SUBJECT: 2018 Engineering Fees

RECOMMENDATION

- A. THAT Council approve a 2.0% increase in the Engineering Services Department permit and application fees as set out in Appendix A to this report, with the exception of the fees referenced in Recommendations B, C and D, to take effect on January 1, 2018.
- B. THAT Council increase the Street Utilities By-law Fees: Plan review and administration fee (alignment that is less than 20 metres), Plan review and administration fee (alignment that is greater than 20 metres), Additional per metre fee for the proposed alignment, Inspection fee per street block per day, and Pavement degradation costs by 1.6% to be consistent with Municipal Access Agreements.
- C. THAT Council approve an increase in fees for the Dissemination of Traffic Information (preparation of legal letters) to \$450.00 per letter to align the fee structure with other jurisdictions in the region and better recover the costs for preparing the letters as outlined in this report.
- D. THAT Council approve an increase in Waste Containers License Fees to \$615.00 for containers greater than 1 cubic yard and \$205.00 for containers less than 1 cubic yard to better recover City costs as outlined in this report.
- E. THAT the Director of Legal Services be instructed to modify all Waste Container License Agreements (CLA's) between the City and solid waste removal companies to increase fees as noted in this report, to be effective January 1, 2018.

F. THAT the Director of Legal Services be instructed to prepare by-laws to amend the Encroachment By-law No. 4243, Street and Traffic By-law No. 2849, Crossing By-law No. 4644, Street Distribution of Publications By-law No. 9350, Street Utilities By-law No. 10361, Street Vending By-law 10868 and Granville Mall By-law No. 9978, all generally in accordance with Appendix A.

REPORT SUMMARY

Fees are traditionally adjusted on an annual basis to reflect cost increases. For 2018 the proposed increase is 2.0% with the exception of those listed in Recommendations B, C and D.

COUNCIL AUTHORITY/PREVIOUS DECISIONS

Permit fees are reviewed as part of the annual budget process to comply with Council policy that fees recover the full cost of providing services or are equivalent to competitive charges where the fee is of a market nature.

CITY MANAGER'S/GENERAL MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The General Manager of Engineering Services RECOMMENDS approval of the above recommendations.

REPORT

Background/Context

The Engineering Services Department generates revenues from several permits, under the authority of the Street and Traffic By-law No. 2849, Encroachment By-law No. 4243, Crossing By-law No. 4644, Street Distribution of Publications By-law No. 9350, Street Utilities By-law No. 10361, Street Vending By-law 10868 and Granville Mall By-law No. 9978.

Street Distribution of Publications By-law No. 9350, Street Utilities By-law No. 10361 and Street Vending By-law 10868 Fees Street, Traffic By-law No. 2849, Encroachment By-law No. 4243, and Crossing By-law No. 4644 Fees were last adjusted effective January 2017. Granville Mall By-law 9978 was last adjusted effective January 2013.

Strategic Analysis

Fees are set at a level which reflects the City's costs structure and are generally inflated annually. The recommendation for the fee increase considers the current inflation rate based on the 12-month average percentage change in Vancouver Consumer Price Index (CPI), prior year inflation, and forecasts for the following year.

Fees are adjusted on an annual basis to keep them consistent with City costs. As of September 2017, the increase in the 12-month average Consumer Price Index (CPI) for

Metro Vancouver was 2.0%. Certain non-wage items, such as electricity and gasoline, have increased in the range of 3.7% to 9.2% over the past year. The Conference Board of Canada forecasted that the CPI for Metro Vancouver would increase by 2.3% for 2018 and 2.4% for 2019. Based on this forecast, staff recommend a 2% increase for 2018 fees.

This 2.0% increase has been applied to all of the fees listed in Appendix A, with the exception of those noted below:

1. Fee increases for Dissemination of Traffic Information (preparation of legal letters):

Developing a traffic information letter involves reviewing the traffic signal maintenance logs, verifying the signal timing at the time and date of incident, providing a detailed description and duration of all signal displays, obtaining information from other departments, and answering any specific questions included in the request. The letters are typically reviewed by a professional engineer and prepared by engineering staff. The department also administers the filing, tracking, and updating of the required database(s) and processing of the fees.

The time required to prepare the letter varies depending on the complexity of the intersection layout and signal phasing. In addition, the requestor may contact the City for clarification on the signal operations specific to the incident which requires additional time beyond the original content.

Based on the internal fee review and comparative level of effort in other jurisdictions, staff recommend an increase in the fee from \$118.20 to \$450.00. This will align fee structure with other jurisdictions in the region and will more appropriately recover the department costs for preparing the letters.

2. Fee increases for Waste Containers Stored on Public Property:

The City enters into Container License Agreement's (CLA's) with waste hauling companies that place commercial garbage, recycling and organics containers on City streets and lanes. Under the CLA, companies are regulated and charged a licence fee which is set to recover City costs of managing the container program, work that is overseen by a team of inspectors, a support clerk and a supervisor.

In addition to costs to administer the CLA program, costs can also be attributed to managing problems associated with commercial containers. In many laneways throughout the City, commercial containers stored on City property attract illegal dumping of waste, graffiti on containers, vandalism and litter. Business Improvement Areas throughout the City have expressed concerns around the number of containers in their areas coupled with the problems that generally occur in and around the containers. There is a direct correlation of container locations to increased maintenance requirements and associated costs to the City for litter and abandoned waste collection, mechanical flushing and sweeping, and micro-cleaning activities under the City's Street Cleaning Grant Program.

The City costs for litter and abandoned waste collection, and mechanical flushing and sweeping totalled to \$6M in 2016 and are projected to be \$8.6M for 2017. Recipients of the City's Street Cleaning Grants (\$1M in 2017) report spending 40-60% of their time cleaning in laneways with approximately 40-75% of that time focused around commercial containers. Key challenges identified by both City crews and Grant recipients include large volumes of garbage, illegal dumping, feces, urine, needles and access limitations due to loitering. While it is difficult to breakdown the portion directly attributable to managing problems associated with commercial containers it is clear that the level of effort devoted to maintaining these areas is increasing.

The proposed fee increase is structured to:

- cover an inflationary increase;
- Encourage a reduction in the overall number of commercial containers on public property;
- Support the costs of Sanitation Operations activities (flushing, sweeping, litter and abandoned item collection) in areas with commercial containers, and
- Support the City's Street Cleaning Grant Program, which provides funding to local non-profit organizations to perform micro-cleaning (litter/needle collection) in various areas of the City, including lanes with commercial containers.

In order to address the areas outlined above, staff recommend increasing licensing fees (representing an estimated additional revenue of \$600,000 in 2018) as follows:

- For containers less than 1 cubic yard \$91.50 to \$205
- For containers over 1 cubic yard from \$276.39 to \$615.00

Commercial waste haulers were provided written notification of the pending fee increase on September 26, 2017.

Implications/Related Issues/Risk (if applicable)

Financial

The impact of the fees excluding pavement restoration and pavement degradation costs are expected to generate an additional amount of revenue in 2018 of approximately \$0.8M of which \$0.6M is a result of the change to the waste container license agreements. The 1.6% inflationary increase to pavement restoration and pavement degradation costs generates an approximate \$0.2M increase based on current volumes that will be recognized when the work is performed and the costs are incurred.

GST, as applicable, will be added to taxable fees.

Legal

Legal Services will update the relevant by-laws to reflect the change in fees.

CONCLUSION

It is recommended that the fee increases indicated in Appendix A of this report be applied to be effective January 1, 2018. It is also recommended that Legal Services bring forward the appropriate by-law amendments as indicated in Appendix B of this report for consideration by Council.
