Vancouver City Council set a goal to be the Greenest City in the World by 2020.


This is achievable if we meaningfully empower local citizens and organizations.







The Opportunity



- The Greenest City Action Plan (GCAP) is a single galvanizing plan with a clear mandate and path forward to achieve this goal.
- Only some of the action necessary is within City jurisdiction.
- Achieving the rest requires partnership with outside organizations and the community.

Objectives

- Create a funding pool to enable Vancouver residents to work together to help achieve the Greenest City Goals
- Leverage City funding as a catalyst for not-for-profit, private and corporate contributions
- Lead the way for other cities by creating a replicable model for funding partnerships








Recommendation

- Partner with the Vancouver Foundation to deliver The Greenest City Fund
- Provide \$1M in funding, from the Parking Reserve Fund, to the Vancouver Foundation
- This will be matched by the Vancouver Foundation for a total fund of \$2M to be spent down over four years







Rationale: Why the Vancouver Foundation?


- Trusted and professional granting partner (manages \$750M endowment)
- Builds on previous partnership successes between Vancouver Foundation and City
- Matching funding: 1:1+ leverage
- Additional opportunities for Vancouver Foundation to fundraise
- Leverages existing networks, promotion avenues, grants programs, administration and accountability structures







Rationale: Build Upon Past CoV Programs







Rationale: Serve a Community Need

- There is a current lack of funding for Vancouver community based initiatives that support GCAP
- Current Funders:
 - Vancity (<\$50K)
 - TD Bank (<\$5K)
 - Vancouver Foundation (\$5K-\$90K)
- Challenges:
 - Funding priorities not always aligned with Greenest City goals or are limited in scope
 - Focus is on charitable organizations
 - Require matched funding
 - Existing funding pools not Vancouver specific, therefore competing with projects throughout BC/Canada



Greenest City Fund Program Overview

- \$2M dollar fund distributed over four years
- \$500K per year (\$250K from each partner)
- Administered by the Vancouver Foundation
- Leverages Vancouver Foundation's existing programs
- Focused on achieving the Greenest City Action Plan Goals and Targets

Project Focus Areas

Greenest City Goal Areas Including:

- Local Food: Increasing local food supply
- Climate & Green Buildings: Reducing energy use
- Green Transportation: Enabling active transportation
- Zero Waste: Increasing composting, re-use and recycling
- Access to Nature: Restoring habitat
- Clean Water: Conserving drinking water
- Green Economy: Supporting social enterprises& Greening businesses
- Lighter Footprint: Fostering behaviour change in support of all Greenest City goals



Generation Green

- Goal: Empower youth to deliver projects that support the Greenest City Goals
- \$100K per year
- \$1K-\$10K grants (~20 grants)
- Sample Projects: Planting orchards, bicycle delivery co-ops, school gardens and recycling projects, tap water campaigns

Greenest City Neighbourhood Small Grants

- Goal: Enable individuals to deliver neighbourhood based projects that support Greenest City Goals
- \$70K per year
- Grants up to \$1K (~100 grants)
- Sample Projects: Tool sharing programs, shared composting, walking and cycling to school programs

Greenest City Community Grants

- Goal: Enable charitable organizations to undertake strategic and meaningful projects in support of Greenest City goals
- \$330K per year
- \$5K \$50K grants (~15 grants)
- Sample Projects: Climate change workshops, community gardens, food hubs, neighbourhood scale composting, cycling courses




Greenest City Fund Granting Process


