Strategies to Prevent Homelessness



Enhancing Mental Health & Addictions Supports - Mayor's Task Force

- ✓ New Assertive Outreach Team for DTES residents discharged from hospital funded through MOH
- ✓ Increased Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) Teams for SRO tenants with severe mental health and addictions – funded by Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH)
- ✓ Intensive Case Mgt and Housing for Inner City Youth Mental Health funded by MOH

Preventing Evictions

√ \$40k for SRO tenant assistance through Residential Tenancy Branch arbitration process – approved in DTES Plan

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Maintaining Affordability & Maintenance of SROs

Using City Tools to Leverage Results

- ✓ Continue to monitor & enforce health & safety by-laws (Coord. Enforcement Working Group prioritizing buildings - <u>saferental.ca</u>) – <u>current CoV budget</u>
- ✓ Require non-profit management as condition of business license for poorly maintained & managed SROs in Vancouver Charter/DTES Plan
- ✓ Revoke business license for owners continuing to do work without permit & only re-issue license if suitable non-profit operator in place in Vancouver Charter/DTES Plan

Implementing SRO Strategy

√ \$5K per door for SRO upgrades of 400 rooms - approved DTES Plan

Adequate Low Barrier Temporary Winter Shelters



Require minimum of 160 Temporary Low- Barrier Winter Shelter beds

✓ Partnership with BC Housing - COV funding share in operating budget since 2009



Adequate Pace & Number of Incremental Supportive Housing – New or Interim

Expedite tenanting of supportive Housing before 2015

- ✓ Interim housing: Maintain supply
 - 100 rooms at Bosman Hotel to remain open request for BCH funding
- ✓ Permanent Housing: Expedite remaining supportive housing units
 - Broadway Fraser 103 Units occupancy Aug 2014 BCH funded
 - 111 Princess 139 units occupancy Aug 2014 BCH funded
 - Taylor Manor 56 units occupancy Fall 2014 approved by Council 2012
 - 220 Princess 147 units delayed until Feb 2014 BCH funded

Additional Capacity

√ 100 new rent subsidies – request for BCH funding
