SUBJECT: 2007 Celebration Grant Recommendations

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council approve a total of \$200,200 in Celebration Grants to 41 organizations listed in Tables 1 and 2. Source of funds to be the 2007 Celebration Grants budget.

GENERAL MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The General Manager of Community Services recommends APPROVAL.

COUNCIL POLICY

Council approved creation of the Celebration Grants program in October 2002 for cash grants to community-based festivals, celebrations and large scale parades.

In July 2003, Council approved the establishment of a new service grant component of the program, which may provide an offset of up to 50% of the cost of city services (police and engineering) incurred by major parades to a maximum sum of \$10,000.

Approval of grant recommendations requires eight affirmative votes.

PURPOSE

This report recommends grants to 41 organizations, outlines selection processes, discusses the applications in more detail (Appendix A), appends the evaluation criteria in the Program Information Guide (Appendix B), and includes front pages of the applications (Appendix C).

BACKGROUND

In October 2002, Council established the Celebration Grants program as a means of encouraging and assisting community-based cultural festivals, celebrations and major parades. Through their provision of cultural interaction and entertainment, these events contribute to building a stronger sense of community in Vancouver.

On-going outreach is conducted in the community through a variety of channels: public service announcements, web page, paid ads, and an e-mailed distribution list targeted to the ethno-cultural and broader community. Four to six weeks in advance of each application deadline, staff host a public information meeting about the program for prospective applicants.

Applicants were first screened for eligibility and then, as available, interviewed by OCA staff. A further technical review for operational issues and permit or site requirements was then conducted by representatives from Cultural Affairs, Park Board and Engineering. Where the technical committee identified possible need for further follow up with organizations prior to their event, conditions, such as meeting with FEST Committee partners, were proposed to be placed on recommendation prior to release of grant funds.

Since the program's first intake of applications in 2003, the number of applicant organizations has continued to increase. Like other grant programs, this creates a competitive environment; therefore only those that best meet all evaluative criteria can be recommended for funding.

Since its inception, the Celebration Grants program has had two annual deadlines; one in the spring and one in the fall. In an effort to facilitate departmental review of all grant programs and to streamline the administrative load of the Celebration Grant Program during this review period, the fall 2007 deadline was eliminated. All organizations supported by this program, as well as previously unsuccessful applicants were contacted by post, email and phone to ensure they were aware of the change in deadline. Additionally, ads were posted in community newspapers giving notice of this change.

An Assessment Committee comprised of independent community members and Staff, review applications based on criteria that include: cultural or community interest, organizational competence, and community impact. See **Appendix B** for detailed program guidelines and criteria.

DISCUSSION

Celebration Cash Grants:

The cash grant component is available to help offset programming, publicity or administrative costs to a maximum sum of \$10,000.

For the Celebration Grants deadline in 2007 on March 19th, there were 50 applications received, totalling a combined cash and city services request of \$386,780 and an available budget of \$200,200. Among the 50 total applicant organizations, four also requested \$34,000 in funding from the city service component of Celebration Grants.

The applications were reviewed by an Assessment Committee comprised of Staff and three independent community members with a range of experience and expertise with both professional and community-based cultural events. The independent members are:

- Dolly Hopkins: Founder and former Artistic Director, Public Dreams Society
- Don Montgomery: Executive Director, Vancouver Asian Heritage Month Society, Publisher, Ricepaper Magazine
- Lajos Miklos: Festival Director, Hungarian Folk Fest, Artistic Advisor, Forrás Folk Ensemble

These consensus recommendations reflect a careful assessment of each application in the context of cultural or community interest, organizational capacity, and community impact. The Assessment Committee recommended funding in this category to 40 applicants as per Table 1, reflecting those projects which best met the evaluation criteria as outlined in Appendix B: Celebration Grants Program Information Guidelines.

Celebration Service Grants:

The service grants component is available to help offset up to 50% of the cost of city services incurred by major parades a maximum sum of \$10,000. The Assessment Committee recommended funding to four organizations in this category as per Table 2.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The 2007 Celebration Grants program budget is \$200,200. Approval of recommendations in Tables 1 and 2 (cash \$170,200 and city services \$30,000) will leave no balance in the 2007 Celebration Grants program budget.

CONCLUSION

The Celebration Grants program provides support to community organizations holding festivals and celebrations throughout the year and throughout Vancouver's neighbourhoods. The program continues to strive to be flexible enough to allow access to new organizations and events while providing encouragement to more established organizations to build both stronger events and organizational capacity.

The Assistant Director, Office of Cultural Affairs notes the importance of the Assessment Committee's expertise, insight, and carefully balanced recommendations and recommends approval.

2007 CELEBRATION GRANTS RECOMMENDATIONS

RECOMMENDED

Arts in Action Society

\$4,000

A grant of \$4,000 is recommended in support of artist fees for the In the House Festival, which brings artists and community together in non-traditional venues in the Grandview Woodland neighbourhood in June 2007.

Association of United Ukrainian Canadians \$10,000

A maximum grant of \$10,000 is recommended for the 4th annual multi-disciplinary Heart of the City Festival, which celebrates the Downtown Eastside community's history, people, cultures, and art forms and mobilizes its residents, artists and organizations during a 12-day celebration from October 31-November 1, 2007. The Assessment Committee was encouraged by the organizers' efforts to develop a sustainability plan to ensure the festival's future success.

