## RECOMMENDATION

THAT the projects presented at the Court of Revision No. 641 be approved for construction, subject to the actions of the Court of Revision.

Policies governing the Local Improvement process are set out in the Vancouver Charter, Part XXIV, and in the Local Improvement Procedure By-law No. 3614.

# CITY MANAGER'S/GENERAL MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The General Manager of Engineering Services recommends approval of these projects subject to the actions of the Court of Revision.

### REPORT

### Background/Context

Property owners may request improvements in their local area through the Local Improvement Program. Projects are initiated through a petition process and the costs are shared between the City and the benefiting property owners. The program facilitates advancement of lower-priority, locally-serving projects where there is resident support. Typical Local Improvement projects include lane paving or lighting, or the construction of traffic calming features such as traffic circles or lane speed humps.

On September 15, 2020, Council advanced seven petition projects to the November 3, 2020, Court of Revision. The seven petition projects and associated funding strategy are identified in Appendix I and Appendix II respectively.

Staff subsequently mailed notifications to property owners with detailed project cost estimates and information regarding the upcoming Court of Revision.

Courts of Revision for Local Improvements are typically held up to twice per year. The next Court of Revision is tentatively scheduled for June 2021 and staff will seek Council's approval to proceed should additional successful petitions be brought forward prior to June.

### Strategic Analysis

As required by the Local Improvement Procedure Bylaw No. 3614 the projects in Appendix I:

- are supported by at least two thirds of the affected and benefiting property owners, representing at least 50% of the properties assessed values, as certified by the Collector of Taxes,
- will proceed with construction upon approval of this report by Council,
- will be funded as detailed in Appendix II, the Director of Finance and City Engineer's "Local Improvement Funding Strategy Report".

### Financial Implications/Related Issues/Risk

The total estimated cost of these projects is \$1,006,005. The property owners' share of the projects is \$680,374. The City's share of \$325,631 will be included in the 2019-2022 Capital Plan Local Roads Rehabilitation Program. Expenditures will be requested annually through the budget process and therefore are subject to the approval of the annual capital budget.

As per standard construction planning practice a cost contingency has been factored into the construction costs estimated for these projects.

Local Improvements procedures further protect the benefitting property owners, as per Section 515 of the Vancouver Charter. The Charter states that if the property owners' share of the actual costs exceeds the estimated amount by more than 10%, the excess amount shall be paid by the City.

# CONCLUSION

Approval of this report will allow construction of seven local improvement petition projects presented at the Court of Revision No. 641.

The General Manager of Engineering recommends approval of this report.
