I am against this development. Many of my neighbours and I opposed this type of zoning at the early stages of the Grandview-Woodland Plan discussions. 6 storeys is too high. I know that council rejected 4 storeys several years ago. 2 or 3 would be better (if development is going to occur). My back yard will be in the shade for most of the winter with 6 storeys. (I can't understand why developers show a shadow map for an equinox.) The concern to this rezoning is whether parking spots are included in the purchase price on a unit. If not, purchasers could opt out of buying a parking spot and, as parking is restricted on East Broadway, would end up parking on East 8<sup>th</sup>. I should not have to buy an annual parking pass to park in front of my own home. This is not the west end. I feel that this development (and subsequent developments) will greatly alter the neighbourhood.
