
THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VANCOUVER, in public meeting, enacts as follows:

- 3. This By-law is to come into force and take effect June 11, 2020.

TEMPORARY PATIO AND STREET VENDING FEES BY-LAW NO. ____

BY-LAW NO	
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A By-law regarding the fees to be applied to the temporary use and occupancy of streets for patios and street vending

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VANCOUVER, in public meeting, enacts as follows:

SECTION 1 INTERPRETATION

Name of By-law

1.1 The name of this By-law, for citation, is the "Temporary Patio and Street Vending Fees By-law".

Definitions

1.2 In this By-law:

"temporary street vending permit" means permits issued by the General Manager, Engineering Services for the temporary use and occupancy of streets expiring on October 31, 2020;

"temporary private patio permit" means permits issued by the Director of Planning for and for the temporary use and occupancy of private property expiring on October 31, 2020, for the purposes of constructing a patio; and

"parent by-law" means the Street Vending By-law, the Zoning and Development Fee By-law, and the Building By-law.

Conflicts with parent and other by-laws

- 1.3 To the extent that this By-law:
 - (a) authorizes a relaxation or amendment of a parent by-law, such relaxation or amendment applies despite anything to the contrary in the parent by-law:
 - (b) conflicts with a parent by-law or another by-law, this By-law governs.

Compliance with parent by-laws

- 1.4 Except to the extent that this By-law expressly authorizes a relaxation or amendment of a parent by-law or otherwise provides:
 - (a) a person must comply with the applicable parent by-law; and
 - (b) all provisions of the applicable parent by-law including those provisions with

regard to powers of entry, inspection, enforcement, violations, offences, noncompliance with notices or orders, and fines or penalties apply to the relaxed or amended use or regulation under this By-law.

Severability

1.5 A decision by a court that any part of this By-law is illegal, void, or unenforceable severs that part from this By-law and is not to affect the balance of this By-law.

Force and effect

1.6 This By-law is to come into force and take effect on the date of its enactment.

SECTION 2 STREET VENDING BY-LAW NO. 10868

2.1 Despite anything to the contrary in the Street Vending By-law, no fees shall be payable for temporary street vending permits.

SECTION 3 ZONING AND DEVELOPMENT FEE BY-LAW NO. 5585

3.1 Despite anything to the contrary in the Zoning and Development Fee By-law, no fees shall be payable for a Development Permit with respect to a temporary private patio permit.

SECTION 4 BUILDING BY-LAW NO. 12511

4.1 Despite anything to the contrary in the Building By-law, no fees shall be payable with respect to a temporary street vending permit issued under the Street Vending By-law, or a temporary private patio permit.