BC Multicultural Health Services Society \$1,500

On behalf of the South Hill Festival organizing committee, BC Multicultural Health Services Society requested funding to support the May 12, 2007 South Hill Festival which engages community in the Sunset neighbourhood in a free, family-oriented event that focuses on sustainability. The Assessment Committee recommends a grant of \$1,500 targeted to event and publicity costs. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizing group to investigate independent not-for-profit status and diversify its cash revenues as it looks to produce the event in future.

Brazilian Community Assn.

\$4,000

The Assessment Committee recommends a grant of \$4,000 towards building organizational capacity by hiring an event coordinator, as well as event costs and ongoing outreach associated with hosting free, family-oriented workshops, presentations and exhibits that will showcase Brazilian cultural and Carnaval traditions at the Roundhouse Community Centre and at the Commodore in February 2008.

Cedar Cottage Neighbourhood House

\$4,500

The Assessment Committee recommends a grant of \$4,500 for programming, publicity and event costs for the 22nd annual Mother's Day Traditional Pow Wow at Trout Lake Community Centre, May 11-13, 2007. This long-established event is well-supported by the community and this year's theme, "Why We Celebrate," features cross-cultural and inter-generational exchange regarding the protocols and cultural traditions of the Plains First Nations.

Celtic Fest Vancouver Society

\$10,000 & \$6,000

A maximum cash grant of \$10,000 is recommended for the costs of producing the 7th annual Celtic Fest Vancouver—a multi-stage outdoor festival, weekend street market, and parade—which attracts a city-wide audience to its downtown location in March 2008. A service grant to cover up to 50% of police and engineering costs (to a maximum of \$6,000) for the annual St. Patrick's Day Parade is also recommended.

Centre of Integration for African Immigrants \$2,500

A grant of \$2,500 is recommended towards the costs of presenting the all-day Black History Market and Cultural Showcase, part of Black History Month, on Saturday February 23, 2008 at the WareHouse in the Renfrew-Collingwood neighbourhood. The Assessment Committee recommends targeting funds to assist the organization with its marketing and outreach costs. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizers to pursue diversified cash revenue sources for the event.

Chinese Benevolent Association of Vancouver \$10,000 & \$4,000

A maximum cash grant of \$10,000 is recommended for the costs of producing the Chinese New Year Parade on February 10, 2008. This large-scale parade includes a diverse number of professional and community groups and attracts a city-wide audience to its Chinatown location. A service grant to cover up to 50% of police and engineering costs (to a maximum of \$4,000) for the annual parade is also recommended.

Collingwood Neighbourhood House

A grant of \$2,850 is recommended in support of artists' fees for this community-based celebration that takes place on May 26, 2007 around the Joyce St. Skytrain station. The Assessment Committee is encouraged by the organizer's efforts to continue to enliven the annual Collingwood Days through new programming initiatives such as the "Joyces".

Community Arts Council of Vancouver

A grant of \$2,000 is recommended to organize the Fearless Festival, a street-level community arts festival to take place on Sunday, July 1st, 2007 in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside. This inaugural event will feature and support local artists and community members and is designed as an opportunity for both residents and non-residents to experience the DTES as a creative, diverse and vibrant community.

CRAB - Water for Life Society

A grant of \$1,850 is recommended for artist fees and event costs to produce this July 1st event coinciding with the 20th anniversary of the CRAB Park at Portside. This event provides a unique focal point for the DTES neighbourhood residents on Canada Day. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizers to develop community partnerships to strengthen their organizational capacity to deliver the event.

Dr. Sun Yat-Sen Garden Society of Vancouver \$3,500

A grant of \$3,500 is recommended to support artists' fees and event costs associated with the culturally diverse programming of the annual Chinatown Arts and Cultural Festival in the Dr. Sun Yat-Sen Courtyard over four Saturdays in July. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizers to pursue diversified cash revenue sources for the event.

Dunbar Residents' Assn.

\$1,000

A grant of \$1,000 is recommended towards the production of the Salmonberry Days calendar, the major promotional tool of the 10th annual community celebration, to be held throughout the month of May throughout the Dunbar neighbourhood.

East Vancouver Celebrate Society

\$5,000

A grant of \$5,000 for and event costs is recommended for the June 17th Commercial Drive Community Festival, which celebrates the neighbourhood's diversity, and its pedestrian and family-friendly character. The Assessment Committee is interested in seeing the organizers' sustainability plans as they move to holding multiple events in the neighbourhood in the summer of 2007.

Eastside Culture Crawl Society

\$10,000

The Assessment Committee recommends a maximum grant of \$10,000 towards marketing and administration costs of the open-studio tour and arts festival. Over 300 artists and craftspeople will open their studio doors free-of-charge to the public in 38 buildings from November 16-18, 2007 in neighbourhoods stretching from Strathcona to Grandview-Woodlands.

Evergreen Environmental Foundation

\$3,500

The Evergreen Environmental Foundation applied for funding for the cultural component of its annual Earth Day Celebration at Jericho Beach Park on April 20, 2008. The Assessment Committee recommends a grant of \$3,500 to be targeted to artists' fees and production costs.

False Creek Watershed Society

\$1,000

A grant of \$1,000 is recommended towards performers' fees, publicity and event costs for the 4th annual Salmon Celebration held in the South East corner of False Creek on September 30, 2007.

Frog Hollow Neighbourhood House

\$3,000

A grant of \$3,000 is recommended in support of the cultural components related to the Pumpkin Patch in the City celebration on October 27, 2007, a multi-faceted family celebration serving newcomer residents from surrounding neighbourhood houses and the Renfrew-Collingwood area. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizers to pursue diversified cash revenue sources for the event.

