The ratio of ~55 parking stalls to 200 units is grossly inadequate. On average, each household in Vancouver owns more than one vehicle according to ICBC and the 2021 census. While public transit is a great option for travel within Metro Vancouver, the reality is that residents want to work and play in the surrounding area, and a vehicle is often needed to do so - whether that be owned or car share. Either way, the streets surrounding the proposal are narrow, one lane streets that are already completely full of parked cars on both sides. Adding another, say, 100 cars from this development, on top of the many other future developments that are certain to be approved will overload the capacity of the streets. For this reason, in addition to the increased sun blocking of such a tall building, my hope is that the building's size will be reduced to something that is more realistic to be able to work within the limitations of the infrastructure available.
