By proposing to designate the Murray Hotel at 1119 Hornby Street a 'protected heritage property', Vancouver's current administrators are making a complete laughing-stock, both of themselves and of this city. However, it seems pretty obvious that a 'deal' has already been struck with those parties interested in the development of the entire site from 1177 Hornby Street to Helmcken Street, and that requests for public input represent - as is so often the case - a purely cosmetic exercise with no intended impact on the ultimate outcome.
