The stability of not just a place to sleep, but a home and community is fundamental. Soropotist housing looks at three needs. 1) Senior women can often be left isolated, possibly with health stresses, and with difficulties of affordable housing. Pensions barely keep up with costs and the need for community with affordable housing is essential for positive mental health and the proposed housing on west 13th meets these needs for seniors. 2. Women with children are increasingly finding it difficult to get housing. Stable housing is essential for the family to deal with the stresses of single parenting. The proposed building will enable mothers to feel safe, secure, be financially viable. The enables them to have optimum attention and functionality for their children. The housing offers comfort and green spaces abs security for children to develop without stress. I believe the housing may also be available for vulnerable woman who do not need lots of support this will help prevent violence against women who are dealing with issues like mild brain damage, or intellectual disabilities that need secure housing. Finally working women are often in lower paid work and also need affordable, safe housing that provides social connections. The soropotist project takes woman's needs into consideration and is attempting to use women in all the planning, architecture and building.
