

# End Street Homelessness by 2015



### Problem: Setback in March 2014 Street Homeless Count



#### Drivers of Homelessness

- Youth aging out of foster care
- Family violence and breakdown
- Lack of adequate treatment for mental health and addictions
- Prisons and hospitals discharging to street
- Poverty
- Lowest cost housing very old and in disrepair (SROs)



Moving homeless off street requires:

- 1. Strategies to prevent more people becoming homeless
- 2. Adequate pace of incremental supportive housing coming on stream new or interim
- 3. Sustained affordability and adequate maintenance of SROs for very low income residents
- 4. Adequate low barrier shelter space to fill housing gap




# Setback on 2014 Homeless Count: What happened?

#### Moving homeless off street requires:

- Strategies to prevent more people becoming homeless
  - 2013/14: no clear strategies in place
- Adequate pace of incremental supportive housing coming on stream new or interim
  - 2013/14: 14 sites significantly behind in bringing units onstream
  - 2013/14: Existing interim housing closed (Chez Soi, Dunsmuir) and some replacement units delayed (Biltmore, E Hastings)
- Sustained affordability and adequate maintenance of SROs for very low income residents
  - 2013/14 continued erosion of affordability for lowest income residents
  - 2013/14 increased vacancy rate of existing SROs
- Adequate low barrier shelter space to fill the housing gap
  - 2013/14 shortfall of winter response shelters



# Progress to March 2014: Housing the homeless in the 14 sites

- 9 out of 14 sites occupied by March 2014
- 888 units total
  - 392 (44%) previously homeless
  - 496 (56%) previously housed (SRO or at risk of losing housing)
    - SRO tenants CoV and BC Housing work to backfill SRO rooms with street and sheltered homeless



#### Rents increasing in Private SROs




**DOWNTOWN CORE PRIVATE SRO RENTS 2005-2013**

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- 4. Adequate low barrier shelter space to fill the housing gap



Key Strategies and Assumptions:

- 1. 2014/15 Strategies to prevent more people becoming homeless:
  - Mayors Task Force on Mental Health:
    - MOH 120 Day Plan:
      - Investment in new housing and homeless services for youth
      - Investment in ACT team for SRO tenants with severe mental health and addictions
  - COV \$40k investment in community based resources for RTA work in DTES re: evictions
  - COV, BCH Intensify the outreach to those at risk



- 2. Adequate pace of incremental supportive housing coming on stream permanent or interim
  - 1134 Burrard opened May 2014
  - 3 additional sites due to come on stream before March 2015 homeless count:
    - 111 Princess, 2465 Fraser on target
    - 220 Princess at risk need to work to confirm tenanted by March 1 2015
  - Taylor Manor: to open Fall 2014
  - E. Hastings Ramada: continue on as interim housing
  - 395 Kingsway (Biltmore): fully tenanted by September 2014
  - Bosman Hotel potential to continue as interim negotiations underway with VCHA, STH, COV, BCH to keep open; landlord willing for 3 year lease


Total Units for 2015: 641 - of these 247 at risk to not be available VANCOUVER

#### Key Strategies and Assumptions:

- 3. Sustained affordability and adequate maintenance of SROs for very low income residents:
  - Target buildings at risk for evictions through strategic work with CCAP, Carnegie outreach, VPD
  - COV: strategic but aggressive approach to SRO standards of maintenance work improvements with no evictions
  - Obtain Provincial Rent Supplements to ensure no evictions or vacancies in SROs due to renovations and/or make scattered sites available for those displaced
    - Request Province provide rent supps for 100 rooms (~\$250k per year)



#### New SRO Investors (600 + rooms renovated)




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#### Key Strategies and Assumptions:

- 3. Sustained affordability and adequate maintenance of SROs for very low income residents:
  - Use business license to leverage results:
    - Business license hearings for owners doing work without permit
    - Conditional Business license: Require non-profit management for owners not maintaining or properly managing their buildings
  - Expedite \$5k/door grants for upgrade of SRO rooms with cooking facilities and private bathrooms
    - Approved \$175k grant to Lookout Emergency Aid Society for upgrade of 38 rooms at 376 Powell Street (Sakura So)
    - More enquiries being reviewed



#### Private SRO (4,000 Units) - Long Term Owners



Currently over 500 rooms in vacant or closed buildings



Key Strategies and Assumptions:

- 4. Adequate low barrier shelter space to fill housing gap
  - Minimum 160 Winter Shelter Beds (low barrier) partnership with BC Housing
    - Adjust number up depending on progress of permanent and interim supportive housing
    - Ensure shelter users housed at closure
