Re: Proposed Rezoning of 5761 and 5775 St. George Street from RS-1 Single Family to CD-1 Multifamily Rowhouse Use

We wish to confirm that the South Hill (Fraser Street) Business Association (Fraser Street BIA) Board of Directors is familiar with this rezoning proposal. Although the proposed project is not within the BIA boundaries, the Board unanimously supports it and the construction of rowhouses in the neighbourhood.

We understand that this project is one of the first examples of rowhousing to be proposed in the Sunset Neighbourhood of which our BIA is a part. This project provides an affordable alternative for families in a neighbourhood that currently consists of predominately single family homes. We know the project is consistent with the Sunset Community Vision, which contemplates rowhouses as an alternative housing form in a few select areas.

According to the recent census, east Vancouver neighbourhoods have seen a decline in population. As it is our role as a BIA to try and increase the number of shoppers to our businesses, one of our goals is to increase our local population base. We agree with the City's "neighbourhood demonstration project"- policy, designed to allow for new housing forms to be constructed within predominately single family neighbourhoods to provide additional housing options for area residents and allow more families to move into the district.
