

Site and Context



Policy Context

- Rezoning Policy for Chinatown South (2011)
 - policies to consider rezonings of up to 150 feet.
- Chinatown HA-1A Design Guidelines (2011)
- Chinatown Neighbourhood Plan and Economic Revitalization Strategy (July 2012)
- Downtown Eastside Housing Plan (2005)
 - Revitalization without displacement
- Downtown Eastside (DTES) Local Area Plan
 - Interim Rezoning Policy, allows redevelopments in Chinatown South to proceed



- New Retail Space unaffordable
- Design and fit into Chinatown



Public Benefits

22 Units of Affordable Housing

- 20 studios and 2 - one bedroom units

CAC	\$ 1,331,793
S.U.C.C.E.S.S. Contribution	\$ 2,400,000
Other funding	\$ 220,000
Total cost of 22 units	\$ 3,951,793



Public Benefits

Rent levels for the 22 units as follows:

- 11 units where tenant contribution is no more than shelter component (\$375 a month)
 - Applicant can apply for SAFER program
- 6 units to rent at housing income levels for Vancouver (approximately \$850 a month)
- 5 units at full market rents (estimated to be \$900-\$950 a month).



Public Benefits

Process to acquire the units:

- Housing Agreement
- Option to Purchase in favour of City to purchase an air space parcel containing these 22 units
- S.U.C.C.E.S.S. makes equity contribution of \$2.4 Million at the time City exercises the Option to Purchase
- CAC of \$1.3 Million is treated as a refundable grant over time by S.U.C.C.E.S.S.
