SUBJECT: 2007 Operating Budget - Final Estimates

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council approve the budget resolution attached as Appendix 2 thereby adopting the final 2007 Operating Budget with a property tax increase of 3.98%.

CITY MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The City Manager RECOMMENDS approval of the foregoing.

COUNCIL POLICY

The Vancouver Charter requires the Director of Finance to present the estimates of revenues and expenditures to Council no later than April 30 each year and for Council to adopt a resolution approving the budget and a rating bylaw establishing general purpose tax rates as soon thereafter as possible.

There are five reports in the budget building process:

- the Budget Schedule Report seeks direction from Council on the budget schedule, the public consultation process and a target property tax increase that includes new funding requests but excludes the cost of outside agencies.
- the Preliminary Estimates Report provides Council with the first indication of the cost of maintaining existing service levels and the additional funding requests from Departments and Boards.

- the Interim Estimates Report provides the results of the detailed administrative reviews and summarizes the budget strategies to meet the target property tax increase and seeks Council approval to finalize the estimate, bringing the budget into balance.
- The Public Consultation Report provides the results of the budget public consultation.
- the Final Report on the Operating Budget presents the finalized revenue and expenditure estimates including any final adjustments approved by Council at the Interim Estimates Report stage. The final report is accompanied by a resolution in which Council adopts the estimates for the year.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to have Council approve the budget resolution included in Appendix 2 in order to adopt the final revenue and expenditure estimates based on the direction provided by Council on February 27, 2007.

BACKGROUND

On February 27, 2007, Council considered the Interim Report on the 2007 Operating Budget and approved a number of recommendations related to the 2007 Operating Budget. Council also instructed the Director of Finance to bring the 2007 Operating Budget into balance with a general purpose tax increase of 3.98% which includes 0.47% tax increase related to the cost of outside agencies. The specific approvals include:

- The Park Board Global Budget of \$55,513,900, which includes an increase of \$442,100 for operating costs of new and expanded facilities and one-time adjustments. Note the Park Board Global Budget will be adjusted to include a budget for any new and non-recurring items and an allocation of turnover.
- The following program approvals without any impact to the operating budget:
 - o Regularization of a Councillors' Assistant Position (\$50,000)
 - o Three Engineering Services finance positions (\$230,000)
- The following funding requests for new programs, approved and funded from taxation:
 - o Social Planning resources for the YouthPolitik Program (\$51,000)
 - Official Visits and Protocol Funding (\$228,000)
 - o Homelessness Action Plan (\$100,000)
 - Permitted Resource Strategy (\$154,400)
 - Multilingual Communications Coordinator (\$59,000)
 - o Community Services Occupational Health &Safety Practitioner (\$35,100)
 - o Consolidation of Property Information System Analyst (\$83,000)
 - o South East False Creek Extension of 2 Temporary Planners (\$71,300)
 - Support for Future Area Planning Programs (\$166,600)
 - Vancouver Fire Department Vehicle Repeaters (\$181,500)
 - Vancouver Sports Strategy (\$150,000)
 - o Funding for the Vancouver Economic Development Commission (\$133,150)
 - o An increase of 17 police officers to implement Stage A1 operational efficiencies and one roving metro team (\$900,000);
 - A bylaw prosecutor position (\$100,000)
 - o Social Planning resources related to the 2010 Garden Plots (\$50,000 one-time)

o Cultural tourism funding, subject to report back by staff (\$300,000)

Adjustments totaling \$6.7 million to the Operating Budget included in RECOMMENDATION S as identified in the Interim Estimates Appendices 3 and 4, with the following exclusions or amendments to:

- # 14 (page 45) amended raising Vancouver Police Department charge out rates to an overall efficiency adjustment (\$48,000)
- #29 (page 49) excluded Engineering Sustainability Climate Change Action Plan (\$100,000)
- #35 (page 51) excluded Library Board Decrease Auxiliary Staffing (\$35,000)
- #36 (page 51) excluded Library Board Decrease expenses related to subscription cards (\$14,000)
- #37 (page 51) excluded Library Board Decrease to Collections budget (\$41,000)
- #38 (page 51) excluded Park Board Global Budget Adjustment (\$440,800)

DISCUSSION

1. Final Budget Position

Based on the direction provided by Council on February 27, 2007, staff has worked to bring the budget into balance within the property tax guidelines approved by Council. Appendix 1 reflects the final estimates including the changes itemized in the previous Background section. The general purposes tax levy has been increased by 3.98%, reflecting 3.51% City costs and 0.47% outside agency costs, adding \$19.1 million taxation revenue to the budget.

These adjustments bring the 2007 Operating Budget into a balanced position as follows:

2. Funding Report Backs

On February 27, 2007, Council requested that staff report back on a number of initiatives that have financial implications for this year and future budgets. These include:

a) Vancouver Police Department

On February 27, 2007, Council approved an increase to the Vancouver Police Department (VPD) staffing levels by 17 sworn officers to implement Stage A1 efficiencies and one of two Stage A2 metro roving units as identified in Vancouver Police Department Operational Review (RTS 06504). Council provided \$900,000 towards these two initiatives with the condition that funding be allocated to the Police Department only after Council receives confirmation from VPD of the Vancouver Police Union's (VPU) acceptance of the shift patterns recommended in the report (see decision R iv) below). Therefore funding for both Stage A1 and the one metro roving team is currently being held in "Other General Government" pending the report back from the VPU.

