Before Council were reports from the Collector of Taxes dated June 12, 2008, with respect to Local Improvement Courts of Revision Numbers 625, 627, 626 and 628. Also before Council were Late Reports for Court 625/007 (amended objection count), Court 627/012 (clerical error), Court 626/016 (amended objection count) and amendments to Appendix 1 (amended recommendation) and Appendix 2 (amended recommendation) and Court 626/004, 007, 012, and 013 (amendments with no effect on status) and Appendix 1 for Court 626/011, Appendix 2 for Court 626/014, Appendix 3 for Court 626/023, 028, 031, and 034, and Appendix 1 for Court 628/002, all dated June 12, 2008.

### COURT NO. 625 - PROJECTS BY PETITION

(Including Late Report and Appendix)

The Collector of Taxes certified that the projects in the report dated June 12, 2008, have been requested by the majority of the assessed owners by means of a sufficiently signed petition.

In the late report dated June 12, 2008, the Collector of Taxes advised that the General Manager of Engineering Services recommended reballot on Item #007, as a new owner is now opposed, and there is no longer the required 2/3 majority.

### COURT NO. 627 - PROJECTS BY PETITION

(Including Late Report and Appendix)

The Collector of Taxes certified that the projects in the report dated June 12, 2008, have been requested by the majority of the assessed owners by means of a sufficiently signed petition.

In Appendix 1, the Collector of Taxes noted a revised Item #003 due to a clerical oversight. Owners on the south side of the street are entitled to "double fronting relief" which was not

initially provided. It is recommended there be a reduction in the owners' share and a proportional increase in the City's share of the cost of this project."

In the late report dated June 12, 2008, the Collector of Taxes advised of a typographical error in Item #012, the spelling of "Kaslo".

### COURT NO. 626 - PROJECTS BY INITIATIVE

(Including Late Report and Appendix)

In the report from the Collector of Taxes dated June 12, 2008, it was noted Items #003, 008, 013, 015, 023, 028, 031 and 034 were objected to by at least more than one half (1/2) the owners of the properties who represent at least more than one half (1/2) the total value of all the properties on the project.

The Collector of Taxes noted Appendix 1 Item #011 has sufficient number of owners objecting but insufficient value to defeat and recommended this project be defeated, Appendix 2 Item #014 does not appear to be a clear majority either in number of owners or assessed value in favour or opposed to this project and recommended this project be defeated, and in Appendix 3 recommended Items #023, 028, 031 and 034 proceed on special grounds.

In the Late Report dated June 12, 2008, the Collector of Taxes advised of an amended objection count in Project 016, with no effect on status of the project, and also requested the Court make clerical amendments to recommendations in Appendix 1(this project not proceed) and Appendix 2 (this project not proceed). The Collector of Taxes also advised of amended eligible owner counts in Projects 004, 007, 012, and 013. These amendments have no effect on the status of the projects.

# COURT NO. 628 - PROJECTS BY INITIATIVE

(Including Late Report)

In the report from the Collector of Taxes dated June 12, 2008, it was noted Item #002, was objected to by at least more than one half (1/2) the owners of the properties who represented at least more than one half (1/2) the total value of all the properties on the project. In Appendix 1, the Collector of Taxes recommended Item #002 proceed on special grounds.

Staff advised of the need for standardized sidewalks, and confirmed the Park Board arborist advised the ornamental Japanese Maple could be relocated to provide a clear path for the sidewalk. Staff also advised the sidewalk would provide children safer access to the nearby school.

- E. THAT Council approve the formal Special Grounds Resolution for a sidewalk on 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue, North Side, from Oak Street to Tisdall Street except 50 feet fronting Lot A of D Block 1008 DL 526 Plan 11918 (6019 Tisdall Street), Court #626, Item #34, attached as Appendix 4 of the Administrative Report dated May 21, 2008, entitled "Local Improvement Subsequent Procedure June 12, 2008".

THAT Council approve the formal Special Grounds Resolution for a sidewalk on Manitoba Street, East Side, from King Edward Avenue to 26<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Court #628, Item #2, attached as Appendix 5 of the Administrative Report dated May 21, 2008, entitled "Local Improvement Subsequent Procedure - June 12, 2008".
