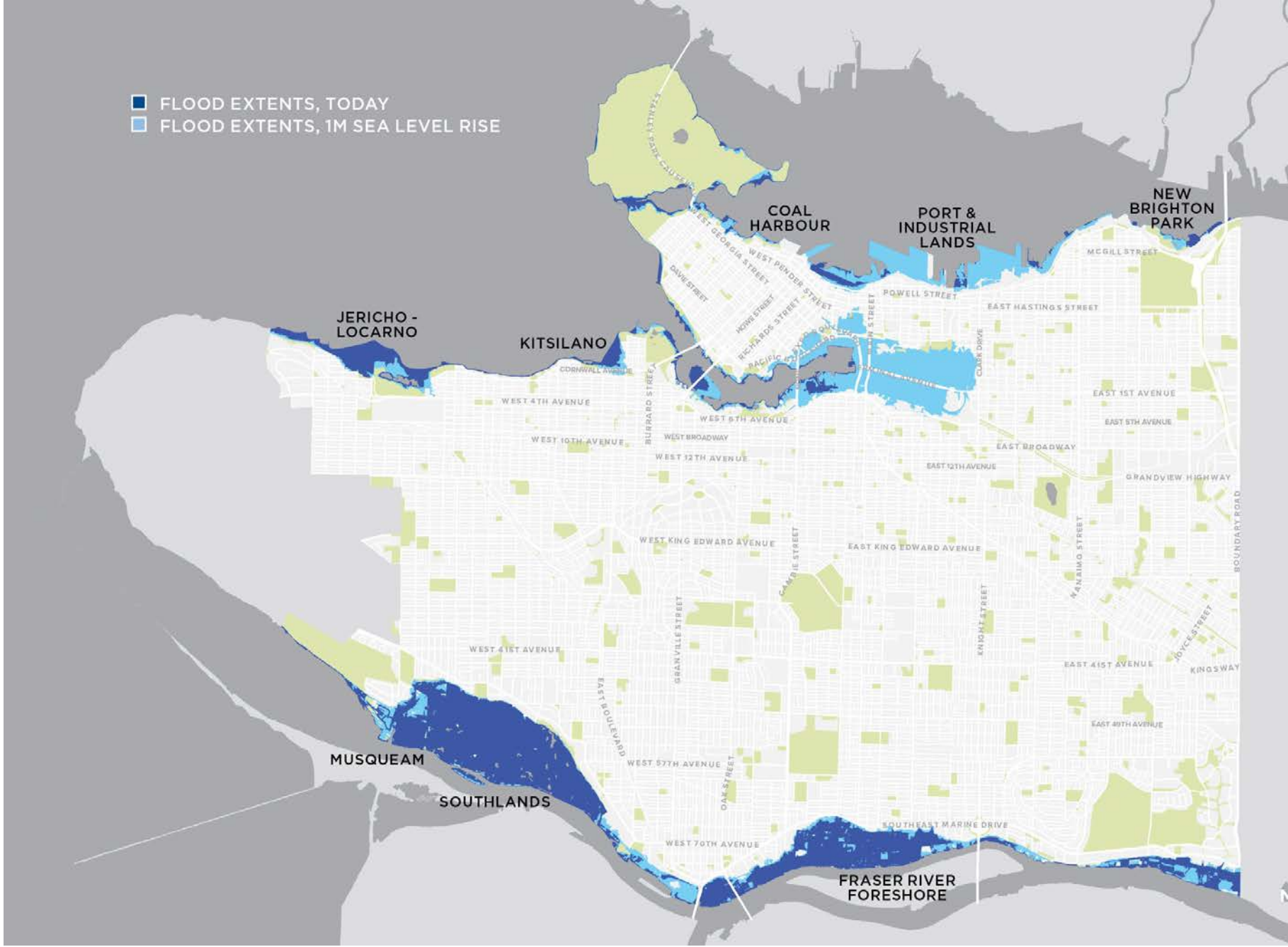

