2019 Schedule



- Implementation:
 - January 1, 2019: Toilets, geoexchange systems, rainwater harvesting
 - June 3, 2019: Building water treatment systems
- Annual operating permits:

(rainwater harvesting & building water treatment systems)

- No fee
- 2019: Fee review
- 2020: Cost-recovery basis (estimate: \$250)
 (elevator comparison: \$246 to \$527)





- Implementation:
 - January 1, 2020: Cooling towers
 - July 1, 2020: Decorative fountains
- Annual operating permits: (cooling towers & decorative fountains)
 - No fee
 - 2019-2020: Ongoing consultation
