#### **FEEDBACK & CONCERNS**

While most of the feedback was positive, we did hear concerns about 3 key areas:

#### 1. PROCESS


- More time was needed to absorb information and discuss;
- Ensuring alignment with other city processes (i.e. DTES and Grandview-Woodland Area Plans, Transportation 2040);

#### 2. TRAFFIC

- Concerns were raised about impacts to parallel streets;
- A strong interest in traffic calming on Prior/Venables

#### 3. NEFC

- Understanding impacts on adjacent landowners; and
- Potential impact for early delivery of Creekside Park.











#### **ARTERIAL NETWORK**







## Since July 2012 the following measures have been implemented:


- Relaxed parking restrictions on north side of Prior Street (September 2012);




