SUBJECT: 2008 Target Property Tax Increase

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council instruct the Director of Finance on a target property tax increase that includes new or expanded services / programs but excludes impact of outside agencies; and THAT the Director of Finance, in consultation with the Corporate Management Team, report back on options to achieve this target tax increase by identifying the impact on City services / programs.

CITY MANAGER'S COMMENTS

This report is intended to seek Council's direction on a target property tax increase to allow the Director of Finance, in consultation with the Corporate Management Team, to begin formulating budget proposals within Council's taxation target. Giving staff direction on a target property tax increase does not commit Council to that level of tax increase. Council will be asked after the budget consultation process to provide final direction on the property tax increase at which point an evening public meeting will be held.

As noted in this report, to maintain existing City services / programs, a property tax increase of 4.86% will be required. In addition, the Corporate Management Team has identified new or expanded service / program initiatives totaling \$6.3 million, bringing the potential property tax increase to 6.12%. Of the \$6.3 million initiatives, \$2.6 million (or 0.52% property tax increase) relate to non-public safety initiatives while \$3.7 million (or 0.74% property tax increase) relate to public safety initiatives.

It should be noted that the budget position presented in the report does not include any net savings from the 2007 work stoppage. On July 24, 2007, Council adopted a motion "THAT staff report to Council on any labor dispute savings and that any tax savings incurred in this labor dispute be used to reduce property taxes for City taxpayers in 2008." Staff are currently conducting detailed analysis of the overall net savings and will report to Council in early 2008. It is then up to Council to decide how to apply the one-time savings.

Between now and January, staff will be conducting detailed administrative reviews of the budget and develop strategies to achieve Council's taxation target which will include, but are not limited to, revenue increases, corporate efficiency, and service / program adjustments. On February 12, Council will be presented with the Interim Budget Estimates and options to meet the target tax increase, and the public consultation process will commence thereafter. Included in the public consultation package will be the new or expanded service / program initiatives as well as proposed budget adjustments and impact on City services / programs.

COUNCIL POLICY

The Vancouver Charter requires that the Director of Finance presents the estimates of revenues and expenditures to Council no later than April 30 each year and that Council adopt a resolution approving the budget and a rating bylaw establishing general purpose tax rates as soon thereafter as possible.

In approving the annual Operating Budget, Council has also adopted a practice of passing on to taxpayers the tax increases related to requisitions from outside agencies, including the Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District and E-Comm which Council has no control over, rather than providing offsetting reductions in City services / programs to meet Council's target tax increase. As well, Council in the past has passed on tax increases related to major funding initiatives, in particular for significant increase in policing resources.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to seek Council direction on a target property tax increase that maintains existing City services / programs, includes new or expanded services / programs, but excludes impact of outside agencies. Obtaining this direction would allow the Director of Finance, in consultation with the Corporate Management Team, to develop budget strategies within the context of Council's target property tax increase.

BACKGROUND

There are five key reports in the 2008 Operating Budget building process:

- The "Operating Budget Schedule and Public Consultation Options" report provides Council
 with a proposed 2008 budget timeline and options for the 2008 budget consultation
 process.
- The "Target Property Tax Increase" report provides Council with the 2008 opening budget position as well as new or expanded services / programs proposed for 2008, and requests that Council provide direction on a target property tax increase.

- The "Public Consultation Results" report summarizes the results of the 2008 Budget Consultation process.
- The "Interim Estimates" report summarizes the budget strategies developed by the Corporate Management Team within the context of Council's target property tax increase, and seeks Council approval to finalize the estimates, bringing the 2008 Operating Budget into balance.
- The "Final Estimates" report presents the final 2008 revenue and expenditure estimates approved by Council, and is accompanied by a resolution in which Council adopts the estimates for the year.

In addition to the above, departments and Boards also prepare reports that provide Council with new or expanded service / program initiatives for consideration as part of the 2008 Operating Budget process.

On October 18, 2007, Council approved the 2008 Operating Budget timeline and budget consultation options.

