


- Power of Agility and Flexibility

- Clean tech: marry climate activism with entrepreneurial energy
- Innovation zones/districts
- New deal for transit funding and governance
- Continue to strengthen building codes
- Flex local muscle in terms of achieving national targets: buildings and transportation

Housing Affordability

- Defang NIMBY by generalizing as-of-right zoning that enables good density everywhere
- Develop cover strategies for local electeds to be braver and creative
- Challenge and then engage design community to provide choice, choice, choice
- Work with capital stewards and regulators – to create locally tethered investment mechanisms
