Good afternoon,

I don't think I will be able to attend this evening's public hearing about the St. Paul's Hospital site, but am concerned with why the city would in any way entertain putting a hospital on a site, where if there were a large earthquake, the facility, that would be greatly needed in that instance, would have a high potential of being inaccessible and inoperative. I understand that there are reports that the site has a high likely hood for liquefaction and flooding which is concerning for a hospital.

Another concern is that the site seems quite close to Vancouver General Hospital and it would make more sense to have to location of the city's hospitals spread out as opposed to be in such close proximity. It also seems like it might have a traffic bottleneck making it difficult to access from the west side of the city. Of most importance is having a hospital that will function if there is any large emergency, and is generally accessible to the public which it is supposed to serve.

Mayor Stewart and Councillors:

As President of the Animal Defense Anti-Vivisection Society of BC (since 1927) I wish to make our Society's position known on the proposed Rezoning application for the new St Paul's Hospital, and the elements that make up the development as per the Revised Summary and Recommendation dated October 22, 2019.

The mixed-use development calls for space to be dedicated to research. We ask that the City of Vancouver register a restrictive covenant on the property preventing research involving animals or other living beings, excluding humans, to be performed on the property. We further ask that the restrictive covenant also prevent St Paul's Hospital and/or it's Foundation, or any other entity associated with the hospital be prevented from funding or participating in any experiments or non-human research outside of the new hospital development.

While the merits of animal research can be discussed at length, I understand St Paul's Hospital researchers, including UBC, are likely to have different points of view than ourselves. There are many progressive universities, companies and countries moving away from the use of animal models. The University of Windsor just had their formal opening of the Canadian Centre for Alternatives to Animal Methods (CCAAM) where they use 3D printing of organs and organs on a chip to develop treatments and test drugs. Can we here in Vancouver not be as progressive as UWindsor? One of their very high donation supporters is the family that developed Jamieson vitamins, all without using animals in research, nor animal products. Success can be had without harm.

By preventing animal research at the new St Paul's Hospital, via the restrictive covenant route, Vancouver can maintain it's position of a Green city, without the biohazards and pollutants from incinerating toxic animal remains after they have been through the research system.

Tourism will benefit from a positive city image, rather than the negative press that will be attracted if unrestricted research towers are allowed to be built, and the public outcry increases beyond the few hundred letters you have received thus far.

And as far as Providence Health trying to say that there are higher levels of oversight that will ensure the greatest level of care and treatment of animals, I can assure you none exist. Canada is the only G7 nation without a government funded body to oversee the processes of our research laboratories. It is shameful that what they try to pass off as oversight is actually the fox watching over the hen house.

In 2008 our group began discussions with UBC about the number of animals they used in research. In 2010 we were successful in having them release their animals in research numbers annually.

As an example, in 2011 UBC used over 227,000 animals in their research labs – these included cats, wild songbirds, pigs, cattle, endangered sea turtles, rodents, fish, primates, sadly the list goes on.

In their last reporting year of 2017 their number was reduced to just in excess of 167,000 animals used. Our work with the university, and the changing public perception about using animals in research is paying off – the numbers are declining.

We can have research without animals, and through dialogue and investing in alternatives we can all make a difference in the health of humans and in the lives of animals, and meet Vancouver's Greenest City targets. The ADAV Society would like to offer to meet with City of Vancouver Mayor and Council and St Paul's Hospital planners as often as necessary to provide information on alternatives, help shape the restrictive covenant, and ensure that Vancouver and the new hospital are poised to do Vancouver proud in the coming years.
