

PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES

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2. TEXT AMENDMENT: Artist Studios in Industrial Areas

An application by the General Manager of Planning and Development Services was considered as follows:

Summary: To amend the Zoning and Development By-law to expand opportunities for artist studios by increasing the number of industrial zones in which "work-only" artist studios are allowed and to ease the approval process by allowing artist studios as outright uses.

The General Manager of Planning and Development Services recommended approval.

Staff Opening Comments

Thor Kuhlmann, Planner, Cultural Services, reviewed the application, and along with Jacquie Gijssen, Senior Cultural Planner, Cultural Services, and Paul Nowlan, Planner, City-Wide and Regional Planning, Planning and Development Services, responded to questions.

- B. THAT, subject to enactment of the amendments to the Zoning and Development By-law, the Parking By-law be amended to provide parking regulations for "work-only" artist studios, generally as set out in Appendix B of the Policy

Report dated January 7, 2013, entitled "Proposed Amendments to the Zoning and Development By-law to Support Artist Studios in Industrial Areas";

FURTHER THAT the Director of Legal Services be instructed to bring forward the amendments to the Parking By-law at the time of enactment of the amendments to the Zoning and Development By-law.

3. REZONING: 1600 Beach Avenue and 1651 Harwood Street

An application by Gwyn Vose, IBI/HB Architects, was considered as follows:

Summary: To rezone 1600 Beach Avenue and 1651 Harwood Street from RM-5A (Multiple Residential) District to CD-1 (Comprehensive Development) District. The proposal on both sites is for infill residential development of secured market rental units. On the Beach Avenue site, the proposal includes 118 residential units located within a four-storey and a nine-storey building, a one-storey amenity building and enclosure of the bases of the existing towers. On the Harwood Street site, the proposal includes 15 residential units located within two- and three-storey buildings. The proposed increase in allowable floor area is 8 276.9 m² (89,095 sq. ft.) and 1 013.1 m² (10,906 sq. ft.), respectively.

The General Manager of Planning and Development Services recommended approval subject to the conditions contained in the summary and recommendation of the public hearing agenda.

Staff Comments
