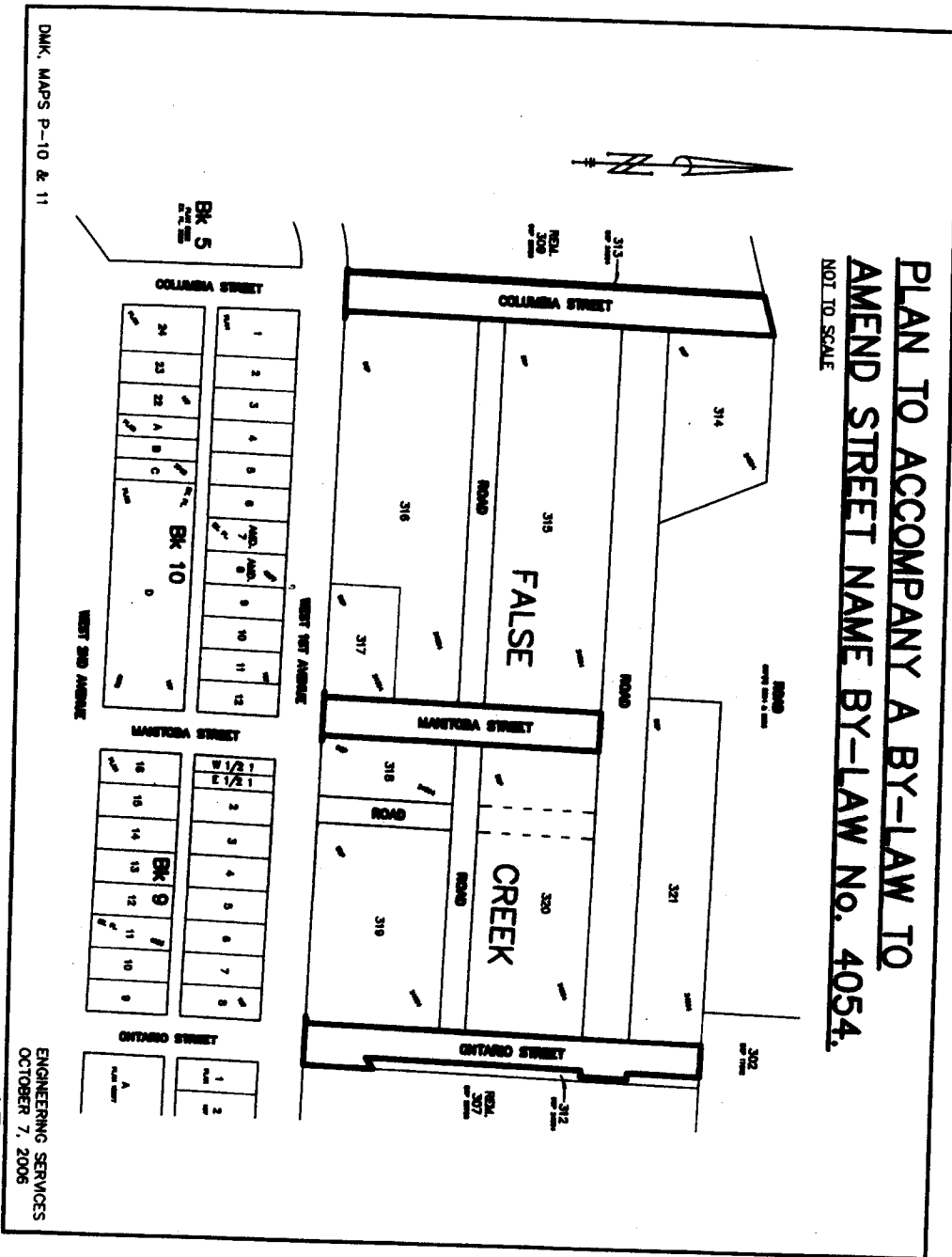

EXPLANATION**Fire By-law amending by-law re fireworks**

The attached by-law will implement Council's resolution of September 14, 2006 to amend the Fire By-law regarding fireworks and accompanying light displays, and to make grammatical changes only to section 5.8.2.2.(3) to use plural instead of singular language.

With respect to the ban on fireworks that produce noise without an accompanying light display, Council should note that Article 1.2.1.2 of the Fire By-law defines "fireworks" broadly to mean devices containing an explosive capable of or discharged for the purpose of producing a pyrotechnic special effect, a pyrotechnic signal or a sound signal and includes family fireworks and display fireworks so it is not necessary to cite examples in the By-law, and, in the view of the City Prosecutor, citing examples may cause problems enforcing other provisions of the Fire By-law; and that the proposed amendment refers to "noise" rather than to "loud noise" and to a light display as more than a single flash of light rather than "significant" because of the difficulty in defining, for the purposes of prosecution, what constitutes a "loud" noise or a "significant" light display.

**A By-law to amend Fire By-law No. 8191
regarding fireworks**

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VANCOUVER, in public meeting, enacts as follows:

1. This By-law amends the indicated provisions of the Fire By-law.
2. Council repeals Sentence 5.8.2.2.(3), and substitutes:

"3) No person shall point or direct *fireworks* at any person, animal, *building* or motor vehicle where such *fireworks* are in the process of exploding or detonating, and where they are capable of projecting or discharging a charge or pyrotechnical effect more than 1 m."
3. Council re-numbers Sentence 5.8.2.2.(5) as Sentence 5.8.2.2.(6).
4. After Sentence 5.8.2.2.(4), Council adds:

5) Despite anything to the contrary in this By-law, a person must not offer for sale, sell, dispose of, possess, or discharge fireworks that produce noise without an accompanying light display that consists of more than a single flash of light.
5. This By-law is to come into force and take effect on the date of its enactment.
