

### DUNBAR: A NEED FOR SENIORS HOUSING AND CARE

#### **Community Context**

The Westside of Vancouver has the city's highest population of seniors.

7,800

Seniors ages 75+ years.<sup>1</sup>

10,000

Anticipated population of seniors aged 75+ by 2027 – an increase of 25%.<sup>2</sup>

1,205

Private-pay senior living suites currently serving the community.<sup>2</sup>

1,990

Provincially subsidized long term care units in the Westside.<sup>3</sup>

#### The Stats Tell a Story

The 50+ age cohort is expected to grow.



In BC, the population of seniors aged 75+ is projected to more than double within the next 15–20 years.  $^{\rm 4}$



From our engagement efforts, we learned three prime concerns from the immediate neighbours and the broader community.









1. Scale of the Development and the Impact of the Laneway Extension








The design has been thoughtfully developed with consideration to current and future uses.
