Drinking Water Conservation By-law  
to enhance enforceability**

At a Regular Council meeting on April 18, 2018, Council resolved to enact the the Drinking Water Conservation By-law, and to make it enforceable by both ticket information and by-law notice. The Drinking Water Conservation By-law is being amended to ensure better enforceability. Enactment of the attached By-law will further implement Council's resolution of April 18, 2018.

**BY-LAW NO.**

**A By-law to amend the Drinking Water Conservation By-law  
to enhance enforceability**

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VANCOUVER, in public meeting, enacts as follows:

1. Council amends the Drinking Water Conservation By-law No. 12086, by striking Parts 7, 8, 9 and 10 of the By-law and substituting the following:

**"PART 7"  
STAGE 1  
WATER USE RESTRICTIONS**

**Compliance with stage 1**

7.1 No person shall fail to comply with the water use restrictions in this Part 7 from May 1<sup>st</sup> to October 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Stage 1 restrictions**

7.2 When stage 1 water use restrictions are in effect, no person shall:

- (a) water a lawn, including any cultivated boulevards adjacent to the premises:
  - (i) at residential premises with even-numbered addresses, except on Wednesdays and Saturdays between 4:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.,
  - (ii) at residential premises with odd-numbered addresses, except on Thursdays and Sundays between 4:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.,
  - (iii) at non-residential premises with even-numbered addresses, except on Mondays between 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. and on Fridays between 4:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., or
  - (iv) at non-residential premises with odd-numbered addresses, except on Tuesdays between 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. and on Fridays between 4:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.;
- (b) water trees, shrubs, flowers and plants using a sprinkler:
  - (i) at residential premises, except between 4:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., or
  - (ii) at non-residential premises, except between 1:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.; or
- (c) water a soil-based or sand-based playing field, except between 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m.

### **Exemptions from stage 1 restrictions**

7.3 Notwithstanding section 7.2, a person may water:

- (a) a lawn or playing field in compliance with a water use permit issued under this by-law;
- (b) a playing field or golf course in accordance with a water use plan approved under this by-law;
- (c) a vegetable garden or edible plants; or
- (d) concrete for curing purposes.

## **PART 8 STAGE 2 WATER USE RESTRICTIONS**

### **Compliance with stage 2**

8.1 No person shall fail to comply with the water use restrictions in this Part 8, when stage 2 water use restrictions are in effect.

### **Stage 2 restrictions**

8.2 When stage 2 water use restrictions are in effect, no person shall:

- (a) water a lawn, including any cultivated boulevards adjacent to the premises:
  - (i) at residential premises with even-numbered addresses, except on Wednesdays between 4:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.,
  - (ii) at residential premises with odd-numbered addresses, except on Thursdays between 4:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.,
  - (iii) at non-residential premises with even-numbered addresses, except on Mondays between 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., or
  - (iv) at non-residential premises with odd-numbered addresses, except on Tuesdays between 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.;
- (b) water trees, shrubs, flowers and plants using a sprinkler:
  - (i) at residential premises, except between 4:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., or
  - (ii) at non-residential premises, except between 1:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.;

- (c) wash an impermeable outdoor surface except:
  - (i) for health or safety reasons,
  - (ii) to prepare a surface for painting, sealing, or similar treatment, or
  - (iii) if the washing is carried out by a commercial cleaning operation for aesthetic purposes;
- (d) fill, refill or add water to an aesthetic water feature;
- (e) water a golf course fairway on more than one day in any seven day period;
- (f) water a soil-based playing field on more than four days in any seven day period, and only between 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. on those days;
- (g) water a sand-based playing field, except between 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m.; or
- (h) operate a water play park, unless it is equipped with user-activated switches.

#### **Exemptions from stage 2 restrictions**

8.3 Notwithstanding section 8:2, a person may water:

- (a) a lawn or playing field in compliance with a water use permit issued under this by-law;
- (b) a playing field or golf course in accordance with a water use plan approved under this by-law;
- (c) a vegetable garden or edible plants; or
- (d) concrete for curing purposes.

### **PART 9 STAGE 3 WATER USE RESTRICTIONS**

#### **Compliance with stage 3**

9.1 No person shall fail to comply with the water use restrictions in this Part 9, when stage 3 water use restrictions are in effect.

