SUBJECT: Increase to Cultural Award Amounts: Mayor's Arts Awards and City of

Vancouver Book Award

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council approve an increase to the individual amounts of the cash awards for the Mayor's Arts Awards and City of Vancouver Book Award to \$3,000 each, as outlined in **Table 2**, for a total of \$13,000 in 2015—and then on-going—to bring the artist awards distributed at the annual gala from \$53,000 to \$66,000 per year. Source of funds to be the 2015 Cultural Grants Budget.

REPORT SUMMARY

This report presents a brief history of the awards and rationale for an increase to support the award amounts.

COUNCIL AUTHORITY/PREVIOUS DECISIONS

In February 2008 (RTS 6755) Council approved an annual allocation of \$50,000 for Mayor's Arts Awards cash awards to Honourees and Emerging artists. The awards were for \$2,500 each in which,

- a) the honourees of The Mayor's Arts Awards in ten categorieswere chosen by a jury of peers in recognition of significant contribution in their fields as well as to Vancouver's position as a Creative City; and
- b) ten emerging artists were chosen by the honourees of The Mayor's Arts Awards.

Section 204 of the Vancouver Charter enables City Council to provide for the expenditure of money for the recognition of "guests or persons of importance whom the Council deems worthy thereof".

Approval of grant recommendations requires eight affirmative votes.

REPORT

Background/Context

Mayor's Arts Awards

Arts Awards are part of a comprehensive strategy for communities to recognize the contribution that artists make to civic life and to acknowledge and celebrate the many people who work in support of the cultural community as volunteers, patrons and audience members. In Vancouver, this strategy is nested in the City's Culture Plan key strategic direction of Fostering Cultural Leadership by celebrating artistic excellence, recognizing outstanding leadership, and expanding support to emerging, innovative and artistic practices.

Since 2008, after a review of the sustainability and impact of the precursor to the Mayor's Arts Awards—the 2004 and 2005 Vancouver Arts Awards—the City of Vancouver has produced the annual Mayor's Arts Awards through a service agreement with the Alliance for Arts and Culture which facilitates the selection process of 15 award juries in the fields of lifetime achievement, performing, literary, visual, community-engaged, culinary and support for the arts. Nominations are received from the general public by the Alliance for Arts and Culture and are in turn reviewed by a jury comprised of past Honourees from their respective disciplines and categories. Juries are instructed to recognize peers who have made a significant contribution in their discipline, achieving or contributing to artistic excellence, and for showing leadership and support for Vancouver's cultural community over the course of their careers. Each chosen Honouree is then invited to select an emerging Vancouver artist within their same discipline or category who represents the promise of the next generation. Both the Honouree and emerging artist receive a cash award. A full list of previous recipients is attached in Appendix A.

Special non-cash awards are also given for contributions through volunteerism, philanthropy, business support and arts board member of the year. Furthermore, Civic Cultural Award Honourees (City of Vancouver Book Award winner, Vancouver's Poet Laureate and Artist Live-Work Studio recipients) are celebrated at the free, 90-minute public gala event which welcomes approximately 350 community members each year.

In 2012, some enhancements to the awards took place:

- a) A Lifetime Achievement category was added in recognition of a strong community desire for its inclusion; and
- b) The long-standing City of Vancouver Book Award (established 1989) was integrated into the awards to celebrate the shortlisted authors and announce the winner who was presented with a cash prize during the gala—rather than during a previous stand-alone event in Council Chambers. Since 1989, the annual City of Vancouver Book Award has been recognizing authors of excellence of any genre who contribute to the appreciation and understanding of Vancouver's history, unique character, or the achievements of its residents. City of Vancouver staff have continued to facilitate the peer jury process for the City of Vancouver Book Award.

Strategic Analysis

Neither the Mayor's Arts Awards nor the City of Vancouver Book Award has increased their cash prize amount since inception (2008 and 1989 respectively). Furthermore, the prize amounts are not currently standardized: Honourees receive \$2,500, the Book Award Winner receives \$2,000 and the Lifetime Achievement Recipient receives \$1,000. An increase to the base level amount to \$3,000 for all of the named cash prizes (Honourees, Emerging Artists, Lifetime Achievement and Book Award Winner) will standardize the award amounts, better reflect the artists' contribution to the cultural community and better support the city's cultural directions in celebrating artistic excellence, recognizing outstanding leadership and expanding support to emerging, innovative and artistic practices.

It should be noted that the categories of Volunteerism, Philanthropy, Business Support and Arts Board Member of the Year will remain non-cash awards. The City of Vancouver will continue to provide plaques to those recipients.

The Mayor's Arts Awards are meeting its goals to recognize the contribution that artists make to civic life and to acknowledge and celebrate the many people who work in support of the cultural community as volunteers, patrons and audience members. Since the Mayor's Arts Awards were launched in 2008, the community impact of the awards has been significant and continues to grow.

Financial

The increase of \$13,000 to the award amounts will be allocated from the 2015 Cultural Grants Budget.

^{*} Since its inception in 1989, the City of Vancouver Book Award has been \$2,000. The award has been funded by the City's Publishing Reserve, which was established in 1977 as a permanent legacy for Vancouver writers and publishers. In future, \$2,000 will be drawn from the endowment and \$1,000 will be drawn from the Cultural Grants budget.

Approval of this recommendation leaves an unallocated balance of \$205,130 in the 2015 Cultural Grants budget. The balance of allocations will be forthcoming in a report on the balance of cultural grants allocations and changes to the cultural grants program framework (November) and a new Artists Fund (December).
