1. 2007 Operating Budget: Preliminary Estimates (File 05-1000-30)

Vancouver City Council, at its meeting on July 20, 2006, instructed the Director of Finance to proceed with a public consultation process on the 2007 Operating Budget, including a public meeting to be held in the Council Chamber.

Accordingly, Annette Klein, Director of Budget Services, presented an overview on the 2007 Operating Budget - Preliminary Estimates, which included a summary of the 2007 budget position, additional funding requests and the 2007 City Choices process.

Ms. Klein responded to questions regarding the public consultation.

The following provided comments on the 2007 Operating Budget challenges and priorities:

Speakers' comments included the following:

Rod MacDonald, Firefighter's Union

- suggest obtaining funds from the Property Endowment Fund to keep Vancouver going for the Olympics;
- previous public service cuts have had a devastating impact on the residents of this city;
 public services should not be cut at the expense of the 2010 Olympic games;
- the proposed police surveillance cameras will not accomplish any goals dealing with public rowdiness and drunkenness - a more simple and logical approach would be to enforce existing by-laws and have zero tolerance towards bar owners for over serving alcohol and serving to minors; the City's budget should not be allocated to this;
- rather than reducing services, recommend taxes be reduced and services improved the City can achieve this through tapping into revenue growth opportunities and finding operational deficiencies;
- asking for funding for a Downtown Eastside women's shelter, to be open 24 hours, seven days a week - clearly there must be funding for this if the City is considering putting aside Olympic Legacy funds of 5 million a year for the next four years;
- concern was expressed with regard to the public consultation process; the public meetings were unsuccessful primarily because of the lack of public notification;
- as this city grows there is a need for an advisory committee on environmental issues;
- the budget survey didn't include a question on whether business owners wanted to see a tax increase; businesses already subsidize the City services for residents, with an estimated ratio of 6 to 1 - businesses cannot afford more tax increases; and

• if Council wants to make a legacy with the Olympics, make Vancouver better by encouraging options and housing the homeless before the games begin.