Hellenic Canadian Congress of B.C.

\$6,000

The Assessment Committee recommends a grant of \$6,000 towards performers' fees and event costs for Greek Day, a free community celebration on June 24th. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizers to articulate their precise vision for the cultural components of the all-day street festival.

Islamic Heritage Society

\$3,000

A grant of \$3,000 is recommended to this first-time applicant to support performers' fees during the 3rd annual Canadian Islamic Cultural Expo, July 27-28, 2007 at the Vancouver Art Gallery's Centennial Square. This free, publicly-accessible festival celebrates the diversity of Islamic culture in Canada through science and technology, heritage, and arts and architecture.

Khalsa Diwan Society

\$10,000

The Assessment Committee recommends a city services grant for the annual Vaisakhi Procession. This key event in the South Asian community will take place on Saturday April 12, 2008 in the Sunset neighbourhood. The service grant will to cover up to 50% of police and engineering costs (to the program maximum of \$10,000) for the annual

parade. The grant is recommended SUBJECT TO a FEST Committee meeting with the organizers.

The Assessment Committee also reviewed a request for a cash grant to support the cultural programming of the procession. However, given the limited programming information provided in the application and the lack of clarity as to how previous-year cash grant contributions have enhanced event programming (e.g. building in artists' remuneration, increasing outreach to multicultural performing groups, or enhancing pageantry elements of the procession), no cash grant is recommended in this highly competitive round.

Latinos in Action Vancouver Foundation \$6,000

A grant of \$6,000 is recommended towards artists' fees and production costs for Latin Summer Fest, a free event on August 19, 2007, which celebrates the diversity of Latin culture through arts, music and food at Trout Lake. The grant is recommended SUBJECT TO Park Board approval of the confirmed list of marketplace vendors prior to the 2007 event.

\$4,000

Light Water Drums Society

A grant of \$4,000 is recommended for the Light Water Drum Festival on January 26, 2008. The resident and community-driven celebration includes pre-event lantern workshops leading to a program involving performances, lantern installations and a drum procession through the Sanctuary in Hastings Park and terminating with indoor activities at Hastings Community Centre.

Little Mountain Neighbourhood House \$2,000

The Assessment Committee recommends a grant of \$2,000 for the Little Mountain/Riley Park Community Festival on June 17, 2007 at the Riley Park Community Centre. This year's theme, "A Family of Communities" will celebrate the intergenerational and culturally diverse characteristics of the neighbourhood. The Assessment Committee noted the event's strong youth engagement and encourages the organizers to build on the festival's cultural component.

Mount Pleasant Neighbourhood House \$2,000

A grant of \$2,000 is recommended for the annual Celebrate Mount Pleasant event. Scheduled for June 2, 2007 at Guelph Park and Mount Pleasant Elementary School grounds, this event promotes the positive aspects of this inner-city community. The Assessment Committee noted that this year's event will have a higher community profile as it plays host to the Mount Pleasant Community Planning Team from the City's Community Visions Program. The Assessment Committee encourages the event organizers to take this opportunity to position the celebration within the neighbourhood's developing community vision.

Myanmar Heritage Cultural Assn. \$1,000

The Myanmar Heritage Cultural Association applied for funding for a Myanmar New Year Water Festival to be held on Saturday April 12, 2008 in the Oakridge neighbourhood. The Assessment Committee recommends a grant of \$1,000 to help with event costs and artists' fees for this celebration. Assessment Committee encourages the organizers to outreach to a wider community for its proposed cross-

cultural exchange on new year traditions as well as event promotion to the general public.

Pandora's Collective Outreach Society \$4,000

A grant of \$4,000 is recommended towards publicity fees and event costs for the annual Summer Dream Reading Festival on July 21, 2007. The all-day event showcases grassroots spoken word, poetry, storytelling and musical performances as well as an expanded children's area at a new location at Lumberman's Arch in Stanley Park.

Pedal Energy Development Alternatives Power Association \$2,000 A grant of \$2,000 is recommended to this first-time applicant for Pedal Fest: A Celebration of Bike Arts and Culture, taking place along East 17th Avenue between Main and Quebec Streets on September 22, 2007. The celebration will showcase the talents of fixed-gear bike riders and local cycling groups performing bike inspired street dance, it will screen films from local and regional cycling communities and it will offer free bike tune-ups and maintenance tips throughout the all-day event.

Pride in Art Society

\$4,000

A grant of \$4,000 is recommended to this first-time applicant towards artist fees for the Pride in Art Festival, a celebration of visual and performing arts that takes place at the Roundhouse Community Centre from July 30-August 15, 2007.

Secret Lantern Society

\$10,000

The Assessment Committee recommends a maximum grant of \$10,000 for artists' fees and event costs for the annual Winter Solstice Lantern Festival on Friday December 21, 2007. The celebration honours the return of the sun in a culturally diverse event. Preevent community outreach and workshops lead to site-specific solstice lantern processions, performances and installations in six Vancouver neighbourhoods.

South Asian Family Assn.

\$5,000

A grant of \$5,000 is recommended towards artists' fees and event costs for the 5th annual South Asian Sawan Mela celebration on June 17, 2007 at the Rocky Mountaineer Station. This public event includes provides opportunities for cross cultural learning and participation in a tradition that celebrates young married South Asian women reconnecting with friends, families and communities.

