I had intended to speak tonight in favour of the Oakridge Transit Centre (OTC) development by Modern Green Canada, but am having technical difficulties connecting consistently to the public hearing session this evening. As Vice President, Real Estate, Commercial Strategy & Innovation for TransLink, I am familiar with the proposed mixed-use development planned and am writing in support of the application on behalf of TransLink. The OTC site (a former bus depot, surplus site) was sold by TransLink in 2016 to Modern Green for comprehensive development. The site enjoys a prominent location within the City and is well-serviced by public transit, both with SkyTrain (Canada Line at Oakridge Mall Station along Cambie Street) and bus service along the arterials of 41st Avenue and Oak Street. The proposed development is well thought out and designed with a mix of uses, including market condominiums, rental units, neighbourhood retail, along with a large affordable/social housing component, plus public amenities such as a large neighbourhood park, sports field and a daycare facility. The development will also provide a new rectifier station for TransLink's electric trolly bus needs, and adds to our potential ridership base.
