SUBJECT:	2020 Cultural Grants (First Quarter Instalments, Advance Grants, Arts Capacity)

RECOMMENDATION

- A. THAT Council approve first quarter advance grant instalments totaling \$987,100 to 5 major institutions in Appendix A of this report in the amounts set out beside their names in the "2020 Advance Grant" column of Appendix A First Quarterly Instalments Major Institutions; source of funds is the 2020 Cultural Grants Operating Budget.
- B. THAT Council approve advance grants totaling \$1,104,020 to 58 cultural operating organizations in Appendix A of this report in the amounts set out beside their names in the "2020 Advance Grant" column of Appendix A Advance Grants Operating Organizations; source of funds is the 2020 Cultural Grants Operating Budget.
- C. THAT Council approve advance grants totaling \$461,000 to 63 annual assistance organizations in Appendix A of this report in the amounts set out beside their names in the "2020 Advance Grants" column of Appendix A Advance Grants Annual Assistance Organizations; source of funds is the 2020 Cultural Grants Operating Budget.
- D. THAT Council approve a Capacity grant of \$10,000 to Vantage Point Strategies Society (Vantage Point) to support the costs and delivery of leadership development workshops for the City's cultural grantees; in Appendix A of this report in the amount set out in the "2020 Advance Grants" column Appendix A Capacity Grant – Vantage Point; source of funds is the 2020 Cultural Grants Operating Budget.

- E. THAT, pursuant to Section 206(1)(j) of the *Vancouver Charter*, Council deems any organization listed in Appendix A of this report which is not otherwise a registered charity with Canada Revenue Agency, to be contributing to the culture of the city.
- F. THAT the General Manager of Arts, Culture and Community Services (GM of ACCS) is authorized to negotiate and execute agreements to disburse the grants described in this report on the terms and conditions generally set out below, and on such other terms and conditions as are satisfactory to the GM of ACCS and the City Solicitor.
- G. THAT no legal rights or obligations are created by the approval of Recommendations A to C above unless and until the applicable grant agreement or letter of agreement is approved by the City in accordance with Recommendation F above and executed and delivered by both the grant recipient and GM of ACCS (or their designate).

Approval of grant recommendations requires two-thirds affirmative votes of all Council members under section 206 (1) of the *Vancouver Charter*.

REPORT SUMMARY

This report recommends a total of \$2,562,120 grants to 127 cultural organizations in support of key goals and directions of Culture|Shift: Arts and Culture at the Centre of City Building, and Collaboration and Capacity.

COUNCIL AUTHORITY/PREVIOUS DECISIONS

On January 29, 2019, Council approved a total of 131 grants totalling \$2,841,970 to 131 cultural organizations: First Quarter Instalments, Advance Grants, Arts Capacity, and Music Fund (RTS 12920).

On September 10, 2019 council adopted Vancouver's 10-year culture plan *Culture*/*Shift: Blanketing the City in Arts and Culture* including Making Space for Arts and Culture, and the Vancouver Music Strategy.

CITY MANAGER'S/GENERAL MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The City Manager recommends approval of the foregoing.

REPORT

Background/Context

The City of Vancouver invests over \$12 million in grants to local arts and culture nonprofit organizations through various grant streams including operating, annual assistance,

project, community arts, theatre rental grants, arts capacity and the independent artists fund. This is in addition to cultural capital investments and public art commissions each year.

The grant recommendations in this report will support numerous arts and cultural organizations who contribute to the cultural vibrancy and diversity of the city on an ongoing basis. They will assist many organizations in delivering a wide range of creative programs and services to a broad and diverse public and will further contribute valuable resources required to deliver them and plan for organizational sustainability. These established organizations help tell the stories that shape the city and the history of the unceded territories of the Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh Nations that Vancouver sits upon.

Strategic Analysis

First Quarterly Instalments and Advance Grants

These grants support the Culture|Shift goal of Arts at the Centre of City Building by investing in the ongoing programs, services and operations of smaller groups through to Major Institutions. The City has allocated advance grants since 1998 as a way to accommodate the operating cash flow needs of cultural grantees at a time when other public sector funding is not commonly awarded (e.g. Canadian Heritage, Canada Council for the Arts, the BC Arts Council). If a grantee meets the below criteria they are advanced 40% of their core operating grant awarded from the City in the previous year:

- The organization has received ongoing assistance from Cultural Services (operating or annual assistance) for the past three consecutive years;
- The organization's core grant in the previous year was \$10,000 or more; and
- An initial review of the organization's application indicates no concerns around the applicant's finances, sustainability or impact.

Advance grants and first instalments are awarded in advance of the Assessment Committee meetings where final recommendations are made and brought forward to Council in early April at which time the balance of the core grant is approved.

Based on an initial review of the applications received at the December 4, 2019 deadline from the applicants, staff recommend 2020 first quarter instalments to 5 major institutions for a total of \$987,100, and advance grants to 58 operating organizations for a total of \$1,104,020, and 63 annual assistance organizations for a total of \$461,000.

A complete list of first quarter instalments, and advance grants to operating and annual assistance is provided in Appendix A.

Arts Capacity Grant

This grant supports the key goal of Collaboration and Capacity to strengthen sector resilience through expanding collaborative capacity programs to increase and share knowledge and resources across the cultural sector.

Vantage Point, a local non-profit society, has partnered with the City to support non-profit cultural leadership development (board, volunteers, and staff) through various learning opportunities. Each year hundreds of individuals from cultural grantee organizations attend their workshops including Board Fundamentals, Engaging Volunteers, Fund Development, Societies

Act, Board Diversity and Inclusion, Executive Director 101, and more. The workshops create opportunities to learn from one another and build relationships with other not-for-profit leaders, while also getting expert support with governance, leadership, planning and people engagement from experienced volunteer facilitators and consultants.

Based on the demand for the workshops and impact on the individuals, staff recommend \$10,000 to Vantage Point to continue to provide these workshops to the cultural sector at no cost to the organization, in 2020.

Support for other learning opportunities are also available to meet a variety of learning needs and methods. *Cultural Learning and Sharing* is a new program stream delivered by Cultural Services which supports a wide array of learning methods and is intended to support diverse contributors and leaders in ways that build knowledge and resources and strengthen communities of practice. A pilot partnership with the Banff Centre was initiated in late 2019 to support the participation of four Vancouver-based cultural leaders in their *Cultural Leadership Program*. Further, a pilot partnership with Chapel Sound Arts will provide a series of interpersonal and entrepreneurial skill building workshops geared to younger cultural workers and artists working in non-institutional structures.

Financial

This report recommends a total of \$2,562,120 through various grant streams to 127 cultural organizations, summarized in Table 1. The 2020 Cultural Grants budget summarized in Table 2.
