





Grandview-Woodland Community Plan (2016)








- Sub-section 6.5.1: Residential Core predominantly envisions duplexes

Proposal

- Application submitted October 13, 2023
- Four-storey building
- Two-storey firehall, with five truck bays
- Two storeys of office space for Vancouver Fire and Rescue Services
- A maximum height of 20.9 meters
- 2.0 FSR