South Vancouver Neighbourhood House

\$7,500

A grant of \$7,500 is recommended for programming, publicity and administrative costs of the 4th annual Vancouver Celebrates Diwali, a multi-faceted celebration of the South Asian festival of light held in November at various community venues. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizing group to investigate independent not-for-profit status, diversify its cash revenues, and continue to build audiences through increased publicity and marketing.

Still Moon Arts Society

\$7,000

A grant of \$7,000 is recommended for programming costs and publicity fees for the September Renfrew Ravine Moon Festival, which combines a neighbourhood harvest fair with community and professional arts performances and lantern installations in Renfrew Park.

Vancouver Cherry Blossom Festival Society \$3,000

The Vancouver Cherry Blossom Festival Society requested funding for its annual celebration to be held throughout Vancouver in March and April 2008. The celebration will welcome the return of spring in the Japanese tradition with participatory, cherry-themed events such as hanami (blossom viewing), haiku-writing and blossom art painting as well as blossom walks, talks and demonstrations. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizers to work in closer partnership with the City's Special Events Office in delivering its month-long series of events.

Vancouver Dyke March and Festival Society \$4,000

A grant of \$4,000 is recommended for publicity and programming costs of the August 4, 2007 Dyke March and Festival, which culminates in an all-ages afternoon music festival for queer women, their families and supporters at Grandview Park during Pride weekend.

Van. Intl. Bhangra Celebration Society \$1,500

A first-time grant of \$1,500 is recommended for artists' fees and event costs for the January 2008 Bhangra: Authentic at the Norman Rothstein Theatre. The event, which explores the dance form and its traditional roots as part of a five-day festival of Bhangra music and dance, originates from the Punjab region of India. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizers to articulate in stronger terms, their vision and goals for the five-day festival.

Vancouver Métis Association \$4,000

The Assessment Committee recommends a grant of \$4,000 for artists' fees and event costs for Celebration Métis, an outdoor celebration of Métis music, dance and heritage held at the Vancouver Art Gallery's Centennial Square on August 11, 2007. This year will mark the 4th anniversary of this festival that has successfully reached out to the Métis, Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal communities and cultural organizations and has attracted growing audiences.

Vancouver Pride Society

\$7,500 & \$10,000

The Assessment Committee recommends a cash grant of \$7,500 towards the 29th annual Pride parade and festival on August 5, 2007. The Assessment Committee encourages the society to continue its efforts to strengthen its organizational capacity. In recognition of increased city services costs to the Society resulting from the exponential growth in the parade's audience attendance, a service grant to cover up to 50% of police and engineering costs for the parade is also recommended (up to the program maximum of \$10,000).

Vancouver Venture for Diversity Society \$1,000

A first-time grant of \$1,000 is recommended for an Aboriginal Cultural Day celebration at the Aboriginal Friendship Centre in East Vancouver on June 30, 2007. The cultural program of this community-focused event is designed to showcase and celebrate the diversity within Canada's First Nations communities and includes culinary displays and exhibits of crafts, performances by dancers and musicians, and author readings.

Vancouver Wooden Boat Society

\$4,000

A grant of \$4,000 is recommended in support of artists' fees and publicity costs for the 20th annual Wooden Boat Festival on Granville Island scheduled for August 23-26, 2007. The Assessment Committee noted opportunities within the festival's programming to build upon its cultural offerings and represent a more diverse range of maritime cultures and traditions.

West End Senior's Network Society

\$1,500

A grant of \$1,500 is recommended towards artists' fees and event costs for the Strawberry Festival on June 23, 2007, presented by seniors in Barclay Heritage Square. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizing group to diversify its cash revenues and move toward prioritizing programming costs.

NOT RECOMMENDED

Colombian Canadian Community of BC

The Colombian Canadian Community of BC applied for funding for the Colombian Canadian Summer Celebration to be held, in celebration of Colombian Independence Day, at an outdoor venue in July 2007. The Assessment Committee noted that the organizers were proposing an ambitious transition to an all-day outdoor celebration from the previously-held indoor concert. The organizers are encouraged to further develop their vision around the event, and be able to confirm venue and communicate logistics planning. In a competitive round, no grant is recommended.

Fiji Indian Association of BC

While the impact of the annual Fiji Festival in the Fijian Indian community was recognized, the proposal did not articulate an outreach plan to engage the broader community. With the limited information presented in the application, the Assessment Committee also had outstanding questions regarding the organization's fundraising strategies, financial management and plans for producing the proposed event. In a competitive round, no grant is recommended.

Hastings Elementary Community School Parent Advisory Council

While the Assessment Committee noted the significance of the 100th Anniversary event for the school in 2008, the application lacked specifics on broader community engagement and outreach. Therefore, in the context of a competitive grant round, no grant is recommended to this first-time applicant.

Peretz Centre for Secular Jewish Culture

The Peretz Centre for Secular Jewish Culture applied for funding for the Festival of Latin American Jewish Culture to be held in the Peretz Centre in February 2008. The Assessment Committee encourages the organizers to pursue its outreach goals with confirmed community partners to meet its potential for cross-cultural sharing between Latin American, Jewish and mainstream participants. This year, in the context of a competitive round, no grant is recommended.

Southlands Riding Club

The Southlands Riding Club requested funding to cover promotional costs for its annual Southlands Country Fair. The Assessment Committee noted that, while the organizers articulated a distinct niche for the event, they had not articulated a need for grant funding. The Assessment Committee points the organizers to another City of Vancouver program, Transit Shelter Advertising, which may be able to address their desire to increase city-wide publicity. In the context of a competitive round, no cash grant is recommended.

