Update on Human Resources Strategy, Labour/Management Review and Employee Survey

Penny Ballem, City Manager, provided a presentation on the proposed Human Resources Strategy for the City of Vancouver, a review of labour/management relations including proposed recommendations and actions, and the results of the recent City-wide employee survey. Dr. Ballem, along with representatives of the Hay Group, responded to questions from Council regarding the survey results.

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1. 2011 Operating Budget: Proposed Budget and Public Consultation Update November 15, 2010

Patrice Impey, General Manager, Financial Services, provided an overview of the proposed 2011 Operating Budget and an update on the public consultation process. Ms. Impey, along with Paul Whitney, City Librarian, Peter Judd, General Manager, Engineering Services, John McKearney, Fire Chief, David McLellan, General Manager, Community Services, and Malcolm Bromley, General Manager, Parks and Recreation, and Jim Chu, Police Chief, responded to questions from Council regarding the proposed budget.

 - deposits in a savings institution, or non-equity or membership shares of a credit union
 - pooled investment funds under Section 16 of the Municipal Finance Authority Act
 - any of the investments permitted for the Municipal Finance Authority under Section 16(3) of the Municipal Finance Authority Act, including pooled investment portfolios under the Financial Administration Act.
- D. THAT, for the period January 8, 2011 to January 7, 2012, Council authorize the Director of Finance to establish a short-term borrowing facility to assist in managing the City's cash flow with the maximum outstanding amount not to exceed \$60 million;

FURTHER THAT Council instruct the Director of Legal Services to prepare a Borrowing Pending Collection of Real Property Taxes By-law for enactment by Council.

**8. 2011 Land Assessment Averaging Program: Notice to BC Assessment Authority
November 17, 2010**

- A. THAT, pursuant to Section 374.4 (4b) of the Vancouver Charter, the City Clerk be instructed to notify the BC Assessment Authority, before January 1, 2011, of Vancouver City Council's intent to consider the adoption of land assessment averaging for the purpose of property tax calculations for 2011.

It should be noted that this notice of intent is revocable should Council, at a later date, decide not to proceed with this mechanism.

- B. THAT the Director of Finance be instructed to provide the required two weeks' notice to the public in advance of Council's consideration of the use of land assessment averaging and, before March 31, 2011, report on the projected taxation impacts of the land assessment averaging program based on the assessed values provided by the BC Assessment Authority in the 2011 Completed Roll.
- C. THAT the Area Assessor for Vancouver be invited to address Council on the assessment trends in the 2011 Completed Roll.

**9. Downtown Eastside Capital Budget Funding Allocation - Oppenheimer Park
Improvements
November 15, 2010**

THAT subject to a Park Board contribution of \$30,000 for commemorative elements in Oppenheimer Park, Council approve an allocation of up to \$25,000 to install glass with a fritted "Legacy Sakura" in the Oppenheimer Field House, as a commemoration to the cherry trees planted in the park by Japanese-Canadians to mark the centennial of the first generation of Japanese who came to settle in Canada;

FURTHER THAT Council approve an allocation of \$150,000 to contribute to the installation of corner bulges adjacent to the newly improved Oppenheimer Park (on Dunlevy and Jackson), in order to improve the pedestrian environment.

Source of funds is the 2008 Capital Budget for Downtown Eastside Revitalization (Strathcona/Oppenheimer Revitalization).

- B. THAT Council approve a grant of \$35,000 to Family Services of Greater Vancouver - Street Youth Job Action for supplementary cleaning of sidewalks, lanes and public spaces in downtown Vancouver, with funding from the 2011 Street Cleaning Operating Budget.
- C. THAT Council approve a grant of \$25,000 to The Kettle Friendship Society - SEED Employment Program for supplementary cleaning of sidewalks, lanes and public spaces in Vancouver's Commercial Drive area, with funding from the 2011 Street Cleaning Operating Budget.

 - i) THAT, for properties that receive garbage cart collection service, the 2011 annual garbage collection fees be established as follows:

 - ii) THAT, for properties that receive garbage can collection service, the 2011 annual garbage collection fees be established at \$63 for each collection point and \$38 for each garbage can allocated or purchased.
 - iii) THAT the 2011 annual recycling collection fees for each dwelling unit be established at \$31, except where one or more common collection points, at locations agreed to by the City Engineer are serviced, the rate be established at \$23 for each dwelling unit and the rate for each collection point remain at \$8.

- iv) THAT the 2011 annual yard trimmings/food scraps collection fees be established at \$32/cart fixed fee plus a cart volume fee as follows:

- v) THAT the 2011 annual fee for storage of recycling carts on City streets and lanes be established at \$ 70/cart.

- B. THAT the 2011 garbage disposal fee at the Vancouver Landfill and Vancouver South Transfer Station be established at \$97/tonne with a minimum fee of \$20 during peak hours (Monday to Friday 10:00 am to 2:00 pm) and \$10 during non-peak hours (all operating hours excluding Monday to Friday 10:00 am to 2:00 pm).
- C. THAT the 2011 yard trimmings material disposal fee be established at \$63/tonne with a minimum fee of \$6 at the Vancouver Landfill and Vancouver South Transfer Station.
- D. THAT a fee of \$20/unit be established for deposit of mattresses for recycling or disposal at the Vancouver Landfill and Vancouver South Transfer Station.
- E. THAT the Director of Legal Services be instructed to bring forward for enactment the revisions to the Solid Waste By-law substantially as referred to in these Recommendations and as substantially set out in Appendix A of the Administrative Report dated November 16, 2010, entitled "Solid Waste Utility (SWU) Fees and By-law Changes".

**12. 2011 Annual Review of Water Rates under the Water Works By-law
November 23, 2010**

- A. THAT Council approve an increase of 12.0%, as detailed in this report and as set out in Appendix A of the Administrative Report dated November 23, 2010, entitled "2011 Annual Review of Water Rates under the Water Works By-law", to the following fees under the Water Works By-law:
- Flat rate annual consumption fees for single family dwelling units (increase from \$417 to \$467) (Schedule "B"),
 - Other flat rate water service charges for single family dwelling unit with suite and each strata title duplex (Schedule "B"),
 - Charges for metered water service (Schedule "D"),
 - Charges for temporary water service during construction (Schedule "F").

- B. THAT fees for other services included in the Water Works By-law be increased by 3.2% as follows:
- Flat rate water connection fees for single family and two family dwellings (Schedule "A"),
 - Flat rate water connection fees for properties other than single family and two family dwellings (Schedule "A") and service pipe removal fees (Schedule "A.1"),
 - Meter service charge (Schedule "E"), flat service charges for unmetered fire service pipes (Schedule "C"), and fees for installation of water meters (Schedule "G").
- C. THAT the Director of Legal Services be instructed to bring forward for enactment amendments to the Water Works By-law substantially as set out in Appendix A of the Administrative Report dated November 23, 2010, entitled "2011 Annual Review of Water Rates under the Water Works By-law" to give effect to A and B above.
