The concept of allowing work in the evenings in locations which normally have only daytime work hours is also good, as it keeps the area active and therefore safer into the evening hours. Light industrial areas may be the most desirable to put to arts use, but heavier industrial areas may be also usable so long as there aren't a lot of toxic items or any toxic fumes. Dance needs more space than is currently available, so hopefully some of the arts usage will be for dance. Hubs of artistic spaces are probably the best idea (possibly centred around a coffee shop).