R iv) THAT the Chief Constable report, in consultation with the Police Board, the confirmation of the Vancouver Police Union's agreement to the recommended shifting strategy or other shifting patterns that meet the operational and financial objectives outlined in this report. Further, THAT funding shall not be allocated for these recommendations until this confirmation is received by Council.

Below is a summary of the financial implications of approving 17 sworn officers:

Further, Council instructed staff to report back on performance metrics related to the Patrol Deployment Study as well as "...Phase 2 of the VPD Operational Review including further opportunities related to overtime, shared services, and deployment efficiencies to offset VPD resource requirements including options to maximize and prioritize service levels without increasing staffing levels."

b) Olympic Legacy Reserve

On February 27, 2007, Council approved the creation of an Olympic Legacy Reserve and instructed staff to "...report back in 2007 on specific guidelines for the use of Olympic Legacy Funds and a funding strategy that minimizes the impact on property taxes."

c) Vancouver Economic Development Commission (VEDC)

Council approved an increase of \$133,150 for the Vancouver Economic Development Commission related to the: additional costs related to the maintenance of existing services (\$15,650), the implementation of the Business Climate Strategy (\$50,000),

permanent research position (\$67,500). As well Council requested that the VEDC continue working with the different teams associated with the 2010 Winter Games "...in order to maximize benefits/coordination and create synergies. Any extra funding required by VEDC should be drawn from the Olympic Legacy Reserve if Council approves setting up the reserve, subject to a report to Council on a Business Plan and cost-benefit rationale prior to Council's release of the funds."

d) Cultural Tourism Strategy

Council approved an increase of \$300,000 to the Contingency Reserve with the intent that funding "...be used as leverage with other agencies and funders, in conjunction with the arts and cultural community to support cultural tourism strategies such as the City's 125th anniversary recognition. Release of funds is subject to staff reporting back in 2007 with a business plan (including funding requirements) and opportunities for joint planning and funding associated with the 2010 Games."

3. Impact of the Budget on Property in the City

The table below summarizes the impact of tax increase on an average residential property and commercial property owners, together with the changes in other user charges.

In addition to these City charges, the levies from other taxing authorities may increase. At the time of writing, the City has not been notified of the exact amounts and percent increase.

² Non-residential properties are charged for utility services based on consumption of services rather than as a flat fee. Water and Sewer charges for these properties increased by the same percentages (approximately 4.5%) as residential properties.

4. 2008 Tax Increase Estimate

Council's decisions from February 27, 2007, along with other known impacts, are anticipated to impact the 2008 property taxes in the range of 3.73% to 5.23%.

5. The Budget Resolution

With approval of the Recommendation in this report, the 2007 Operating Budget will be brought into balance and the 2007 budget cycle completed. Council approval of this final position requires adoption of the budget resolution attached as Appendix 2.

6. Final Steps

The following three events are required of Council to put in place the necessary rating bylaws to provide for billing of the general purposes property tax levy:

- On March 15, 2007, the Property Taxation Policy Review Committee will report to City Services and Budgets Committee with interim recommendations arising from its review of the tax distribution of the property tax levy between residential and non-residential property classes.
- On March 15, 2007, City Services and Budgets Committee will consider the enactment of an averaging by-law. The by-law authorizes the continuation of three-year land averaging as the method for calculating property taxes for Class 1 (Residential) and

Class 6 (Business and Other) and the expansion of the averaging program to Class 5 (Light Industry) for 2007.

- On April 19, 2007, City Services & Budgets Committee will receive a report from the Director of Finance on the tax distribution of the property tax levy between residential and non-residential property taxes.
- On May 1, 2007, the Director of Finance will bring forward a report summarizing the property tax levies, bylaws establishing general purpose and regional district property tax rates and introducing resolutions to adjust tax rates of the other taxing authorities to give effect to the averaging program (if approved).

CONCLUSION

The approval of the attached resolution will finalize the process of balancing the 2007 Operating Budget.

THAT WHEREAS, the Vancouver Charter, Section 219 requires that the Director of Finance submit to Council each year the detailed estimates of revenues and expenditures of the City for the year;

AND WHEREAS the Vancouver Charter, Section 372 requires that Council adopt the estimates of revenues and expenditures for the City as soon thereafter as possible;

AND WHEREAS Council has reviewed the development of the estimates in reports submitted by the Director of Finance on October 31, 2006, and February 27, 2007 and approved measures to bring the estimates into balance, including approval of a 3.98% general purposes property tax increase;

AND WHEREAS the total estimated expenditures of the City to pay all debts and obligations of the City falling due in the year 2007, exclusive of the amounts required for school, Greater Vancouver Regional District, Greater Vancouver Transportation Authority, British Columbia Assessment Authority and Municipal Finance Authority purposes and not otherwise provide for, as amended by Council, amount to \$847,918,000;

AND WHEREAS the total estimated expenditures as aforesaid is the sum of the appropriation requests of all departments and boards properly supported by detailed analysis of those expenditures and listings of the salaried staff;

AND WHEREAS the total estimated revenue of the City for 2007 from sources other than real property taxes, as amended by Council, amounts to \$348,153,000;

AND WHEREAS the amount of the General Purposes Tax Levy so required is \$499,765,000;

THEREFORE be it resolved that the said estimates, both as to totals and individual items pertaining thereto, of the Director of Finance as so amended by Council be and the same are hereby adopted by Council.
