SUBJECT:	Rental Rate Increases - Civic Theatres 2014-2015

## RECOMMENDATION

- A. THAT Council approve the recommended Rental Rate increase as outlined in the Schedule of Rental Rates for Civic Theatres (Appendix "A"), effective September 1, 2014.
- B. THAT recommended rates for the Queen Elizabeth Plaza fee structure be adjusted to include Technical/set up rates (Appendix "A"), effective September 1, 2014.

## REPORT SUMMARY

This report seeks Council approval of the proposed fee increases for Civic Theatres as outlined in the Schedule of Rental Rates contained in Appendix "A" for the uses of the Civic Theatres during the period of September 1, 2014 to August 31, 2015. The report also seeks approval for recommended rate adjustments for the Queen Elizabeth Plaza fee structures to include Technical/set up rates for the period September 1, 2014 to August 31, 2015.

## COUNCIL AUTHORITY/PREVIOUS DECISIONS

Council approves the Schedule of Rental Rates for Civic Theatres on an annual basis. Council approves any rate adjustments as recommended by staff.

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### CITY MANAGER'S/GENERAL MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The General Manager of Community Services recommends acceptance of the new fee schedule.

## REPORT

#### Background/Context

#### RENTAL RATES

Rental rates are reviewed each year prior to the preparation of the annual operating budget. Adjustments are made effective September 1<sup>st</sup> of each year in alignment with the traditional performing arts season. The rental rates are reviewed primarily in relation to operational cost increases.

We are proposing a marginal increase of 1.25% for the 2014-2015 season. A summary schedule of some of the key rental rates for prior years and the proposed 2014-2015 rates are shown below for comparison:

VCT uses two types of rental rates for our indoor performance spaces: commercial and flat rates. Although the flat rate is used in most cases, including all granted uses of the theatres, the commercial rate is applied to pop, rock and comedy events at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre and Orpheum only, and reflects a percentage of the final ticket sales for the event with a published minimum and maximum.

For the 2014-2015 season, we are proposing a 1.25% increase to the minimum and maximum rates, and no increase in the percentage rate calculation:

All booking enquiries received for the 2014-2015 season have been informed of a potential rental increase pending Council approval. A letter has been sent to all Resident Companies and current Licensees informing them of the potential rental increase. Once Council has approved the rental rate increases, a follow-up letter will be sent to all Resident Companies and current Licensees to confirm the increase.

### QUEEN ELIZABETH PLAZA FEE STRUCTURE

For the Queen Elizabeth Plaza, we are not proposing a rate increase for the 2014-2015 season. However we are proposing to establish a fee which will allow a lower rate for days just committed to set up versus the full event fee. This is a more equitable way to structure fees and make them more affordable especially for events which take more time for set up and this approach also aligns with the Technical day fee we utilize for our indoor venues.

## Strategic Analysis

#### RENTAL RATES

Rental rates are reviewed annually in relation to the specific economic factors, such as general inflation, cost and labour increases, the City's budget objectives, and in relation to the local, regional and national market (see rental rates review in Appendix "B"). We are proposing for the existing Civic Theatres rental spaces, that the 2014-15 increase be equal to 1.25% for the Queen Elizabeth Theatre, Orpheum, Orpheum Annex and Vancouver Playhouse. Further review of the Civic Theatres rate structures will be carried out in 2014 once the new Director is in place. Any recommended changes will be brought forward to Council under a separate report.

The data included in the rental rates review (Appendix "B") is gathered through an annual survey of published rates at comparable facilities in order to identify a "per seat" cost for comparison. Our proposed flat rates for the Queen Elizabeth Theatre (\$4.55 per seat) are on par with the average per seat of \$4.55. The Orpheum (\$4.70 per seat) is slightly above the average, but well below comparable venues in similar markets (Toronto's Roy Thompson Hall (\$6.27), Massey Hall (\$5.27), Sony Centre (\$5.12). The Playhouse per seat cost is higher on a per seat cost based on the capacity (668as there are few comparables in the 600-900 seating range. For the Orpheum Annex, the proposed rate of \$5.36 per seat is competitive with comparable venues, falling below the average of \$5.88-6.56 per seat.

Commercial rates for the Queen Elizabeth Theatre and Orpheum reflect a greater range of cost per seat (\$2.96-\$5.73 at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre and \$3.07-\$5.93 at the Orpheum). The published minimum and maximum Commercial rates were established some years ago in response to a more volatile market for Commercial events and were intended to allow us to earn additional revenue when a show sells well, and ensure a guaranteed minimum if a show sells poorly.

### QUEEN ELIZABETH PLAZA FEE STRUCTURE

For the first few years following the renovations, when the Queen Elizabeth Plaza was available for short-term rental from the community, we have not seen a substantial uptake in usage beyond a small number of anchor tenants. Feedback from the community is that although the plaza continues to be a desirable space for short-term rentals, the costs associated with set up days are a barrier. In response, this report proposes maintaining the short-term rental rate ("event rate") and adding a "technical/set up rate" to make days committed to set up more affordable. Our expectation is that this will generate an increase in Plaza utilization.

## **RENTAL RATES**

The proposed rental rate adjustment reflects an increase in gross revenue of approximately \$34,000 for 2014 based on current bookings from September 1 to December 31. The approved rates will be used when building the 2015 operating budget.

## QUEEN ELIZABETH PLAZA FEE STRUCTURE

Adjusting the Plaza rate structure to include both an "event rate" and a "technical/set up rate" will establish the Plaza as a more affordable option for short-term outdoor events. Our expectation is that this will increase utilization and revenue.

## CONCLUSION

This report proposes an increase in Theatre rental rates of 1.25% over the 2013-2014 Rental rates, effective September 1, 2014 to August 31, 2015, which will apply to the Queen Elizabeth Theatre, Orpheum, Vancouver Playhouse and Orpheum Annex. This report proposes adjustments to the Queen Elizabeth Plaza fee structure to include Technical/set up day rates, which will be effective September 1, 2014 to August 31, 2015.