Spirits Rising Memorial Society

The Spirits Rising Memorial Society requested a grant to cover costs associated with a dedication ceremony to mark the completion of carving and raising of a memorial totem pole dedicated to the missing and murdered women of Vancouver's Downtown Eastside. The Assessment Committee noted a lack of detail regarding the ceremony's cultural programming component and missing information about the project's progress, timeline and fundraising efforts. In a competitive round, no grant is recommended.

Stanley Park Bike Festival Society

Stanley Park Bike Festival Society requested a grant to cover the costs of cultural programming, administration and promotional expenses for the Stanley Park Bike Festival. The Assessment Committee noted the lack of clarity as to how previous-year cash grant contributions have enhanced the cultural programming in the event. In a competitive round, no grant is recommended.

United Native Nations Society

The United Native Nations Society requested funding to cover the costs of a parade along East Hastings Street and ceremony at Victory Square to recognize National Aboriginal Veterans Day. The Assessment Committee noted unconfirmed revenues and missing critical information in the application. In a competitive round, no grant is recommended.

United Vietnamese Canadian Community in BC Society

The United Vietnamese Canadian Community in BC Society requested funding to cover the costs of a Mid-Autumn Children's Celebration. The Assessment Committee noted missing critical information in the application regarding programming, outreach and logistics. The organizers are encouraged to further develop their vision and niche around the event. In a competitive round, no grant is recommended.

CELEBRATION GRANTS

Program Objectives



This program is for community-based festivals, cultural celebrations and large parades, in recognition of the entertainment they offer and their contribution to a sense of community among residents of diverse cultures, ages and interests.

Assistance with specific costs is available to help community-based not-for-profit societies to present these events, which may include programs of music and performance, crafts, exhibits, culinary and other cultural expressions of the community.

Who can apply?

Applicants must be:

- $\hfill \square$ registered as not-for-profit societies in British Columbia for at least six months
- □ located in the City of Vancouver (not in other Lower Mainland municipalities or the University Endowment Lands)
- □ have a cultural mandate which includes organizing festivals, celebrations or large scale parades in Vancouver

Examples of organizations that can apply include neighbourhood houses, resident associations, community service groups, ethnocultural societies, or arts and cultural organizations. Although Business Improvement Associations are not eligible on their own, community events they co-sponsor with not-for-profit community organizations are eligible.

The following are ineligible to apply:

- □ civic departments or branches (i.e. community centres, libraries)
- organizations receiving City of Vancouver cultural grants or those who would be eligible

What types of events are eligible?

Three types of events, organized for the purpose of building and celebrating a sense of community and held primarily for the benefit of Vancouver residents, qualify for assistance:

- □ Festivals: annual or biannual events of at least two days, actively programmed around a theme related to cultural expression in the broadest sense, for example, through music or other performances, crafts, displays, cooking, or demonstration of cultural traditions.
- □ **Celebrations**: one-day events, generally held outdoors, and actively programmed around a theme, anniversary, or other occasion, with a significant cultural component in the broadest sense.

■ Major parades: one-day events with a large audience and a significant cultural component, broadly defined to include music and other performances, costumes, floats, banners, arches and installations, or other pageantry elements.
 Please note: To qualify as "major" a parade must have an event budget of over \$15,000; attract, or have the potential to attract, an audience of over 10,000; and have 20-25 organizations registered as entrants.
 Ineligible activities and expenses:

events whose primary theme or focus is not cultural
 sports and athletic events, runs, walks
 competitions
 demonstrations, marches, rallies
 block parties, picnics, garden shows, street markets, carnivals
 religious rites and ceremonies, small parades and processions
 events for marketing, promotional, or commercial purposes
 events that have a predominant commercial component
 events whose purpose is primarily fund-raising
 retroactive expenses or accumulated deficits
 city services costs of festivals or celebrations
 capital projects
 events or activities that would qualify for the City of Vancouver's cultural grants

What can grant funds be used for?

The Celebration Grants program has two components. The first provides for cash grants to festivals, celebrations and parades. Funds may be applied toward one or more of the following:

- □ **Programming costs:** for example, performers' fees; display and exhibit costs; equipment rental; production technician's fees; costume creation, rental or cleaning; site decoration; parade floats and other pageantry elements.
- □ **Staff and administrative costs:** for example, planning and co-ordination, fundraising, and event management.
- Publicity and marketing: for example, development of marketing strategies; press kits; design and production of advertising for print, radio, television, and web sites; and purchase of advertising in mainstream and/or ethnic media.

Please note: Individual grant amounts will range from \$1,000 to a maximum of \$10,000, depending on the scale of the event. Requests may not exceed \$10,000.

The second component of the program provides for service grants to major parades. Up to 50% of the cost of services provided to major parades by the City is eligible for a grant. Service grants apply to police or engineering services such as traffic signs, barricades, and sanitation. The cost of Park Board, Coast Mountain Bus Company, or BC Ambulance services are not eligible.

Please note: The total annual budget for service grants to parades is \$25,000. Major parades may request up to 50% of their anticipated City service costs: requests may not exceed \$10,000.

How to apply

To obtain an application form, please contact Office of Cultural Affairs (OCA) staff, who manage the Celebration Grants program. Organizations must establish their eligibility for funding with OCA staff well in advance of submitting an application.

