ADOPTION OF MINUTES

The Minutes of the Standing Committee on City Services and Budgets meeting of April 17, 2008, were adopted.

2008 Civic Childcare Grants - Allocation 1 of 3
 City-wide Child Care Support Services Grant and Administration of City-owned Child Care

April 15, 2008 (VanRIMS No. 05-5000-10)

The Committee heard from four representatives of the agencies recommended for grants, who provided additional information on the services and activities of their organizations.

MOVED by Councillor Louie THAT the Committee recommend to Council

- A. THAT Council approve an Administration of City-owned Childcare Facilities grant of \$110,334 to Vancouver Society of Children's Centres (VSOCC); source of funds: 2008 Civic Childcare Grants Funds, 2008 Operating Budget;
- B. THAT Council approve a City-wide Childcare Support Services grant to Westcoast Child Care Resource Centre totalling \$224,220 to assist with support services as listed in this report; source of funds: 2008 Civic Childcare Grants Funds, 2008 Operating Budget.

2. Report Back on the Review of Childcare Design Guidelines April 17, 2008 (VanRIMS No. 11-2200-20)

Staff from Social Planning reviewed the report and responded to questions.

The Committee heard from 3 speakers, 2 generally in favour of the report recommendations, and one generally opposed (*brief distributed - on file in the City Clerk's Office*).

MOVED by Councillor Capri
THAT the Committee recommend to Council

- A. THAT Council endorse the Childcare Design Guidelines with respect to new construction.
- B. THAT where retro-fit is being proposed for childcare that does not meet the Childcare Design Guidelines, Council direct staff to harmonize the City of Vancouver guidelines with the Provincial guidelines.
- C. THAT Council direct staff to develop and distribute design information for use by designers, architects and Childcare service providers to increase awareness of effective practice in Childcare design at a maximum cost of \$15,000; source of funds to be the existing Social Planning Operating Budget.

Affordable Rental Stock in the West End

MOVED by Councillor Tim Stevenson
THAT the Committee recommend to Council

WHEREAS:

- 1. 82% of West End Residents rent;
- 2. there is a 0.2% vacancy rate in the West End;
- 3. the West End rental housing stock is diminishing;
- 4. affordable rental stock in the West End is diminishing.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The City of Vancouver undertake a complete review and reworking of the 1989 zoning regulations and other pertinent regulations governing the residential and commercial districts in the West End in consultation with community groups and organizations, property owners, interested West Enders and City staff.
- 2. Put a moratorium on all requests for rezoning, whether pending or future, until a review and reworking of the current guidelines are completed and new guidelines are adopted and in place.
- 3. Ensure that all building maintenance standards are enforced throughout the West End so that all buildings remain in good order and habitable and are simply not being held with the view to redevelop at some time in the near or distant future.

Pending an area-wide planning program for the West End:

- a. All enquiries proposing to develop buildings over 60 feet in height in the West End to compensate for the preservation of a West End heritage building be advised that such projects may only be favourably considered if the heritage building to be preserved would qualify as an 'A" on the City's Heritage registry; and
- b. All enquiries proposing to develop buildings that will result in the loss of rental housing in the West End zones governed by the rental rate of change regulations be advised that such projects may only be favourably considered if the rental housing is replaced unit for unit