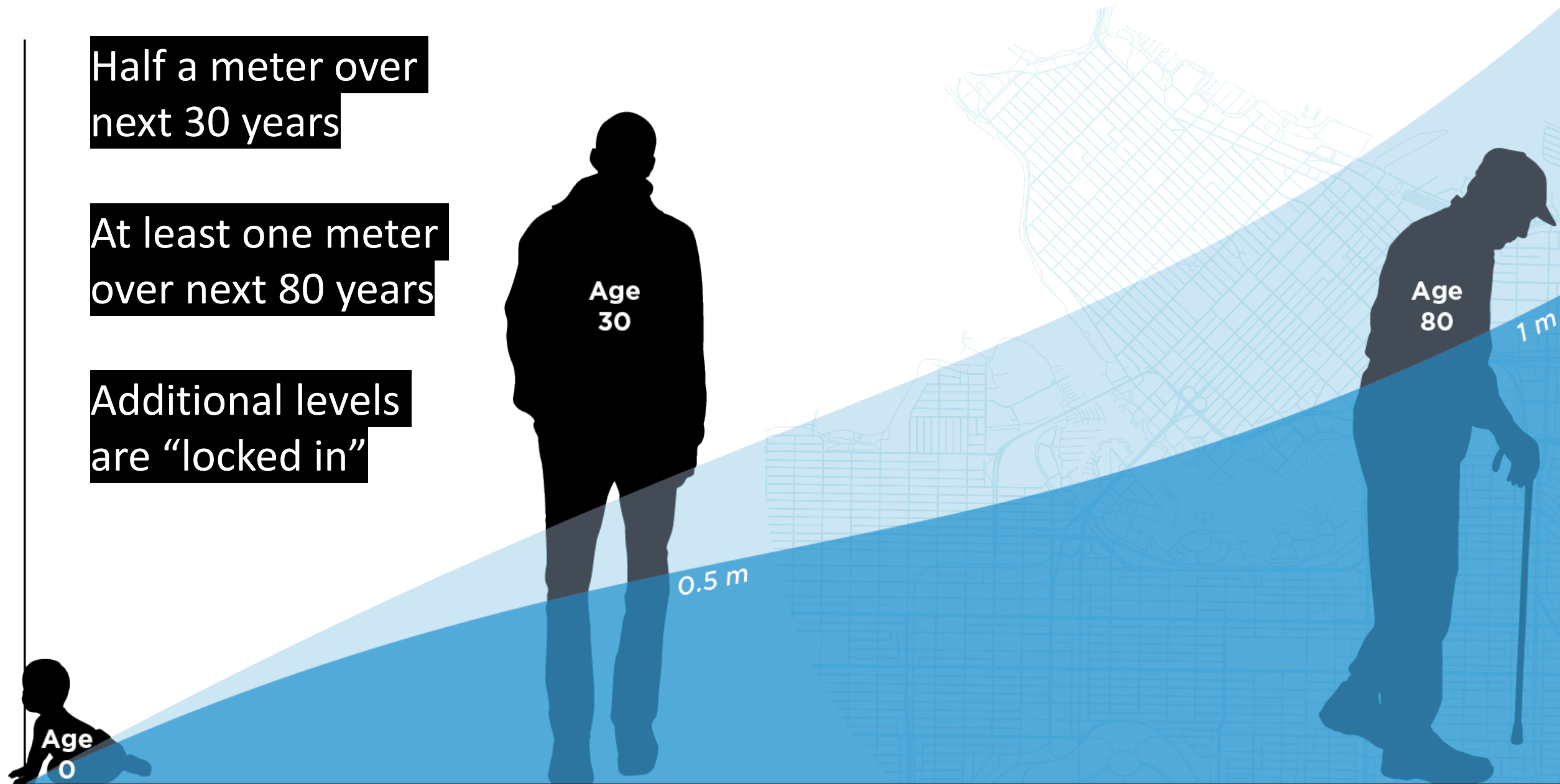
- FLOOD EXTENTS, TODAY