- □ To be considered for a grant, an organization must complete, sign and submit an original application form, together with three complete copies of the application. Photocopies of all attachments are required for original application and ALL copies.
- Organizations planning events on city streets or in parks must have all required approvals and permits from the Special Events Office or from the Park Board to hold their event in these locations or demonstrate that these approvals are in process.
- □ Under normal circumstances, the application, review and decision process takes eight weeks. Cash grants will generally be paid out within three weeks of Council approval. Service grants approved by Council for major parades will be applied to eligible City services following the event up to a maximum of 50% of costs.

How will applications be evaluated?

Since funds are limited, not all organizations meeting the eligibility criteria can be supported. This is a competition, based on the following evaluation criteria:

- □ Does the applicant provide evidence of confirmed revenues from sources other than the City of Vancouver? Revenues may include earned income from tickets and concessions, sponsorships, donations from individuals, businesses or community groups, memberships, in-kind donations, and support from foundations and government agencies. □ Does the event provide unique opportunities for the public? □ What is the quality of the programming? Does it demonstrate creativity, the involvement of persons with appropriate expertise, authenticity in presentation of cultural traditions, or uniqueness in expressing the character of a community or neighbourhood? □ How complete is the plan for delivering the event, including site or venue requirements, and engagement of key organizers? How complete is the budget; are there commitments from other sources of support? Is there a demonstrated need for a grant? □ If the application is for marketing assistance, what are the plans, resources and capabilities of the applicant for reaching a city-wide public, including diverse communities? Does the event have the capacity to attract and engage an audience and/or develop a new audience? ☐ How successful were previous events? Is there adequate administration, a functional Board of Directors and financial accountability?
- ☐ Have impacts on the surrounding neighbourhood been considered and addressed?
- ☐ How effectively have major parade organizers managed their event in the past? What plans are in place to improve management, and control or lower the need for City services?

Review process

- □ Cultural Affairs staff ensure that applications are eligible. City staff on the FEST committee and Park Board are consulted on operational impacts, site issues and permits. When possible, interviews with applicants are arranged.
- □ A grant program assessment committee of community members and individuals with event management experience reviews the proposals and provides comments. Staff then submit a report with recommendations for Council's approval, and notify applicants of the recommendations and the Council meeting date on which grants will be considered.

Conditions of Assistance

- Societies must provide their most recent financial statement within six months of their fiscal year end.
- Uvoting members of the applicant's Board of Directors must not concurrently hold paid staff positions, nor be paid for their services to the society. They may be reimbursed for expenses.
- ☐ The organizers must develop and promote the event and extend its services to the general public in the City of Vancouver in a non-discriminatory way.
- □ Support from the City of Vancouver must be appropriately acknowledged on all promotional materials related to the funded event, including brochures, print ads, programs, posters, signs, and media releases.
- ☐ The term of the grant is one year, and only one Celebration grant application per City fiscal year can be submitted. Previously funded projects must be completed before a new application can be accepted.
- □ Receipt of a grant does not imply funding in the following fiscal year.

The Vancouver Chinese New Year Parade has become a very popular and fun event for the people of Vancouver and the Lower Mainland since its inception 34 years ago. The upcoming Chinese New Year Parade is scheduled for February 10, 2008 in celebration of the lunar Year of the Rat. This parade is a multi-cultural event that has grown to over 50 entries and about 3,000 participants from diverse cultural, ethnic and community groups. An estimated 50,000-60,000 spectators came out in 2007 to enjoy this event. For the last 4 years, Channel M has provided extensive TV coverage including prime time broadcast of the parade. Other media such as newspapers and radios have deployed more resources for coverage of this event in recent years. The Chinese Benevolent Association has been the lead parade organizer for the past 27 years. To increase participation/diversity and to share financial and organizational responsibilities, the event organizing committee has expanded its membership to include 5 additional Chinese community groups: Chinese Cultural Centre of Greater Vancouver (CCC); Vancouver Chinatown Merchants Association (VCMA); S.U.C.C.E.S.S., the Chinese Free Masons and Shon Yee Benevolent Association.

Under the Celebration Grants program, we are seeking both a service grant and a cash grant.

- 1. The service grant would cover up to 50% of the total cost of the city-provided police and engineering services to facilitate for the proposed parade. Dunbar's Salmonberry Days Festival

Where else in Vancouver does a neighbourhood celebrate spring each year by practicing bird calls and plant identification?

For ten years, Dunbar residents have been taking part in a local rite of spring of their own creation, called Salmonberry Days. It's a month-long festival, organized entirely by volunteers, aimed at building awareness of the neighbourhood's ecology. Every aspect of the natural world of Dunbar is subject to scrutiny: geology, native plants, wild birds, mushrooms & fungi, trees, mosses, and even the stars above. All of the events are free of charge, open to anyone who cares to drop in. Along with walks in the outdoors, there are slide-illustrated talks at a local church hall. And along with natural history, the focus is also on neighbourhood history. Local volunteers who have been delving into the neighbourhood's history for the past ten years lead interpretive history walks through the neighbourhood.

This year's Salmonberry Days festival is special. Not only is this the 10th Annual Salmonberry Days festival, we are also celebrating the publication of *The Story of Dunbar: Voices of a Vancouver Neighbourhood*, a book written entirely by Dunbar volunteers, which will be released by Dunbar-based publisher Ronsdale Press this spring.

The budget for Salmonberry Days is about \$2,000, which is the cost of printing the 7,500 programs ("Salmonberry Days Calendars") that are delivered by volunteers to all households. The Dunbar Residents' Association is asking the City to cover half of these printing costs.

