Benefits of Change Financial relief for residents: Reducing or eliminating double charges would ease the financial burden on Vancouver's strata dwellers. Improved recycling participation: A fairer system could encourage more active participation in recycling efforts. Enhanced sustainability: Streamlined processes could lead to more effective recycling programs across the city.