#### **Stage 3 restrictions**

9.2 When stage 3 water use restrictions are in effect, no person shall:

- (a) water a lawn, including any cultivated boulevards adjacent to the premises;

- (b) water trees, shrubs, flowers or plants with a sprinkler or a soaker hose;
- (c) wash an impermeable outdoor surface except:
  - (i) for health or safety reasons, or
  - (ii) if the washing is carried out by a commercial cleaning operation to prepare a surface for painting, sealing, or similar treatment;
- (d) fill, refill or add water to a an aesthetic water feature, hot tub or swimming pool;
- (e) wash a motor vehicle or boat by hand, except to clean windows, lights, mirrors, licence plates or boat engines for safety reasons;
- (f) water a golf course fairway;
- (g) operate a commercial vehicle wash facility;
- (h) water a soil-based playing field on more than three days in any seven day period, and may only water between 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. on those days;
- (i) water a sand-based playing field on more than five days in any seven day period, and may only water between 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. on those days; or
- (j) operate a water play park, unless it is equipped with user-activated switches.

### **Exemptions from stage 3 restrictions**

9.3 Notwithstanding section 9.2, a person may:

- (a) water:
  - (i) a lawn in accordance with a water use permit issued before stage 3 water use restrictions came into effect,
  - (ii) a playing field in compliance with a water use permit issued under this by-law,
  - (iii) a playing field or golf course in accordance with a water use plan approved under this by-law,
  - (iv) a vegetable garden or edible plants, or
  - (v) concrete for curing purposes;
- (b) operate a non-residential hot tub or swimming pool pursuant to a permit issued by a health authority; or
- (c) operate a commercial vehicle wash facility that:
  - (i) in the case of a facility that installed an automatic vehicle wash system before November 1, 2017, is operating on a basic wash and rinse cycle only,

- (ii) in the case of a facility that installed an automatic vehicle wash system after November 1, 2017, is operating using a water recycling system that achieves a minimum 60% water recovery rate over the full cycle wash, and
- (iii) in the case of a hand wash and self-service facility, is operating using high pressure wands or brushes that achieve a maximum flow rate of 11.4 litres per minute.

**PART 10  
STAGE 4  
WATER USE RESTRICTIONS**

**Compliance with stage 4**

10.1 No person shall fail to comply with the water use restrictions in this Part 10, when stage 4 water use restrictions are in effect.

**Stage 4 restrictions**

10.2 When stage 4 water use restrictions are in effect, no person shall:

- (a) water a lawn, including any cultivated boulevards adjacent to the premises;
- (b) water trees, shrubs, flowers, plants, or vegetable gardens;
- (c) wash an impermeable outdoor surface, except when ordered to do so for health or safety reasons by a regulatory authority;
- (d) fill, refill or add water to an aesthetic water feature, hot tub or swimming pool;
- (e) wash a motor vehicle or boat, except to clean windows, lights, mirrors, licence plates or boat engines for safety reasons;
- (f) operate a commercial vehicle wash facility;
- (g) water a golf course;
- (h) water a soil-based or sand-based playing field; or
- (i) operate a water play park."

2. A decision by a court that any part of this by-law is illegal, void, or unenforceable severs that part from this by-law, and is not to affect the balance of this by-law.

**A By-law to amend the

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VANCOUVER, in public meeting, enacts as follows:

1. This By-law amends the indicated provisions of By-law Notice Enforcement By-law No. 10201.

2. Council strikes sections 7.2 and 7.3, including the headings, and replaces them as follows:

**"Appointment of Screening Officers I**

7.2 Council hereby designates all persons employed by the City as a Customer Services Representative – Parking Enforcement, and Engineering Assistant II – Water Conservation as persons that may be appointed as a Screening Officer I, and hereby appoints them as a Screening Officer I.

**Appointment of Screening Officers II**

7.3 Council hereby designates all persons employed by the City as an Operations Supervisor – Parking Enforcement, Superintendent II – Parking Enforcement, all Supervisors and Managers of Revenue Services, and Engineering Assistant IV's – Water Conservation as persons that may be appointed as a Screening Officer II, and hereby appoints them as a Screening Officer II."

3. Council strikes section 8, and replaces it as follows:

"8. Council appoints:

- (a) the Collector of Taxes, including all Managers and Supervisors in Revenue Services as by-law enforcement officers for the purposes of enforcing section 5.2 of the Vacancy Tax By-law;
- (b) parking enforcement officers and animal control officers as by-law enforcement officers for the purposes of enforcing Parts 6, 7 and 8 of the Drinking Water Conservation By-law; and
- (c) parking enforcement officers and police officers for the purposes of enforcing all other by-law contraventions set out in Schedule A of this By-law."

4. A decision by a court that any part of this By-law is illegal, void, or unenforceable severs that part from this By-law, and is not to affect the balance of this By-law.

5. This By-law is to come into force and take effect upon enactment.