The Commercial Dive Community Festival is a celebration of the Grandview-Woodland neighbourhood in all its cultural, ethnic and social vitality. The event is also to support sustainable, pedestrian and family-friendly development and to allow the neighbourhood to take over the street for a day and enjoy a wide variety of music, food, performance and participatory events. This will be its third year, and due to the overwhelming success, the almost-too-many attendees, and constant requests from local businesses, we are moving to three festivals this year. The major one will again be on Father's Day (June 17th), but we are also holding Fests on July 22nd and August 19th - all Sunday afternoons, 12:00 - 6:00.

As well, due to a huge amount of interest from other neighbourhoods, we have set up a mentorship program to asssist other community groups in setting up loal community fests. We have assmebled a group that is meeting simultaneously with an eye to having 5-7 new neighbourhoods participating. The idea is to have these organizers work with us on the Drive Fests this year, learn the process and see the workings of a festival up close, then return to their communities with a toolkit we produce collaboratively to put on their own celebrations in 2008.

We are asking for Celebration Grant support this year specifically to support the flagship event, the Father's Day Drive Fest. This will be the major event and will remain the core focus of our organizing. The money will be used for basic infrastructure: stages, volunteer support, promo and site costs. We do not pay any of our performers, simply due to the huge number of them, and also to retain the community celebration feel of the event. We do however provide them with an extremely well-stocked green room, a pile of gifts and a large post-event party. Our experience is that we have a huge number of performers eager to participate to support the event and community, and for the quality exposure to huge crowds.

The Eastside Culture Crawl is an annual event for the artists and craftspeople of Strathcona, Chinatown, the Downtown Eastside, and Grandview/Woodlands in which they open their studios to the public for a three-day celebration of the arts. It is an opportunity for the public to meet and talk to many diversely talented artists, view their studios, discuss what inspires an artist and how their work is made. This is our eleventh year and the "Crawl" has grown to become a community arts festival with over 300 artists in some 38 buildings. We also partner with and subsidize the participation of various community and multicultural organizations. This year the organizations will be the Russian Community Centre, the Kettle Friendship Society (a mental health organization), the Ukrainian Centre, and Strathcona Community Centre (hosting our information booth). As well, each year we try to provide exhibition space for local artists who are without proper studio spaces. This year we will again be hosting a youth/children's exhibit at the Strathcona Community Centre. The exhibit comes out of workshops we do with kids at the Brittiana and Strathcona Community centres. Our vision is to be as an inclusive event as possible, providing an umbrella for the promotion of the artistic and cultural diversity within our community. The dates this year are November 16, 17 and 18.

This year's budget is estimated at \$97,700 including in-kind. Last year we increased our sponsorship fees, artist participation fees, and enacted cost saving efficiencies. This year we are keeping sponsorship and artist fees stable and instead looking to increase the number of participants in both categories. We are also having a fundraising event at the Yale Hotel. This said, we are asking the City to grant us \$16,000. This will be used against the cost of our invitational brochure and against the salary for the Executive Director and to provide an honorarium for a grant writer. We take seriously the mandate to move toward self-sufficiency yet without compromising the quality of our event or the participation of the community. We greatly appreciate the City's help in this.

In 2001, Evergreen in partnership with the Everett Crowley Park Committee and the Vancouver Park Board held the first large-scale Earth Day event in Everett Crowley Park. With the support of the City of Vancouver, a cultural program was added to the event in 2003 and has become a significant part of the program. Last year's event drew over 2,100 participants, holding Earth Day Vancouver Celebration position as the largest annual Earth Day event in British Columbia.

Evergreen will be working with the Vancouver Park Board, and the Jericho Stewardship Group. Evergreen, the Vancouver Parks Board and the Jericho Stewardship Group (JSG) - a non profit organization dedicated to restoring and enhancing the natural areas of Jericho Beach Park with the goal of making it better for both wildlife and park visitors. Evergreen has been working with JSG to advance stewardship activities in the Jericho Beach Park since 2004. The site of Jericho Beach Park has been over the past 150 years a First Nations settlement, logging camp, golf course and military base. After extensive community lobbying, the site was turned over to the parks board and today is a popular oasis of nature, but one that must be carefully managed to deal with issues created by over a century of use. Almost all invasive plant species of concern in the lower mainland can be found in the park, a legacy of landscaping, industrial use and dumping.

Evergreen is requesting \$6,500 from the City of Vancouver Celebration Grants to strenghten the cultural programming for Vancouver's hallmark Earth Day event. The signature element of the cultural program is the making of "Natural Mandalas". In keeping with changes made to the cultural program last year, the Secret Lantern Society will host a pre-event workshop that will explore the historical roots of mandalas and provide creative ideas for event day activities.

Our primary objective is to celebrate BC Rivers Day in Vancouver, by recalling our heritage as residents of a once rich wilderness where salmon used to thrive. Where once many fish-bearing streams drained to False Creek, and it extended to present day Clark Drive, today it is a crowded residential and light industrial neighbourhood with no natural ecosystems. In face of this change, the Celebration strengthens our cultural links to the salmon and their environment.