DISCUSSION

Council approved a number of new or expanded services / programs and one-time budget adjustments during the 2007 Operating Budget process and throughout 2007 that have financial implications to the 2008 Operating Budget. To maintain existing City services / programs, the 2008 opening budget position (excluding outside agencies) would be equivalent to 4.86% property tax increase. Incorporated herein are outlined as follow:

- Annualized impact of the new or expanded services / programs approved by Council in 2007;
- Increased capital and IT program operating costs, including Park Board's "added basic" request;
- Re-instatement of the one-time budget adjustments utilized to balance the 2007 Operating Budget; and
- General inflationary increases.

During the months of November and December, departments and Boards have presented to Council new or expanded service / program initiatives amounting to \$6.3MM (or 1.26% property tax increase) as follow:

- Non-Public Safety Initiatives \$2.6MM (or 0.52% property tax increase)
 - Vancouver Economic Development Commission: 2008 Business Plan and Budget (RTS#6974)
 - o Planning Department Resource Proposals (RTS#6952)
 - o Office of the Chief Building Official Resource Proposal Green Building Engineer Position (RTS#7042)
 - o Carnegie Centre Cashier Positions and Outreach Program (RTS#6934)
 - o Emergency Management Priorities (RTS#6993)
 - Enhanced Enforcement of Street Usage at Construction Sites Through Additional Staffing and Technological Improvements (RTS#7307)
 - o Real Estate Services Re-organization (RTS#7044)
 - Facilities Design & Management Re-organization (RTS#7053)

- Human Resource Services Staffing Request (RTS#7080)
- Public Safety Initiatives \$3.7MM (or 0.74% property tax increase)
 - Vancouver Police Department Operational Review Phase II (RTS#7054)
 - o Granville Entertainment District (LIMA) (RTS#6951)

Taking into account all new or expanded service / program initiatives, the 2008 potential budget position would be equivalent to 6.12% property tax increase.

Details of the 2008 Opening / Potential Budget Position are outlined in Table #1 below.

It should be noted that the 2008 budget position presented above only reflects the funding required for City services / programs, and does not include any net savings from the 2007 work stoppage.

Further to the Council motion adopted on July 24, 2007 - "BE IT RESOLVED THAT staff report to Council on any labor dispute savings and that any tax savings incurred in this labor dispute be used to reduce property taxes for City taxpayers in 2008." - staff are currently conducting detailed analysis of the overall net savings from the 2007 work stoppage and will report to Council in early 2008. It is then up to Council to decide how to apply the savings.

2008 OPERATING BUDGET CYCLE - NEXT STEPS

Between December and January, the Corporate Management Team will be developing strategies to bring down the anticipated property tax increase from 6.12% to Council's taxation target. This will include, but are not limited to, revenue increases, corporate efficiency, and budget adjustments.

In addition, Finance staff will be conducting detailed administrative reviews of the revenue and expenditure estimates. These reviews encompass discussions with all departments and Boards to ensure that adequate funding is provided to maintain existing services / programs and staffing at approved levels; and that requests for additional funding beyond these targets can be justified on the basis of Council approvals, health and safety concerns, or short-term workload issues.

On February 12, Council will be presented with the 2008 Interim Budget Estimates and budget adjustment options to achieve Council taxation target. The public consultation process will commence thereafter. Included in the public consultation package will be all new or expanded service / program initiatives as well as proposed budget adjustments to meet Council's target tax increase and impact on City services and programs.

On April 1, staff will present the results of the budget consultation process to Council and Council will deliberate over the 2008 Interim Operating Budget and provide direction to staff on the types of budget adjustments and a property tax increase. An evening public meeting will take place on April 9 for Council to hear input on the budget proposals. On April 15, Council will consider the final estimates that reflect the decisions made based on the 2008 Interim Budget Estimates, taking into consideration the public input received on April 9. Council will then be asked to adopt a balanced budget resolution confirming the estimates for 2008.

The 2008 Operating Budget Schedule is outlined in Table #2.
