





## Current State - Background




### **Current State - Locations**








- Federal Government: designates controlled substances (Criminal Code) and sets out rules for medical marijuana (Health Canada)
- Police and Crown Counsel: determine enforcement of the Criminal Code
- City of Vancouver: regulates land uses and businesses (e.g. locations, hours, noise, nuisance prevention, design)




- Health benefits include relief of: – chronic pain
  - antiretroviral therapy-related nausea
     multiple sclerosis
  - -symptoms of bipolar disorder and ADHD
- Harm reduction for drug users:

   substitute for more harmful drugs
   reduce opioid mortality
   relief from withdrawal symptoms




- Youth exposure & early addiction
- Health risks
  - impairment of memory (in adolescents)
  - reduced psychomotor performance
  - schizophrenia
  - cancer of mouth, jaw, tongue and lung (in younger people)
  - fetotoxicity
  - leukemia in children
- Safety
  - Criminality concerns (e.g. store robberies and potential ties to organized crime)
  - Construction work without permit (i.e. not meeting Building Code)
- Degraded character/reputation of neighbourhoods due to clusters of stores
- Inequity for other businesses




- Liaison with key partners:



- Regulate marijuana-related businesses to reduce risks and impacts in the following areas:
  - Youth exposure
  - Serious crime (organized crime, property crime)
  - Health and safety risks
  - Nuisance
  - Aesthetics
  - Impact on local economy (clusters, unkempt storefronts)
  - Loss of job-producing industrial sites
- Treat all businesses consistently and fairly
- Utilize regulatory framework composed of permits and licences



Protect Youth	Disallow minors from entering or working in the Marijuana-Related Use, and post signage to this effect				
	Prohibit displays of wares or advertising to minors				
Prevent Crime	Require a police information check for the applicant and for all staff annually				
	Limit of one Business Licence per person, and disallow corporate ownership				
	Prohibit transfers of licences to another party				
	Require that Business Licence applications must be made by the property owner or lease holder				
	Disallow sharing of space with any other land use (e.g. cheque cashing, massage, liquor, ATM)				
Optimize Security and Safety	Require use of a monitored security and fire alarm system, including video surveillance				
	Require removal or storage of valuables in a safe when business is closed				
	Require a security plan







# Stage One

- City Council enacts regulations
- Everyone seeking a Marijuana-Related Uses retail store licence is required to apply for a Development Permit within 30 days of date of enactment
- Only applications with proof of lease in a location allowable under zoning will be considered (commercial retail zoning districts only and 300 m distancing from schools and community centres)



# Stage Two

• Applications clearing stage one will undergo an evaluative process with points based criteria:

Evaluation Criteria for Each Marijuana-Related Use	Points
Is the business considered a problem premises by Vancouver Police Department?	-4
Does the premises contain work conducted without a Building Permit?	-3
Has the premise been the subject of more than one complainant from members of the community?	-2
Is the enterprise operated for profit (i.e. not a non-profit society)?	-1

- Points are assigned to each Marijuana-Related Use and evaluated to limit concentrations
- For applications that are equal in points, a lottery will be used to move successful applicants to next stage.



# Stage Three

- All successful applications from stage two will be required to ensure compliance with all Building Bylaw and Licensing Bylaw regulations
  - Work to be undertaken to ensure alignment with these bylaws if not compliant, enforcement action will be taken
- Development Permit (DP) needed
  - City notifies community (standard practice)
  - Time-limited (1 year; consistent with other conditional uses) DP and Building Permit, if required, is issued
- City inspects to ensure regulations are met
- Applicant pays licensing fee (\$30,000) and City issues Business Licence



- Rapid growth in marijuana-related uses and ensuing concerns
- City has a number of tools/mechanisms to enforce bylaws
- Proposed regulatory framework is based on best practice – research of other jurisdictions and input from key partners
- City's proposed approach strikes a balance
- Implementation of regulations will be timely and consistent