Our second objective is to emphasize how the choices we make today influence our future environment. We are "Celebrating the Living" by calling attention to the role people in the urban centres play in the salmon's life cycle. Thus the celebration honours the salmon while inspiring Vancouver residents to protect and rebuild habitat within and beyond the city's borders. The event supports the uniquely powerful ties our west coast culture has to our natural environment

The Celebration itself includes a parade in the SE False Creek vicinity. Following the parade, musicians, First Nations paddlers, dancers, singers and storytellers, stilt walkers and other artists perform, and local foods are available. First Nations participation from the Musqueam, Squamish and Nisga'a nations, Aboriginal Youth Ambassadors, and Urban First Nations is a highlight of each year's events and an honour for organizers and participants alike. The First Nations' historical and cultural ties to the land and with salmon provide a strong addition to this event. Prior to the event, we hold workshops in surrounding communities where participants will be able to make fish-on-sticks to be used in the parade and learn more about the natural history of False Creek.



The Pride in Art Festival (PIAF) is a celebration of the unique creative expression of artists who identify as part of the gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and intersex community (hereafter referred to as Queer). Its mandate is to give public visibility to the creative culture of this community, timed to coincide with Vancouver's Pride Week festivities.

PIAF 2007 will include a two and a half week juried exhibition of visual arts in the Roundhouse Exhibition Hall; a five night showcase of performing arts in the Roundhouse Performance Centre (Aug. 1 and Aug 9-12); an outdoor performance Aug. 12 on the Roundhouse turntable courtyard; and numerous readings, panel discussions, music and other cultural events in the Exhibition Hall over the duration of the Festival. Participating artists range from community-based artists and local celebrities to internationally acclaimed figures in the art world.

Pride celebrations in major world centres are beginning to place increased emphasis on Arts and Culture events, with some cities, like San Francisco and Sydney, now hosting major festivals spread over several weeks and dozens of venues. It is in response to this international trend and to local community demand that Pride in Art is expanding its scope this year. While maintaining our grassroots connections, we are moving from an open, community arts show that asks all artists to pay to participate, to a juried exhibition that will pay professional fees. We are increasing the number of performances from two last year to five, co-producing with several established Vancouver cultural organizations.

The Stanley Park Bike Festival is a community cycling event organized by the Stanley Park Bike Festival Society. It is the highlight of Vancouver's city wide Bike Month Celebration (organized by Better Environmentally Sound Transportation BEST) in June each year. It has been taking place at the Brockton Point area of Stanley Park annually since 2003. Because of the windstorms that have affected Stanley Park this winter, the festival has been moved to Ceperley Park next to Second Beach. The mission of the festival is to bring attention to cycling as the heart of an active community: as a sustainable and environmentally friendly form of transportation, a recreational activity, a form of artistic expression, and a sport. The major change this year is to introduce a participatory group ride from Ceperley Park to Stanley Park called the Park2Park ride. It will replace the Brockton Criterium which was limited to athletes and functioned more as a spectator event.

Cycling has a long history in Vancouver and has many different forms, all of which the festival wants to celebrate. The festival will include entertainment, education and participatory cycling events for children and adults. The strength of the event is that cycling is an activity that a large number of Vancouverites can participate in and relate to. The festival is an opportunity to address cycling as a lifestyle changing activity: from the saddle of a bike one's perception of oneself, the city and the landscape changes.

The City Celebration Grant funding will be earmarked for several key areas of the Budget. \$4000 will go to promotions of the event in the form of Advertising in Bus Shelters, on busses and Skytrains and creating on-line registration on our website. \$3000 will go towards the planning and administrative staffing costs.

The remaining \$3000 will be held for expenses for the cultural programming of the festival.

The cultural programming aims to bring professional groups that incorporate cycling into their work, the expenses would go towards the stage rental and other rentals to support entertainment facilities.

The festival is also a celebration of creativity in the community.

The lead-up to the Moon Festival takes place during the Spring, Summer and Fall with numerous skills-building workshops and work parties in, environmental issues, stewardship (weeding, watering, garbage removal), story collecting, story telling, lanterns, stilt-walking, shadow puppetry, choreography, costume design, fire spinning, creative writing, and event management. 
The 20th annual Vancouver Wooden Boat Festival on Granville Island, August 23-26, 2007

The West End Seniors' Network (WESN) Strawberry Festival is an annual outdoor event held in Barclay Heritage Square and Barclay Manor in June, in time for the local strawberries and summer. As an event predominately organized and run by seniors, the Strawberry festival is a unique space where seniors are able to set the agenda for community interaction. The event is meant to raise community awareness and promote intergenerational, intercultural and social opportunities for neighbourhood residents as we welcome the coming of summer.

The West End Seniors' Network (WESN) has been providing support and services to seniors in the West End since 1979. We offer social and recreational programs, information and referral services, educational opportunities, social support, advocacy and an enhanced sense of community for seniors 55+ living in the West End of Vancouver.

This year the Strawberry Festival is scheduled for June 23, 2007 from 1:00 to 4:00pm. The park will be set up with: an information fair; craft and bake sales; a bocce and croquet field; an entertainment area; a raffle area; and an eating area.

Funds from the Celebration Grant would be used for advertising, entertainment and sound system rental. In past years the festivals' size and atmosphere has depended on donated goods and services. The Celebration Grant that we received in 2006 enabled the festival to sustain a large crowd. Anticipating that a crowd of a similar size will attend in 2007, we have kept the budget relatively the same. In 2006 we had a crowd of approximately 300 people which generated intergenerational interactions, something that is rarely found in the urban context. We hope that this year, if we receive your support, we will be able to improve upon the level of quality that was achieved in 2006.

This is a neighbourhood festival meant to celebrate the diversity of the West End, highlight our seniors, celebrate summer with strawberries and celebrate Barclay Manor and Barclay Heritage Square.
