
275,000 IMMIGRANTS INTO CANADA PER YEAR IN THE PAST DECADE



BC'S SHARE: 15% (40,000) (13% of Canada's population)


LOWER MAINLAND: 90% (36,000) (60% of BC's population)






### why this matters
